

INCIDENT SUMMARY REPORT

Pompano Beach East — East Atlantic Boulevard, Pompano Beach, FL 33062
Reporting Period: April 1 – 30, 2026

Overview

This report compiles all incident and patrol activity logged by FPI Security Services officers at the Pompano Beach East corridor along East Atlantic Boulevard during the month of April 2026. A total of approximately 70+ reports were filed by the patrol team covering routine foot patrols, actionable incidents, and weather-related interruptions.

Business owners and employees consistently expressed satisfaction with FPI's presence and reported no security concerns during these visits. Notable positive feedback was received from the manager at 2664 E Atlantic Blvd, the owner of Oasis Nail Shop (2635 E Atlantic Blvd), and Tony G at Tony G's Barbershop (2655 E Atlantic Blvd). On April 15, Officer Hanes spoke with the owner of Pet Grooming, Kurt, who expressed concern about transient individuals sleeping in the area, and was provided a FPI business card for direct contact.

Trespassing Incidents

Trespassing was the most frequent actionable incident type for the month, with 11 documented incidents. The primary subjects involved transient/homeless individuals occupying business storefronts, alleyways, and public areas. In all cases, individuals voluntarily complied when verbally warned by officers — no arrests or physical interventions were required.

Notable pattern: Transient activity was more dispersed across the corridor in April compared to prior months, with no single location accounting for a dominant share of incidents. Harbor Plaza and the Federal Highway corridor saw recurring attention. The Atlantic Doggery incident on April 4 involved the business owner (Heather) stating the individual worked for her, while officers noted he had been observed trespassing on multiple prior occasions.

Loitering Incidents

One loitering incident was documented during the month:

- **April 11** — Officer Compere observed a male loitering / sleeping on East Atlantic Blvd. The individual was directed to leave and complied without incident. Supervisor Jaid McDowell (ID 4827) was notified.

Weather-Related Patrol Interruptions

Approximately 7 patrol scans were unable to be completed due to adverse weather conditions (heavy rainfall). Officers documented these interruptions with photographic evidence. Affected dates included:

- April 1 — Officer Juste (PM scan interrupted)
- April 7 — Officer Hanes (AM scan interrupted); Officer Juste (PM scan interrupted)
- April 8 — Officer Hanes (AM scan interrupted); Officer Juste (PM scan interrupted)
- April 17 — Officer Hanes (two separate scan interruptions — AM and PM)
- April 20 — Officer Compere (PM scan interrupted; supervisor Ilamise notified)
- April 26 — Officer Williams (evening scan interrupted; Supervisor McDowell notified)

April 7 and April 8 were the most weather-disrupted days, each recording two separate interrupted scans. Officers who were able to patrol in available weather windows on affected days still documented foot patrol activity and trespassing incidents.

Notable Community Engagement

- **April 10** — Officer Compere spoke with the manager at 2664 E Atlantic Blvd, who expressed strong satisfaction with FPI's performance and encouraged the team to keep up the outstanding work.
- **April 15** — Officer Hanes spoke with Kurt, owner of Pet Grooming (124 SE 2nd St), who reported that homeless individuals were sleeping around the building and that he was unable to exit safely. Officer Hanes provided a business card and committed to monitoring the area.
- **April 29** — Officer Thompson conducted a walk-and-talk at 2600 E Atlantic Blvd. The owner at 2667 E Atlantic Blvd requested a guard presence in front of his store at approximately 6:30–7:00 PM to deter homeless individuals from disturbing guests. The Foundry owner also requested a guard presence near their establishment at approximately 10:00–10:45 PM to prevent sleeping on the premises.

Key Findings & Observations

- Trespassing by transient individuals remains the primary recurring security concern across the corridor, with incidents distributed broadly across multiple locations rather than concentrated at a single site.
- All incidents were resolved without escalation, police response, arrests, or use of force. Verbal compliance rate: 100%.
- Community relations remain strong — multiple business owners and managers expressed positive feedback regarding FPI's visibility and effectiveness.
- A new officer, Darrien Thompson (ID 4963), contributed routine patrol activity throughout the month, expanding corridor coverage.
- Business owners at the Federal Highway corridor (126–124 S Federal Hwy area) are reporting ongoing concerns about transient activity and have requested increased guard presence during evening hours.
- April 7 and April 8 were the most weather-disrupted days of the month, with multiple scan interruptions recorded on each day.
- No thefts, vandalism, assaults, or police calls were recorded during the reporting period.
- Continued focused patrol attention is warranted at the Federal Highway corridor and the Foundry / Harbor Plaza area based on owner requests and trespassing frequency.
