

INCIDENT SUMMARY REPORT

Pompano Beach East — East Atlantic Boulevard, Pompano Beach, FL 33062

Reporting Period: March 1 – 31, 2026

Overview

This report compiles all incident and patrol activity logged by FPI Security Services officers at the Pompano Beach East corridor along East Atlantic Boulevard during the month of March 2026. A total of approximately 100+ reports were filed by the patrol team covering routine foot patrols, actionable incidents, and weather-related interruptions.

Routine Foot Patrols

The majority of activity during March consisted of Walk & Talk / Foot Patrol reports. Officers regularly engaged with business owners and staff throughout the corridor, including locations at:

- Cafe Maxx (2601 E Atlantic Blvd)
- The Bite Eatery (2715 E Atlantic Blvd)
- Harbor Plaza and Atlantic Square Plaza
- Flanigans (2500 E Atlantic Blvd)
- 26 Brewing Company (2600 E Atlantic Blvd)
- Pasquale's Pizza & Subs (2680 E Atlantic Blvd)
- Legacy Vape & Smoke (2657 E Atlantic Blvd)
- Palm Medicine Pharmacy (2711 E Atlantic Blvd)

- Fine Wines (2763 E Atlantic Blvd)
- Sinful Crepes (2692 E Atlantic Blvd)

Business owners and employees consistently expressed satisfaction with FPI's presence and reported no security concerns during these visits.

Trespassing Incidents

Trespassing was the most frequent actionable incident type for the month, with 17 documented incidents. The primary subjects involved transient/homeless individuals occupying business storefronts and alleyways. In all cases, individuals voluntarily complied when verbally warned by officers — no arrests or physical interventions were required.

Notable pattern: Cafe Maxx (2601 E Atlantic Blvd) accounted for the highest concentration of trespassing incidents (7 total), representing 41% of all trespassing activity. The Bite Eatery was the second most affected location with 3 incidents.

Loitering Incidents

Two loitering incidents were documented during the month:

- March 9 — Officer McDowell observed a man loitering at Cafe Maxx (2601 E Atlantic Blvd). Individual was asked to leave and complied without incident.
- March 23 — Officer Juste observed an individual loitering in front of Cafe Maxx during a drive patrol. Individual was approached and directed to leave; complied without incident.

Suspicious Activity

One suspicious activity report was filed during the month:

- March 10 — Officer Hanes conducted a community engagement visit with Henry, owner of Top Nails (2676 E Atlantic Blvd), to discuss suspicious activity concerns in the area. Owner reported no recent incidents. Officer left a business card for future contact.

Weather-Related Patrol Interruptions

Approximately 15+ patrol scans were unable to be completed due to adverse weather conditions (heavy rainfall). Officers documented these interruptions with photographic evidence. Affected dates included:

- March 1, 13 (multiple), 15, 18 (multiple — most impacted day), 19, 20, 29, and 30

March 18 was the most weather-disrupted day of the month, with several AM scans aborted due to rain. Officers who were able to patrol in weather windows on that day still documented 4 trespassing incidents.

Key Findings & Observations

- Trespassing by transient individuals is the primary recurring security concern across the corridor, concentrated at Cafe Maxx and The Bite Eatery.
- All incidents were resolved without escalation, police response, arrests, or use of force. Verbal compliance rate: 100%.
- Community relations remain strong — multiple business owners and managers expressed positive feedback regarding FPI's visibility and effectiveness.
- March 18 was the single most active day with 4 trespassing incidents logged alongside multiple weather interruptions.
- No thefts, vandalism, assaults, or police calls were recorded during the reporting period.
- The transient presence at Cafe Maxx warrants continued focused patrol attention. A business card was distributed for direct contact.
