Areawide Council On Aging Of Broward County, Inc.: 2020 Fair Share - \$50,000 to provide services to prevent or delay institutionalization of elders.

Ashanti Cultural Arts & Enrichment, Inc.: Turn Around Arts - \$5,000 to give children an opportunity to improve their academic and life skills through the Arts.

Boys & Girls Clubs Of Broward County, Inc.: College and Career Readiness and Workforce Development Initiative - \$12,000 for the promotion of higher education and higher level career aspirations to over 3,000 Broward County teens through real world, hands-on learning experiences and provides them with the tools to get started on their professional journeys. The Workforce Development Initiative is designed to promote the development of critical employment skills among our youth through research-informed youth development practice, training and experiential learning opportunities that lead to first job readiness and a plan for pursuing post-secondary and/or career aspirations.

Broward Education Foundation, Inc.: Broward Education Foundation School Supply Center - \$10,000 to provide school supplies for city of Pompano Beach Title I Schools. Teachers come and shop for free school supplies for their students in most need and supplies for their classrooms.

Broward Performing Arts Foundation, Inc.: Student Enrichment in the Arts (SEAS) - \$15,000 to support students to attend a performance free-of-charge, at the Broward Center or Parker Playhouse. The 2020 season will include 40 performances that reinforce reading, math and science skills, bring historical events to life and immerse students in the music, dance and traditions of different cultures. All SEAS presentations are directly aligned with Florida state standards and classroom curriculum, with an emphasis on literacy.

Brown's Community Development Center, Inc.: 6th Annual Collier City Family Fun Day & Barbecue Cook- Off/ McNair Park - \$3,000 for a community event that brings families and community partners together. It consist of free food distribution, back pack give-a-ways, health and wellness screenings, job and career fair, numerous resource exhibitors, free hair cuts for the children, games and activities for the children, empowerment workshops and live entertainment for everyone to enjoy.

Center For Independent Living Of Broward, Inc.: Independence and Self-Sufficiency Solutions for the Disabled - \$5,000 to provide a comprehensive and creative approach to address the needs of individuals with physical, mobility, sensory, mental and cognitive disabilities find employment. Individuals learn the skills needed to become empowered, set appropriate goals and advocate for themselves.

Children's Literacy Initiative Corporation: Sanders Park Elementary School Project - \$10,000 to provide high-quality book collections and other literacy materials to Sanders Park 4th and 5th grade classrooms. CLI's Regional Manager Michele LaCoursiere will provide Sanders Park 4th and 5th grade teachers as well as the school-based reading coach with some on-site support about the use of these collections.

Covenant House Florida, Inc.: Youth Employment Services (YES) program for Pompano Beach Youth Under 21 Experiencing Homelessness - \$7,500 to help disadvantaged, Pompano Beach youth under 21 from the City of Pompano Beach experiencing homelessness to overcome social or economic barriers to education, employment and promote individuals towards self-sufficiency.

Crockett Foundation Inc.: Learning Together - \$10,000 to serve 50 Pompano Beach Middle School students in an after-school setting, four days per week, assisting students to overcome obstacles, receive academic support and experience project-based learning.

Feeding South Florida, Inc.: Senior Health Mobile Distributions - \$10,000 to support Healthy Senior Mobile Food Distributions to provide older adults who live in a food deserts or face other mobility issues that restrict access to fresh fruits, vegetables, dairy, and bread with nutritious food distributions.

First Call For Help Of Broward, Inc.: General Helpline and Touchline Programs - \$15,000 to connect Pompano Beach residents to resources they need with just one call, 24 hours a day, seven days a week

Fort Lauderdale Independence Training & Education Center, Inc.: Supporting One United Resource Center - \$6,250 to provide a drop-in center model that provides triage services available at any time to serve at least 50 youth who are from/reside in Pompano and represent the majority of the aging out foster care population, survivors of human trafficking, displaced LGBT youth and youth who are homeless.

Friends Of The Northwest Branch Of Pompano Beach, Inc: Blues and Sweet Potato Pie Festival - \$2,000 for a cultural awareness event that celebrates Juneteenth as a reminder of the end of slavery in the United States that features lots of exciting, yet educational attractions and is open to the public.

Friends Of The Northwest Branch Of Pompano Beach, Inc: Community Back To School Fun Day - \$1,000 for a free, fun-filled day for a large number of children/students in the NW, SW and some NE section of Pompano Beach that includes the distribution of backpacks filled with essential school supplies, fun games activities, exhibitors, free food items, health screenings, educational mentors, financial and self help resources, tennis shoes, meal vouchers and music.

Helping Abused, Neglected, Disadvantaged Youth, Inc.: LYFE Program - \$6,250 to provide year-round programming for at-risk middle school age youth to strengthen protective factors by helping youth develop resiliency, a positive outlook, healthy family dynamics, pro-social relationships with peers and adults, positive decision-making skills, strong community attachment, and academic success; and reduce risk factors related to teen pregnancy, delinquency, substance abuse, family dysfunction, mental and physical health problems, negative peer associations, and school failure.

Hillsboro Lighthouse Preservation Society, Inc.: Hillsboro Lighthouse Preservation Society - \$2,500 to support free monthly historical tours of the 110-year-old Hillsboro Inlet Lighthouse and the continued operation, maintenance, and preservation of a local, historic monument.

Junior Achievement Of South Florida, Inc.: Pompano Beach: JA Inspire and JA Fellows - \$17,000 for an interactive career exploration program that introduces students to high growth/high wage career fields following 3 hours of career readiness curriculum. Students engage with JA Inspire volunteers at the career fair to create connections that allow them to build an understanding of the cross-section of high demand jobs available to them in the future, from mid-skilled trades to highly technical STEM related careers. JA Fellows Company Program unlocks the innate ability in high school students to fill a need or solve a problem in their community by launching a business venture and unleashing their entrepreneurial spirit.

Learning For Success, Incorporated: Kids and the Power of Work (KAPOW) - \$10,000 for a powerful set of in-school lessons taught by business and community volunteers with teachers from local elementary-high schools, field trips to partner work sites, and integrated curriculum activities for teachers to incorporate the real-life application of the skills they teach on a daily basis.

Men2Boys, Inc.: M2B Job Readiness, Job Preparedness Program - \$5,000 to work with young men between the ages of 11 and 18, the majority of whom are minorities. M2B works with young males who come from the Department of Juvenile Justice system in order to stop them from entering the system as adults. In addition to vocation specific skills, beneficiaries will be taught other lessons in professionalism and money management to make their experience in the workforce as positive as possible.

MLK Memorial Committee of Pompano Beach Florida, Inc.: MLK Day Memorial Events - \$15,000 to support community events open to the public to unite under the premise of diversity and inclusion in line with Dr. King's teachings.

Our Father's House Soup Kitchen, Inc.: Bike Academy - \$5,000 to rehabilitate used bikes for use by the homeless/needy who lack reliable transportation.

Pompano Beach Historical Society, Inc.: Pompano Beach Historical Society Programs, Tours, and Events (various) - \$5,000 for monthly programs and lectures based on a historic theme operated throughout the year by members of the Historical Society. Museum tours located at Founder's Park are conducted throughout the year. On Saturdays between November and April, the Historical Society maintains a booth at Pompano's longest operating Green Market.

Save Our Boys, Inc: Save Our Boys 3rd Annual Haitian Heritage and Cultural Arts Celebration - \$5,000 to support a community event open to the public that celebrates and shares Haitian Heritage and Culture.

The Russell Life Skills And Reading Foundation, Inc.: Russell Reading Room - \$10,000 to serve a minimum of 95 elementary school students from low-income families in Pompano Beach who have been identified as at-risk in literacy skills due to a variety of factors, such as learning, economic or language-based difficulties.

Unity In The Community Of Pompano Beach, Inc.: Unity in the Community Family Fun Day - \$4,500 to provide a Family Fun Day open to the public so that residents from all walks of life may attend. There are exhibits, multi-cultural entertainment and activities for children.
