

INCIDENT SUMMARY REPORT

Pompano Beach North West — Northwest Corridor, Pompano Beach, FL 33060

Reporting Period: May 1 – 31, 2026

Overview

This report compiles all incident and patrol activity logged by FPI Security Services officers at the Pompano Beach North West corridor during the month of May 2026. A total of approximately 129+ reports were filed by the patrol team, covering foot patrols, walk-and-talk engagements, trespassing and loitering responses, parking enforcement checks, weather interruptions, disturbances, and property damage. The corridor encompasses Old Town Pompano, the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. church area (335, 353, 601, 713, 715 MLK Blvd), Fountain Square Park (42 NE 1st St), Annie Gillis Park (501 MLK Blvd), the South Bar & Kitchen / Vault entertainment district (165 NE 1st Ave / 61 NE 1st St), the N Flagler Ave commercial corridor (114–210 N Flagler Ave), the Sub Station field area (437–467 NW 2nd Ave), the Big Field (212 NW 10th Ave / 222 Mossie Lee Jackson Ave), and 509 NW 6th Ave.

Routine Foot Patrols

Foot patrol and walk-and-talk coverage spanned the full North West corridor throughout May 2026, with multiple officers conducting patrols at different times of day and night. Key locations regularly patrolled included:

- South Bar & Kitchen — 165 NE 1st Ave (multiple daily checks; evening and overnight walk-throughs by Officers Isaac and Burns)
- The Vault — 61 NE 1st St (overnight and early morning checks)
- Old Town Pompano Beach — general corridor checks by Officer Jean (reported as clear on multiple patrol dates including May 3, 10, 15, 17, 28, 30)
- 509 NW 6th Ave — perimeter patrols by Officers Burns and LeBlanc (May 4, 5, 11, 12, 18, 19, 25, 26)
- Fountain Square Park — 42 NE 1st St / 42 NW 7th Ave (overnight patrols; multiple actionable incidents — see Trespassing and Notable Reports)
- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. church area — 335, 353, 601, 713, 715 MLK Blvd (daily checks; highest-concentration trespassing area)
- Annie Gillis Park — 501 MLK Blvd (routine loitering response location)
- N Flagler Ave corridor — 114, 120, 200, 202, 204, 210 N Flagler Ave
- Sub Station / NW 2nd Ave field — 437–467 NW 2nd Ave (recurring trespassing location)
- Big Field — 212 NW 10th Ave / 222 Mossie Lee Jackson Ave (trespassing and field checks)
- Fountain Park — 42 NE 1st St (overnight patrols by Officer Burns)

Officer Isaac conducted regular overnight walk-throughs of the South Bar and Vault entertainment district at approximately 9:00–11:00 PM nightly. Officer Burns provided overnight and early-morning coverage of Fountain Park, The Vault, and South Bar, typically between midnight and 6:00 AM. Officer Jean focused on daytime Old Town sweeps, MLK Blvd, and loitering response throughout the month.

Trespassing Incidents

Trespassing was the most frequent actionable incident type, with approximately 35 documented incidents. The primary subjects involved transient/homeless individuals sleeping or sheltering at church properties, storefronts, parks, and open fields. In the majority of cases, individuals voluntarily complied when verbally directed by officers. Three incidents required BSO (police) involvement — May 3, May 18, and May 23 (see Notable Incidents section).

Notable pattern: The 713 Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd. church property / Mossie Lee Jackson Ave field was the highest-concentration trespassing location, accounting for approximately 29% of all trespassing incidents. The N Flagler Ave storefronts (200–210) were the second-highest concentration. Recurring tent encampments were documented at the Sub Station field (439 NW 2nd Ave) and the Big Field (222 Mossie Lee Jackson Ave), indicating persistent overnight sheltering activity at those locations.

Loitering Incidents

Approximately 28 loitering incidents were documented during the month. The MLK Blvd corridor (particularly the 501–520 block / Annie Gillis Park area) and the N Flagler Ave corridor were the primary recurring loitering locations. Key incidents include:

- **May 1** — Officer Jean observed a male loitering at 520 MLK Blvd. Individual complied and left.
- **May 2** — Officer Jean observed individuals loitering at Fountain Park (61 W Atlantic Blvd) and at 738 MLK Blvd. Both complied.
- **May 6** — Officer Jean observed a male sleeping at 335 MLK Blvd (The Hive). Individual complied and left.
- **May 8** — Officer Jean dispersed individuals at 404 NW 4th Ave and 501 MLK Blvd. Both complied.
- **May 9** — Officer Jean observed a female loitering at NE 1st St. Individual complied. Supervisor McDowell notified.
- **May 13** — Officer Jean dispersed individuals at 335 MLK Blvd and 114 N Flagler Ave. Both complied.
- **May 14** — Officer Jean dispersed individuals at 335 MLK Blvd. Individuals complied.
- **May 16** — Officer Vega observed a man sleeping at Fountain Park and directed him to leave. Complied. Supervisor McDowell notified.
- **May 17** — Officer Jean dispersed a male at 42 NE 1st St. Officer Burns and Supervisor McDowell dispersed two individuals sleeping at Fountain Park (42 NE 1st St). Supervisor McDowell notified. Officer Jean also dispersed a male at NE 1st Ave. All complied.
- **May 17** — Officer Burns and Supervisor McDowell observed a female sleeping in a tent at 437 NW 2nd Ave. Individual complied.
- **May 20** — Officer Jean dispersed a female at 501 MLK Blvd. Supervisor McDowell notified. Officer Thompson dispersed two individuals at 445 NW 2nd Ave field. Both complied.
- **May 21** — Officer Jean dispersed a male and female sleeping at 437 NW 2nd Ave. Both complied.
- **May 22** — Officer Jean dispersed individuals at 42 NE 1st St, NE 1st Ave (x2), and 165 NE 1st Ave. All complied. Supervisor McDowell notified for multiple incidents.
- **May 27** — Officer Jean dispersed groups at Annie Gillis Park (501 MLK Blvd) on two separate occasions. All complied.
- **May 28** — Officer Jean dispersed a male at 114 N Flagler Ave and a male sleeping at 353 MLK Blvd. Both complied. Supervisor McDowell notified.
- **May 29** — Officer Jean dispersed a male and female at Annie Gillis Park and a female at 120 N Flagler Ave. All complied.
- **May 30** — Officer Jean dispersed a male and female at 713 MLK Blvd. Both complied.
- **May 31** — Officer Jean dispersed a male at MLK Blvd who initially refused to leave — BSO was called. See Notable Incidents.

Parking Enforcement

Officer Isaac conducted routine overnight parking checks at 201 NE 1st Ave throughout the month, typically at approximately 1:00–2:00 AM. The following checks were documented:

On most patrol nights, the 201 NE 1st Ave lot was confirmed clear with no overnight violations. Two vehicle observations were recorded during the month (May 2 and May 16).

Notable Incidents & Key Reports

The following incidents required escalated response, BSO involvement, or resulted in arrest or formal enforcement action during the reporting period:

- **May 3 (~10:34 PM) — Trespassing — BSO Called | 115 NE (CRA property):** Officer Vega responded to a report of an erratic trespassing individual. BSO was called and arrived at ~10:45 PM. Individual was removed from CRA property.
- **May 7 (~5:40 PM) — Disturbance — CRA Call | 335 Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd (Allied/CRA area):** Officer Vega received a call from CRA regarding a man sleeping behind the building. Officer responded; individual complied and area was secured.
- **May 8 (~4:15 PM) — Disturbance | 335 Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd (The Hive):** Officer Vega observed a sleeping individual and directed them to sit up. Individual complied. Area secured.
- **May 11 (~9:05 AM) — Suspicious Activity | 713 Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd (Church — rear door):** Officer Burns observed an open door at the rear of the church during a routine patrol. Property was empty and no personnel were on site. Documented for awareness; no further action required.
- **May 18 (~1:00 PM) — Trespassing — BSO Called | 42 NE 1st St — Fountain Square Park:** Officer Burns and Supervisor LeBlanc observed an individual sleeping at the park who refused to leave when directed. BSO was contacted and responded. BSO allowed the individual to remain lying in the grass — situation resolved without arrest.
- **May 23 (~12:13 AM) — Trespassing — BSO / Arrest | 42 NE 1st St — Fountain Square Park (after hours):** Officer Burns observed two males in the park after closing. Both refused to leave. BSO was contacted and responded. One individual was arrested; the second complied and left.
- **May 30 (~11:30 AM) — Property Damage — BSO Called / Trespassing Warning Issued | 715 Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd:** Officer Jean observed property damage and a group of individuals sleeping on site. Two females left voluntarily; one male refused to leave. BSO was called at 11:43 AM and arrived at 11:53 AM. All trespassers were escorted out; one individual was detained and issued a formal trespassing warning. Supervisor McDowell notified.
- **May 31 (~7:30 AM) — Loitering — BSO Called | Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd (NW 2nd Ave area):** Officer Jean observed a male loitering on private property who refused to leave when directed. BSO was called at 7:34 AM and arrived at 7:49 AM. Individual agreed to relocate after BSO contact. Supervisor McDowell notified.

Community Engagement Highlights

- **May 23, ~10:51 AM — The Vault — 61 NE 1st St:** Officer Jean completed walk-and-talk with the Vault manager, who reported everything was going well and expressed satisfaction with FPI's service.

Weather-Related Patrol Interruptions

Four weather-related patrol interruptions were documented during the month. In each case, the officer on duty logged the interruption and resumed patrol activity when conditions permitted:

- **May 3 (~1:32 PM) — Officer Jean —** unable to complete scans due to rain. Supervisor McDowell notified.

- **May 12 (~~3:05 AM)** — Officer Compere — unable to scan due to weather conditions.
- **May 12 (~~6:00 PM)** — Officer Thompson — unable to continue scanning checkpoints due to weather.
- **May 29 (~~12:45 AM)** — Officer Burns — unable to finish scan due to rain.

Key Findings & Observations

- Trespassing by transient/homeless individuals remains the dominant recurring security concern in the NW corridor. The 713 Dr. MLK Jr. Blvd. church property and the Big Field (Mossie Lee Jackson Ave) required attention on virtually every patrol day throughout the month.
- Recurring tent encampments were documented at the Sub Station field (439 NW 2nd Ave) and the Big Field (222 Mossie Lee Jackson Ave). These locations may warrant escalation to code enforcement or city services given the persistence of the activity.
- Three incidents during the reporting period required BSO (police) involvement: May 3 (CRA property — erratic trespasser removed), May 23 (Fountain Park — one individual arrested after refusing to leave), and May 30 (715 MLK Blvd — property damage, encampment cleared, one individual issued a trespassing warning). An additional BSO call on May 31 involved a loitering refusal on MLK Blvd.
- The May 18 Fountain Park incident (42 NE 1st St) resulted in a BSO response where the individual was allowed to remain by responding officers — this situation was documented and resolved without further incident.
- A suspicious activity report was filed on May 11 for an unsecured rear door at the 713 MLK Blvd church. The property was found vacant and empty. This should be flagged for follow-up with the property owner.
- The South Bar & Kitchen / Vault entertainment district received consistent overnight patrol coverage from Officers Isaac and Burns throughout the month. No major incidents were recorded at these venues.
- The Vault manager expressed satisfaction with FPI's service during a walk-and-talk on May 23.
- The N Flagler Ave corridor (114–210 N Flagler Ave) remained a persistent trespassing and loitering area, requiring attention on multiple patrol days each week.
- No assaults were recorded during the reporting period. All incidents outside of the BSO-assisted events were resolved through verbal direction.
- Four weather-related scan interruptions were documented and properly logged.
