A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA, RESCINDING RESOLUTION NOS. 2003-38 AND 2020-113, AND APPROVING THE REVISED STREETS, PARK AND FACILITY NAMING AND DUAL-NAMING PROCEDURES AND CRITERIA FOR THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That Resolution No. 2003-38 and Resolution No. 2020-113, copies of which are attached hereto as Composite Exhibit "A," are hereby rescinded in their entirety.

SECTION 2. That the revised Streets, Park and Facility Naming and Dual-Naming Procedures and Criteria for the City of Pompano Beach, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if set forth in full, is hereby approved.

SECTION 3. All resolutions or parts of resolutions, either oral or written in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby rescinded.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall become effective upon passage.

**STREETS, PARKS AND FACILITY NAMING AND DUAL-NAMING
PROCEDURES**

1. Application and \$500 non-refundable fee submitted to Public Works or Parks and Recreation. Upon submittal, the Public Works Director or Recreation Programs Administrator will verify the information submitted.
2. With regards to street dual-naming, a mailed survey will be conducted to get permission of two-thirds (2/3) of property owners on the road or section of road that will be impacted.
3. Streets or parks and facility naming or dual naming requests will be provided to the Historical Advisory Board and the Historical Society for their recommendation. Recommendation or non-recommendation will be provided to Public Works Director or Recreation Programs Administrator.
4. Upon successfully completing items one through three, the Public Works Director or Recreation Programs Administrator will make a determination to recommend or not recommend approval. If recommended for approval, a Resolution will be prepared for City Commission consideration.
5. If the application is denied by the Public Works Director or Recreation Programs Administrator, appeals can be made to City Manager or designee.
6. The Applicant shall bear all additional costs associated with the naming or dual-naming of the City streets or parks and facilities, including but not limited to, the cost of City mailings, recording, administration, and the costs of all road and park signs. Complete funding for the name change must be paid prior to the commencement of any work.

**STREETS, PARKS AND FACILITY NAMING OR DUAL-NAMING
CRITERIA**

1. The individual has a long and exemplary military, private or public service career that has been the subject of award or recognition; has engaged in conduct which has brought significant positive statewide, national or international recognition to the City or their community through their accomplishments. The individual should also have made a significant contribution to the community's good name and image through volunteerism, leadership, financial contribution and/or other quality services.
 - a. If the naming is associated with an organization, the organization should be in good public standing and have made a significant contribution to the community's quality of life that brought statewide and national attention. The contribution should have significantly and demonstratively contributed to the public's safety and overall well-being.

2. If the proposed streets, parks or facility name is for an individual (posthumously only), the application shall, at a minimum, contain documentation of the prospective individual's historical significance in the form of biographies, awards, magazines, newspaper articles, essays, letters and similar materials describing the prospective individual's historical significance and proof of City residency.
3. The proposed name should not duplicate the name of another street, site or facility within the City of Pompano Beach. Consideration shall be given to whether the proposed name already exists at another street, site or facility within Broward County. Similar applications for a street denied by the City within three (3) years of the current application are considered ineligible.
4. The proposed name may enhance the historic integrity of the street or site. Consideration shall be given to whether there is historical significance, geographical identifiers, and/or natural characteristics at the site.
5. The proposed name should not be associated with the support of discrimination, or considered derogatory or socially unacceptable.
6. The proposed name should be compatible with the existing street naming system and appropriate with the given types of uses along the street.
7. The proposed name should not negatively impact the provision of emergency services. The change should not result in confusion related to identifying and/or providing efficient access for emergency purposes.
8. The proposed name may be for the entire length of the street or for a short segment of the street.
9. The proposed name change should not have an existing co- designation on the street, park or facility for which the change is being requested.
10. The City has final approval on the design and placement of markers and/or signs on City streets, parks and facilities.
11. The Mayor and City Commission are authorized to approve naming of all City facilities after any persons, deceased or living, upon a determination that exceptional circumstances exist as justification for such action.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA, ENACTING A POLICY AS TO THE NAMING AND RENAMING OF STREETS AND PUBLIC FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission has received from time to time requests for the naming or renaming of streets within the City of Pompano Beach; and

WHEREAS, the City does not have a policy for the naming or renaming of streets; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pompano Beach deems it advisable to implement a policy for the naming and renaming of streets; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: That the City Commission of City of Pompano Beach hereby establishes a policy for the naming and renaming of streets and public facilities within the City of Pompano Beach as follows:

It shall it shall be the policy of the Pompano Beach City Commission to recognize and honor of the name of individuals who have made a lasting significant humanitarian or extraordinary contribution on the local, state or national level through many years of service or individuals whose single action or achievement conveys great credit and recognition to the City. Further, such organizations who have provided invaluable services to the City and whose location in the city is of such importance as to bring credit and recognition to the city may be equally honored and recognized.

The City Commission may, in its sole and exclusive discretion, consider the naming of public parks, buildings or facilities for individuals, but shall reserve the naming of streets, roads, public ways,

or portions thereof, for individuals except in the most unusual circumstances when the City Commission finds that the naming shall serve the best interest of the City. In that event, the street, road, public way or portion thereof shall carry dual names and shall not result in creating a split street (part one name, part another). Renaming a segment of a street, road, or public way where a transition from one name to another at some geographic point would result, shall not be considered.

The City Commission may, in its sole and exclusive discretion, consider the naming of streets, roads, public ways, or portions thereof, for such organizations, but shall reserve the naming for individuals, except in the most unusual circumstances, when the City Commission finds that the naming serves the best interest of the City. In that event, the public park, building or facility, street, road, public way or portion thereof may carry dual names.

A formal written request must be submitted to the City Manager along with an application fee of \$500.00.

The naming of public parks, buildings, facilities streets, roads or portions thereof shall require a resolution adopted and approved by a majority vote of the City Commission.


SECTION 2: That the proper City officials and staff are hereby authorized to implement said policy.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 1 OF POMPANO BEACH RESOLUTION NO. 2003-38 MODIFYING THE FEE ASSOCIATED WITH THE COSTS INVOLVED IN THE NAMING AND RENAMING OF STREETS AND PUBLIC FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to amend Section 1 of the policy regarding the policy as to the naming and renaming of streets and public facilities within the City of Pompano Beach; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That Section 1 of Resolution No. 2003-38 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1. That the City Commission of City of Pompano Beach hereby establishes a policy for the naming and renaming of streets and public facilities within the City of Pompano Beach as follows:

It shall be the policy of the Pompano Beach City Commission to recognize and honor the name of individuals who have made a lasting significant humanitarian or extraordinary contribution on the local, state or national level through many years of service or individuals whose single action or achievement conveys great credit and recognition to the City. Further, such organizations who have provided invaluable services to the City and whose location in the city is of such importance as to bring credit and recognition to the city may be equally honored and recognized.

The City Commission may, in its sole and exclusive discretion, consider the naming of public parks, buildings or facilities for individuals, but shall reserve the naming of streets, roads, public ways, or portions thereof, for individuals except in the most unusual circumstances when the City Commission finds that the naming shall serve the best interest of the City. In that event, the street, road, public way or portion thereof shall carry dual names and shall not result in creating a split street (part one name, part another). Renaming a segment of a street, road, or public way

where a transition from one name to another at some geographic point would result, shall not be considered.

The City Commission may, in its sole and exclusive discretion, consider the naming of streets, roads, public ways, or portions thereof, for such organizations, but shall reserve the naming for individuals, except in the most unusual circumstances, when the City Commission finds that the naming serves the best interest of the City. In that event, the public park, building or facility, street, road, public way or portion thereof may carry dual names.

A formal written request must be submitted to the City Manager along with an application fee ~~of \$500~~, which is adequate to cover all costs associated with the name change including, but not limited to, signage. Minimum costs for such naming or renaming is \$500.00, which shall be the minimum fee. Applicants shall pay whichever amount or actual costs is determined to be higher.

The naming of public parks, buildings, facilities streets, roads or portions thereof shall require a resolution adopted and approved by a majority vote of the City Commission.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall become effective upon passage.
