SUBJECT: Status of Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) Violations and Penalties

Background

The utility was originally cited for twelve (12) violations related to Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) for the period 2021 through 2023. Through negotiation, the utility was ultimately found responsible for the following six (6) violations as noted in the Consent Order # SFCO 25-0457:

- 09/06/2022 Lift Station 61, S Federal Hwy
- 12/29/2022 231 S Cypress Road
- 01/13/2023 1100 S Federal Hwy (Adjacent to Lift Station #44)
- 02/28/2023 1100 S Federal Hwy (Adjacent to Lift Station #44)
- 07/18/2023 599 SW 15 St, Lift Station #73
- 10/11/2023 190 N Ocean Blvd, Lift Station #12

Enforcement and Associated Penalties

Under the Environmental Litigation and Reform Act [403.121(3)(b)], the following penalties apply:

- \$10,000 for each unpermitted or unauthorized discharge or effluent limitation exceedance resulting in a surface water or groundwater quality violation.
- \$1,000 per day for each day that a water quality violation continued.

There was a total of four (4) spills fined at \$10,000 each, seven (7) days of water quality violations at \$1,000 each, and two (2) spills without water quality violations at approximately \$4,000 each, plus an administrative fee of \$500. Total assessed penalties with administrative fee is at \$\$55,967.00 (See Estimated Fee Schedule Attached).

Proposed Resolution

It is the in the best interest of the Utilities Department to resolve via an *in-kind* project. Projects would allow for further investment to hardened current wastewater pumping and transmission infrastructure, mitigating against further SSOs while providing added redundancy of the system (see SSO Map Attached). Proposed *in-kind* projects for FDEP consideration are preliminary estimated between \$400,000 to \$600,000 but could be higher due to project type approval from FDEP and procurement mechanisms available to complete the work in the allotted timeframe. The funding source must be non-allocated for wastewater improvements at least eighteen months preceding the consent order.

Additional Pending Violations and Anticipated Penalties for 2024 – 2025 (to date)

- 2024: Four (4) pending SSO violations are subject to the \$10,000 fine each, plus the \$1,000 per day of water quality violation.
- 2025: Five (5) pending SSO violations are subject to the \$10,000 fine each, plus the \$1,000 per day of water quality violation.
