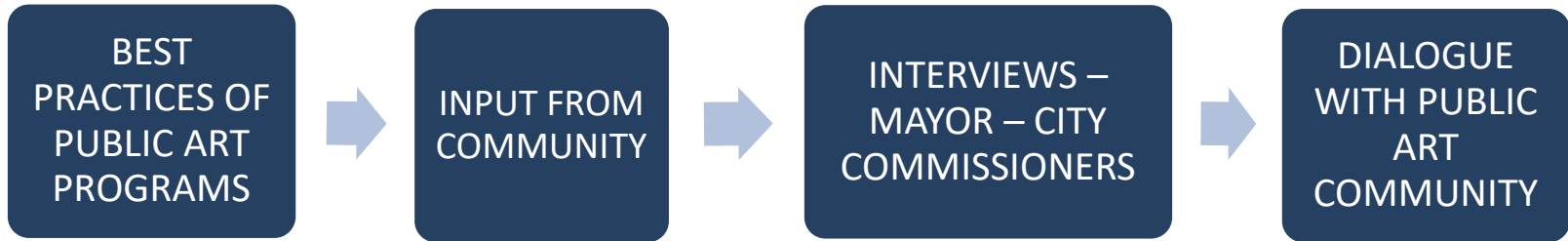

The mural was originally only located on the first two floors; however, the mural received such great reviews that the City commissioned the artist to expand the mural to the top of the Parking Garage.



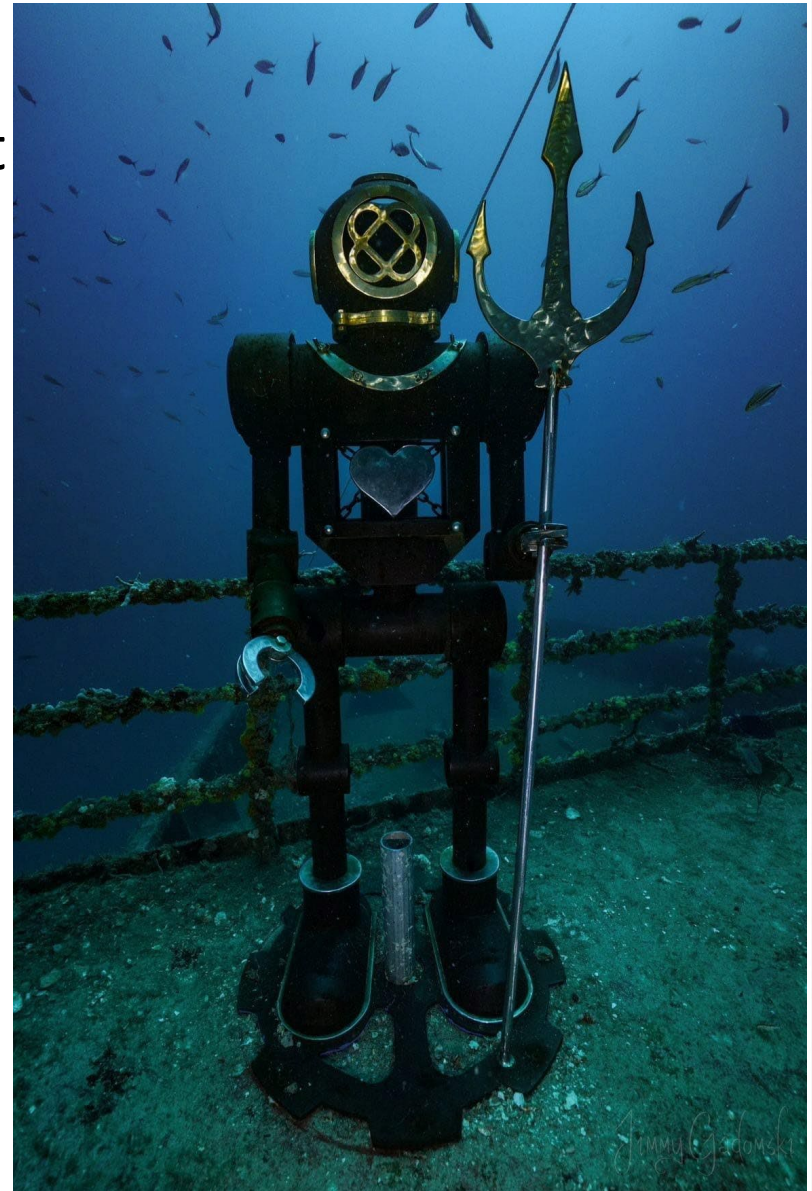
Mechan H2O

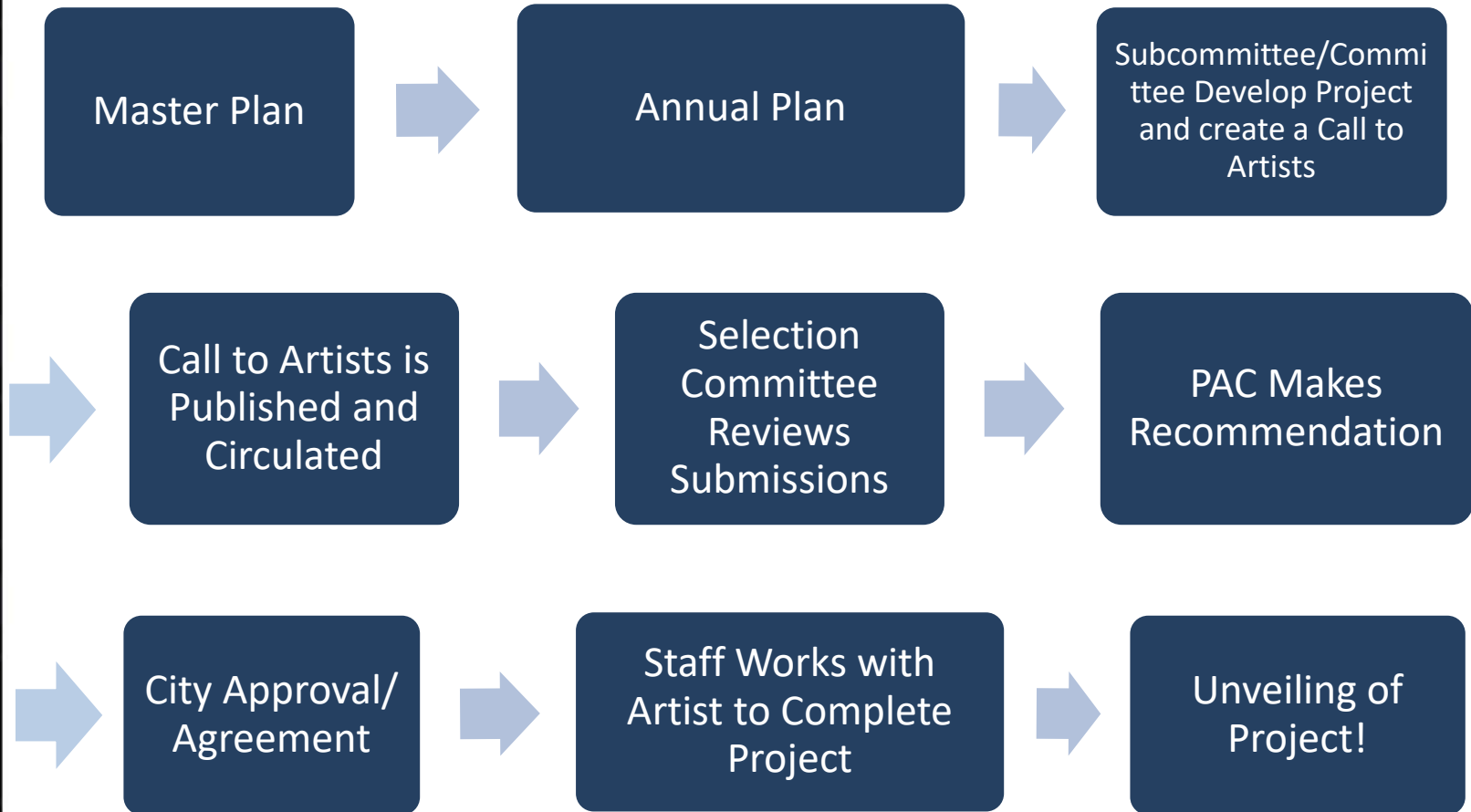

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT



FY2024 PROPOSED ANNUAL PLAN PROJECTS

Underwater Sculpture Garden Round 3 (District 1) (\$42,000): This program takes place every two years. This will be the third sculpture as part of this program. An Artist or artist team will be commissioned to design, fabricate, and install an artwork. The sculpture will be installed on-land at the beach for a period of one year before it is sunk and attached to the *Lady Luck* in Shipwreck Park. The artwork itself has a budget of \$35,000 and a \$7,000 budget for installation and other fees concerning installation and documentation.

Utility Box Rewrapping/Wrapping (All Districts) (\$18,000): The City has wrapped multiple utility boxes with artistic vinyl wraps over the past eight (8) years. The goal of the program is to reduce blight along the corridors by transforming a utility box into a piece of art. This beautification effort will enhance the experience of all those visiting the corridors and will help to prevent boxes from being vandalized, primarily with posters. Due to wear and tear of the vinyl wraps and the addition of new utility boxes within the City, the Public Art Committee plans on wrapping the new utility boxes as well as rewrapped older utility boxes that are in need of repair. The Public Art Committee is estimating a total of fifteen (15) utility boxes will be wrapped/rewrapped.

Additional Painted Pompano Sculpture Project (Districts 2 & 3) (\$22,121): The City will commission two (2) artists from the 2023-2024 BaCA Artists in Residence (AiR) class to paint a prefabricated Painted Pompano sculpture that will be placed at Lyons Park and a location in District 2. Funding budgeted for the project will be used to fabricate one (1) Painted Pompano sculpture and two bases. A prefabricated sculpture is currently in storage and will be used for this project. Funding will also be used to move the sculpture and base mold from its current location at Spaces to Experiences in Michigan to Pompano Beach. Spaces to Experience is downsizing and will no longer store the molds.

Mini Mechan (District 1) (\$15,000): The Public Art Committee created a Call to Artists for the Light Pole Sculpture project in District 3, approved under Resolution # 2022-59. Artist team Tyler FuQua Creations submitted a design that the Committee felt would be a great addition to the Beach area. The design is a version of *Mechan H2O*, which was originally placed at the Beach for one year and then sunk and attached to *Lady Luck* in Shipwreck Park in July 2023 as part of the City's Underwater Sculpture Exhibition. The City will commission Tyler FuQua Creations to fabricate and install this artistic light pole sculpture to be attached to the existing light pole at the Beach. Tyler FuQua Creations is responsible for any required permitting and engineering. Exact location to be determined.

Herb Skolnick Center (District 5) (\$18,000): The City will commission an artist/artist team to design, fabricate, and install a 9 foot by 6 foot mosaic mural located on the exterior of the Herb Skolnick Center. Possible artworks include a mural or sculpture. Theme for the mural has not been determined.

Blanche Ely High School Mural (District 4) (\$23,000): At its September 25, 2018, the Commission directed the Public Art Committee to research and commission a mural at Blanche Ely High School. The Public Art Committee will be placing the mural on an exterior wall located at Blanche Ely High School with a theme of the school's coaches, as approved under Resolution # 2019-123. This project also involves a community engagement aspect with the high school students. The Call to Artists is currently being circulated. The original budget for the project was \$4,000; after further investigation, the budget has been changed to \$23,000 due to the size or the selected wall and the community engagement aspect. Additional funding of \$19,000 will be allocated in the FY 2024 Public Art Annual Plan.

Opportunity/Contingency Projects (\$10,000): The Public Art Committee sets aside funding to be able to take advantage of unknown opportunities throughout the year. As stated in the Master Plan, this is flexible money for new project ideas. This money could also be used as a small contingency for unknown expenses associated with other projects. All purchasing thresholds and building requirements will be met. Staff can take recommendations to the City Commission if it is deemed appropriate. Anything that would otherwise need Commission approval will be taken to the City Commission. Any Opportunity/Contingency Projects will be reported in the next FY 2025 Annual Plan.

Maintenance (\$17,912): A percentage of the cost of permanent work will be reserved for maintenance and used as needed.
