She received further certification in Elementary Education at Florida A+M University in Tallahassee, Florida. She was employed by the Public Schools Systems in Calhoun County (Blountstown), St. Lucie County (Ft. Pierce, Florida)

Mrs. Poitier became a resident of Pompano Beach in 1956 and remained a resident until her demise in 1992. While living here was employed by the Broward County Schools Board in 1957.
