



ZocDoc takes the stress out of visiting the doctor.

What is it?

ZocDoc is a free app and website to instantly book a doctor's appointment online, without ever having to be put on hold on the phone. Wait times in parts of South Florida for a medical appointment can average more than 15 days, according to a study by Merritt Hawkins, and ZocDoc users are often able to book an appointment the same day.

How does it work?

Visit www.zocdoc.com, enter your location, insurance plan and type of doctor you wish to see. The search results display a list of doctors with their schedules listed in real time. Select a time slot to book an appointment. ZocDoc even sends e-mail and text reminders about appointments.

About the founder

Cyrus Massoumi, ZocDoc co-founder and CEO, is from Palm Beach County. He founded the business in 2007 and made it available in South Florida late last year. Today, more than 5.5 million medical appointments are available through the site and more than 750,000 people use it to find a healthcare specialist each month.



8 Women Who Changed South Florida

In honor of Women's History Month, we look at a snapshot of a few local women who have impacted our lives.

HILDEGARDE SCHINE - Her dedication to enriching the culture in Boca Raton led her to help in the founding of the Music Ğuild of Boca Raton, the Boca Raton Museum of Art and the city library. She, along with her husband, also owned much of Boco Raton's beaches and sold the land to the city for public use in the '60s and '70s.

ELEANOR FLETCHER - A resident of Juno Beach, Fletcher was one of the first to conduct research on sea turtles in the area. Her desire to educate children on the protection and conservation of sea turtles led her to start the Loggerhead Marinelife Center.

CHRIS EVERT - A former pro tennis player with Wimbledon and U.S. Open titles, Evert has hosted the Chris Evert Pro-Celebrity Tennis Classic since 1989 and has raised more than \$19.1 million for organizations like the Make A-Wish Foundation of Southern Florida.

COUNTESS HENRIETTA DE HOERNLE - With 42 buildings named after her, Countess Henrietta de Hoernle is one of the area's most-known humanitarians. She has been a major supporter of causes relating to health, the poor, the arts and education since she moved to Boca Roton in 1981.

IVY STRANAHAN - One of the first pioneers in Fort Lauderdale and the first leacher in the area. Her work leaching Seminole Indians served to bring together Seminoles and white society.

HAZEL ARMBRISTER - Her love of politics led her to fight against segregation in Fort Lauderdale, for women's rights, and to work on the 1970 campaign of Rep. Alcee Hastings. She was also one of the first students to receive a GED.

NANCY G. BRINKER - As founder of Susan G. Komon for the Cure, Brinker was able to bring light to the fight against breast concer. Since 1982, the foundation has put \$1.9 billion toward treatment, research, education and screening.

EVELYN LAUDER - A longtime resident of Palm Beach and doughter-in-law to the founder of Estée Louder, Evelyn spent her life working to roise awareness and funds to fight against breast concer and created the Pink Ribbon campaign. - Jennifer Rodrigues
