A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE AN **EXTENSION** AND **AMENDMENT** AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF POMPANO **EMERALD BEACH** AND TRANSPORTATION CORPORATION FOR **TOWING** AND WRECKER SERVICE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That an Extension and Amendment to Agreement between the City of Pompano Beach and Emerald Transportation Corporation for towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the city, a copy of which Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if set forth in full, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. That the proper City officials are hereby authorized to execute said Agreement between the City of Pompano Beach and Emerald Transportation Corporation.

**SECTION 3.** This Resolution shall become effective upon passage.

#### EXTENSION AND AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT

CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, with offices located at 100 West Atlantic Boulevard, Pompano Beach, Florida, hereinafter referred to as "CITY."

and

**EMERALD TRANSPORTATION CORPORATION**, a Florida corporation, whose principal corporate address is 4000 North Powerline Road, Deerfield Beach, Florida 33073, hereinafter referred to as "EMERALD."

WHEREAS, EMERALD entered into an agreement with CITY offering to provide towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the city on February 24, 2011, ("Original Agreement"), and approved by Resolution No. 2011-145; and

WHEREAS, the Original Agreement provides for one renewal term for an additional five (5) years upon approval of the City Commission of City of Pompano Beach and consent of EMERALD; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to extend the term for an additional five years, amend the Franchise Fee and substitute Exhibit "B," Rate Schedule, to the Original Agreement; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the parties agree as follows:

1. That the Original Agreement between EMERALD and CITY to provide towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the city, approved by Resolution No. 2011-145, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, shall be extended for an additional five (5) years, pursuant to the terms, conditions and specifications set forth therein.

- 2. The Original Agreement between the parties is hereby amended by amending Paragraph No. 3 as follows:
  - 3. EMERALD shall pay CITY a Franchise Fee in the initial amount of One-Hundred Fifty-One Thousand and No/100 (\$151,000.00) Dollars per annum. The amount of Twelve-Thousand Five-Hundred Eight-Three and 33/100 (\$12,583.33) Dollars shall be paid upon the commencement of this Agreement and thereafter paid monthly, due and payable on the first day of each calendar month until the termination of this Agreement. If the payment is delinquent by more than fifteen (15) days after the payment is due, an additional charge of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars per day will be due for each day's delay in payment, retroactive to and beginning with the due date of the payment. In the event that a delinquent payment and resulting penalties are due, any payments received will first be applied to the penalty amount, prior to being applied to the regular monthly payment due. In this respect, the Fifty (\$50.00) Dollar penalty fee shall accrue until the monthly payment and all applicable penalties are paid in full. Commencing on the renewal term for the additional five years, EMERALD shall pay CITY a Franchise Fee in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Eight Thousand One Hundred Eighty and 00/100 Dollars (\$178,180.00) per annum. The amount of Fourteen Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-Eight and 33/100 (\$14,848.33) Dollars shall be paid upon the commencement of the renewal term and thereafter paid monthly, due and payable on the first day of each calendar month until the termination of this Agreement.
- 3. The attached Exhibit "B" is hereby substituted for, and in all references replaces, that Exhibit "B," which was attached to, referenced and made a part of the Original Agreement.
- 4. All terms, covenants and conditions contained in the Original Agreement now existing between EMERALD and CITY, with the exception of the provisions above, shall remain unchanged, and the parties agree to keep, observe and perform all covenants and conditions contained therein.
- 5. This Agreement shall bind the parties and their respective executors, administrators, successors and assign and shall be fully effective as though the extension had been originally included in the Agreement.

#### **AGREEMENT**

CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "CITY,"

and

EMERALD TRANSPORTATION CORPORATION, a Florida corporation, whose principal corporate address is 4000 North Powerline Road, Deerfield Beach, Florida 33073, hereinafter referred to as "EMERALD."

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Pompano Beach, Florida, seeks to protect the personal safety and property of its citizens and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of minimum standards of quality and efficiency for emergency recovery, towing and storage services utilized by law enforcement agencies is in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, utilization of improper equipment of unqualified operators exposes public safety personnel and others present at an accident or recovery scene to undue safety hazards, results in undue damage to vehicles, and causes excessive delays in clearing the highway and securing the vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the CITY advertised for request for proposals for the privilege of operating the business of providing towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the proposal submitted by EMERALD was determined by the City Commission to be the highest ranked proposal; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the premises and the covenants and the promises herein, CITY and EMERALD do hereby enter into an Agreement relating to the provision of towing and wrecker service by EMERALD in the CITY, as follows:

- 1. EMERALD hereby represents to CITY, with full knowledge that CITY is relying upon these representations when entering into this Agreement with EMERALD, that EMERALD has the professional expertise, experience and labor to perform the services to be provided by EMERALD pursuant to the terms of this Agreement and shall perform all services under this contract in accordance with all applicable local, county, state, and federal laws, rules and regulations.
- 2. The term of this Agreement shall be for an initial period of five (5) years and shall commence at 12:00 a.m. on March 1, 2011. Six (6) months prior to the expiration of this Agreement, the CITY may choose to enter into negotiations for an extension of the Agreement for one renewal term for an additional five (5) years subject to Commission approval. The CITY may also choose to solicit a competitive bid or Request for Proposals (RFP). In the event a new Agreement is not in place prior to the expiration date, this Agreement will automatically convert to a month-to-month Agreement until a new Agreement between the CITY and EMERALD is in place, or upon termination by the CITY with thirty (30) days prior written notice provided.
- 3. EMERALD shall pay CITY a Franchise Fee in the initial amount of One-Hundred Fifty-One Thousand and No/100 (\$151,000.00) Dollars per annum. The amount of Twelve-Thousand Five-Hundred Eight-Three and 33/100 (\$12,583.33) Dollars shall be paid upon the commencement of this Agreement and thereafter paid monthly, due and payable on the first day of each calendar month until the termination of this Agreement. If the payment is delinquent by more than fifteen (15) days after the payment is due, an additional charge of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars per day will be due for each day's delay in payment, retroactive to and beginning with the due date of the payment. In the event that a delinquent payment and resulting penalties are due, any payments received will first be applied to the penalty amount, prior to being applied to the regular monthly payment due. In this respect, the Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars penalty fee shall accrue until the monthly payment and all applicable penalties are paid in full.

- 4. EMERALD shall provide twenty-four (24) hour towing and wrecker services, 365 days per year within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach and in accordance with the provisions set forth herein.
- 5. EMERALD shall furnish all services, labor, equipment, and materials necessary and as may be required in the performance of this Agreement, except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, and all work performed under this Agreement shall be done in a professional manner.
- 6. EMERALD will provide, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis, personnel and sufficient equipment for immediate response to calls for service from the CITY's Police Department or the CITY'S contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach. The Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) is currently under contract with the CITY as its law enforcement provider.
- 7. EMERALD agrees to make available adequate personnel to perform its requirements under this Agreement, including but not limited to, release of vehicles or vessels towed and stored pursuant to this Agreement, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and to provide on-call personnel between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on Sundays for the purpose of redemption of vehicles or vessels by their owners. No additional charge shall be incurred when the use of on-call personnel is required for release of vehicles or vessels during those days and times. The requirements in this section or elsewhere in this Agreement shall not preclude compliance with any other requirements for storage and release of vehicles or vessels as set forth in Florida Statutes governing same.
- 8. It shall be the duty of EMERALD to maintain an office, answering machine, or other place to receive telephone communications, with an attendant on duty at all times during "on call" periods and shall provide timely and efficient service, in accordance with the response times set forth in Section 30 of this Agreement, twenty-four (24) hours per day.
- 9. EMERALD shall maintain a general towing and wrecker service license and any other licenses required by law or ordinance throughout the term of this Agreement.
- 10. EMERALD shall be given first call for all wrecker services for private vehicles ordered towed by CITY authorities, within the City of Pompano Beach, Florida and during the designated period,

unless a motorist makes a specific request for another wrecker. The CITY reserves the right to request another wrecker service in emergency situations should EMERALD not be available to provide services within the time periods set forth in Section 30 of this Agreement, or does not have adequate equipment required to perform the duties required on scene.

- by the CITY in the operation and maintenance of its City owned, leased and contracted vehicles, including vehicles being held by the Fire Rescue Department due to investigations, vehicles towed to and from a Fire Rescue Department training site for fire service training, and City's Police Department/BSO vehicles used in or assigned for use in the Pompano Beach District ("contracted vehicles"), from sites within the limits of Broward County and when towed to requested locations within said County. When such towing requirements are for City owned, leased or contracted vehicles to or from outside of the limits of Broward County, EMERALD shall be paid a reasonable fee in keeping with the charges customarily levied to the general public for rendering towing and road services of equal kind.
- 12. In addition, EMERALD shall have the exclusive right to tow police confiscated vehicles seized as a result of investigations by the City's Police Department/BSO. When requested, EMERALD shall have the exclusive right to tow from any City property, streets and right-of-ways including any Pompano Beach Community Redevelopment Agency (PBCRA) property and Air Park property. All towing, storage, and disposition of towed vehicles shall be conducted in strict conformity with all applicable Florida laws and regulations.
- Department and CITY's Police Department/BSO to change vehicle tires when necessary. EMERALD will change (utilizing CITY's tires) at no charge, flat tires on in-service CITY owned or leased vehicles and on CITY's Fire Rescue Department vehicles, only during hours in which the CITY garage is not open. EMERALD will be responsible to change tires for the CITY's Police Department/BSO twenty four (24) hours per day, including those hours during which the CITY garage is open. There shall be no additional charge by EMERALD for changing CITY's Police Department/BSO or Fire Rescue Department vehicle tires.
- 14. EMERALD shall designate a wrecker for the CITY's Police Department/BSO's special operations, such as DUI sobriety checkpoints and reverse sting operations, within the limits of the CITY when so requested and at no cost to the CITY or to its Police Department/BSO.

- 15. If additional duties, similar to those contained in the technical specifications of the RFP, but not specified in that part are required by the CITY, and EMERALD is able to provide those special services, those services may be requested under this Agreement by authorized CITY staff. Examples of such special services include, but are not limited to, the removal of an aircraft from water or boats abandoned on city property, streets and right-of-ways. In such instances, the CITY will depend upon EMERALD's experience in such matters and authorize EMERALD to assemble all necessary special equipment and staff, including use of subcontractors, to resolve the special or emergency situation. EMERALD shall exercise due care and professional practices and procedures at all times. Whenever, possible, estimated costs for such special services shall be provided to the CITY prior to engaging in work and all costs shall be subject to negotiation. In any such instances, the CITY reserves the right, time and circumstances permitting, to seek the special services elsewhere in accordance with CITY procurement ordinances.
- 16. EMERALD shall provide all towing vehicles used pursuant to this Agreement with a two-way radio communication system. This communication system shall be between EMERALD base station and all tow and service trucks utilized in providing the CITY's Police Department/BSO with towing service. The two-way radios will not be tuned to any police frequencies; however, the City Police Chief or City Fire Chief may issue one or more portable radios for emergency response purposes.
- 17. All wreckers shall be commercially manufactured wreckers constructed and equipped for the towing of vehicles as directed by the City of Pompano Beach or BSO and shall, at all times, be properly maintained and kept in mechanically safe operating condition.
  - 18. The vehicle operator/driver shall meet the following qualifications:
    - (a) possess a valid Commercial Driver's License;
    - (b) have a detailed knowledge of the street names and street layout of the City;
    - shall certify that he is familiar with current traffic laws of the State of Florida and the City of Pompano Beach regarding the

operation of emergency equipment. The traffic laws may be obtained at the CITY's Police Department/BSO. Such certification shall be kept on record at EMERALD's home office; and

- (d) have the physical qualifications necessary to perform the normal tasks required to operate various required equipment.
- 19. EMERALD shall conduct criminal history checks on all employees engaged in towing for the City of Pompano Beach. Such criminal history checks must be available for review when requested by the City Manager or the CITY's Police Department/BSO. CITY reserves the right to approve or reject, for any reasons, EMERALD's personnel assigned in performance of this Agreement at any time.
- 20. EMERALD shall not commence operations until certification or proof of insurance, detailing terms and provisions of coverage, has been received and approved by the CITY's Risk Manager. EMERALD shall maintain the following insurance coverage as follows throughout the term of this Agreement:
  - (a) Workers' Compensation Insurance covering all employees and providing benefits as required by Chapter 440, Florida Statutes, as amended. EMERALD further agrees to be responsible for employment, control and conduct of its employees and for any injuries sustained by such employees in the cause of their employment.

#### (b) Public Liability Insurance:

(1) naming the City of Pompano Beach as an additional insured, on General Liability Insurance only, in connection with the work being done under this Agreement;

- (2) the public liability insurance shall include the types of insurance and minimum policy limits as set forth in RFP H-52-10, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof in Exhibit "A."
- (c) EMERALD shall provide certification or proof of insurance that contains a provision for notification to CITY thirty (30) days in advance of any material change in coverage or cancellation period.
- EMERALD covenants and agrees that it will indemnify, save and hold harmless the CITY and the CITY's contracted law enforcement provider, and all of their Commissioners, officials, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, losses, damages, cost charges or expenses, including attorney's fees, arising out of any action as a direct or proximate result of EMERALD's performance of this Agreement including, but not limited to, damages to any person or property to which the CITY or said parties may be subject, except that neither EMERALD nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused by or resulting form the sole negligence of the CITY or the CITY's contract law enforcement provider, or any of their officers, agents or employees.
- 22. Should EMERALD fail to comply with any of the provisions contained within Section 21 above and the CITY or CITY's Police Department/BSO, or both, be required to defend any claim, demand, cause of action, or lawsuit arising out of any act, action, negligent acts or negligent omissions, or willful misconduct of EMERALD, its officers, agents or employees as a direct or proximate result of its performance of this Agreement, EMERALD shall be responsible for and agrees to reimburse CITY, and BSO, if applicable, for all expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs incurred in defending such claim, cause of action or lawsuit.
- At all times during the life of this Agreement, EMERALD shall maintain and furnish the CITY with a Performance Bond in the amount of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars, payable to the City of Pompano Beach should EMERALD fail to perform any of its requirements set forth in this Agreement. Such bond obligation may be satisfied utilizing bonds which are in effect for time periods less than the full life of this Agreement, but not for less than one (1) year in duration. However, no gap in

coverage shall be permitted during the term of this Agreement and all such bonds must first obtain prior approval of the CITY's Risk Manager, who shall not unreasonably withhold such approval. Upon the expiration date of any such bond in effect, the failure of EMERALD to renew or otherwise continue to utilize that bond for any ensuing year shall not constitute a breach of that bond, however failure to have a new bond in place or to meet the cash deposit requirement set forth below, shall constitute grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement. All bonds shall be in such form and executed by such sureties as are named in the current list of "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as acceptable Reinsuring Companies" as published in Circular 570, as amended, by the Financial Management Service, Surety Bond Branch, U.S. Department of the Treasury. All Bonds signed by an agent shall be accompanied by a certified copy of such agent's authority to act. The Performance Bond shall be obtained from surety or insurance companies that are duly licensed or authorized in the State of Florida and shall contain a provision for notification to the CITY sixty (60) days in advance of bond cancellation. EMERALD shall furnish to the CITY the required Bond within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract.

In lieu of a Performance Bond, EMERALD may provide the CITY with a cash deposit of Fifty Thousand (\$50,000.00) Dollars to be held by the CITY during the term of the Agreement to ensure EMERALD's performance in accordance with the terms of same. CITY shall place such cash deposit in a non-interest bearing account to be held during the term of this Agreement unless an approved performance bond meeting the requirements herein is substituted for same. CITY may draw upon said cash deposit to cover any amount required caused by EMERALD's failure to perform under any term of this Agreement after written notice has been provided to EMERALD by the CITY advising of the deficiency in performance requiring said use of funds. EMERALD shall be responsible to maintain the required cash deposit amount and should the CITY be required to draw any of the deposited funds, EMERALD shall be responsible to replenish any such amounts drawn within sixty (60) days to attain the required amount on deposit, and failure to do so shall constitute a violation and cause for termination of this Agreement. Said deposit shall be returned to EMERALD by the CITY within one year of the expiration or termination date of this Agreement, to ensure payment of potential claims from the time period the Agreement was in effect.

24. EMERALD agrees to levy charges and fees in accordance with the rate schedule submitted with the bid proposal that is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "B." GITY shall not be responsible for the collection of any charges. The administrative charge set forth in Exhibit

"B" shall be that same administrative charge as established and permitted by the Broward County Board of Commissioners as prescribed by the Broward County Board of Commissioners. This administrative fee is imposed to cover the cost of title search, registered mailings and public advertising in accordance with Florida Statutes, as amended. Additional charges for trucks and unusual equipment shall be assessed only in accordance with a schedule of rates on file with the CITY's Police Department/BSO and approved by the CITY prior to posting. EMERALD shall not charge an additional fee ("franchise fee," etc.) directly to the consumer. A copy of the rate schedule for services provided by EMERALD under this Agreement shall be posted for the term of this Agreement in EMERALD's storage facility and also made available in all units responding to calls from the CITY's Police Department/BSO. Collection of any fees or charges from the public is the sole responsibility of EMERALD and not the CITY.

- The rates established herein will remain firm and fixed for the term of this Agreement. The rates charged by EMERALD for towing, storage and any other services provided under this Agreement shall not be greater than the applicable maximum rates as provided in accordance with the rate schedule listed in the proposal documentation and as set forth in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated into this Agreement. Failure to adhere to this rate structure may constitute grounds for contract termination by the CITY upon thirty (30) days notice to EMERALD. In the event an audit indicates EMERALD has not honored the established rate schedule, EMERALD shall be liable for any and all overage charges to the customer and responsible for refunding same. Rates for any extension term are subject to negotiation between the parties and any changes require City Commission approval. Should EMERALD furnish a wrecker in a higher class than the one required for a particular class of vehicle, the only charges that would be authorized are those for the proper class of wrecker for the vehicle being towed or as requested by the City's Police Department/BSO or Fire Rescue Department.
- When a vehicle is classified by the CITY's Police Department/BSO as "evidence" and a hold is placed on the vehicle, the provisions of Section 323.001, Florida Statutes, as amended, shall be applicable. However, having received consideration under this Agreement with the CITY, EMERALD shall agree not to seek or pursue collection of accrued towing and storage charges incurred pursuant to Section 323.001(2) (b), Florida Statutes, as amended, from the CITY's Police Department/BSO per the statute or from the CITY.

- A request for tow rate adjustment by EMERALD shall be made in writing to the City Manager ninety (90) days in advance of the contract renewal date. A request for an increased towing rate will also affect the fee paid to the CITY in an equal percentage increase.
- 28. EMERALD shall provide and maintain at least sixteen (16) vehicles composed of the following classifications:
  - Four (4) Class "A" Wreckers
  - Three (3) Class "B"
  - Three (3) Class "C" Wreckers
  - One (1) Class "D" Wrecker
  - Five (5) Roll-Back or Slide Back Carriers

#### All wreckers must have:

- the capability of towing or carrying motorcycles;
- a boom capacity and winch minimum of four (4) tons; and
- a range capacity of up to twenty-five (25) tons.

Classes are as described and required by the State of Florida Highway Patrol. Said vehicles shall be adequately equipped and based in close proximity to the City of Pompano Beach to respond to the various requests of the CITY in the time prescribed for the various situations. In accordance with its proposal in response to RFP H-52-10, EMERALD agrees to provide and maintain the equipment list found in Exhibit "C" of this Agreement.

- 29. Tow trucks or wreckers used by EMERALD to tow vehicles from the streets and properties within the City, as herein provided, will adhere to the following minimum guidelines:
  - (a) The name of the establishment must be lettered in a professional manner on both sides of the vehicles.
  - (b) There shall be a rotor beam type light or equivalent lighting device mounted on top of the wrecker in such a manner that it can be seen from the front, rear and both sides. This light shall be amber in color, and shall not be in operation when a wrecker has been dispatched to a tow call. The rotating amber light will

- only be used at the scene of the tow, and while towing the vehicle back to a compound. No tow vehicle will be equipped with a siren.
- (c) Amber lights shall be installed on the front of the wrecker, with amber reflectors on the front sides.
- (d) Red lights and red reflectors shall be installed on the rear and rear sides.
- 30. EMERALD shall have a minimum of two (2) vehicles available to respond within ten (10) minutes to an emergency scene and a response time of no more than thirty (30) minutes for non-emergency calls, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis, to assist the CITY's Police Department/BSO or Fire Rescue Department. EMERALD agrees that in pursuance of the services to be performed under this Agreement, no agent or employee of EMERALD will respond to such services with a wrecker from their residence if that residence is within the City limits of Pompano Beach.
- 31. EMERALD shall operate and maintain a storage garage and outside storage facility at 4000 North Powerline Road, Deerfield Beach, Florida in compliance with the requirements set forth in RFP H-52-10, and EMERALD's response to same, and all applicable federal, state, county and local regulations. This storage facility shall be protected by an alarm system or guard dog, with a solid wall or substantial wire fence not less than six (6) feet in height. The fence shall screen the enclosed area from public view, and barriers shall be affixed to the top of the fence to discourage access.
  - 32. The outside storage area shall include, but not be limited to:
    - holding a minimum of two hundred (200) vehicles, properly spaced to provide access and removal of vehicles and
    - having lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of one-hundred fifty (150) feet.
- 33. EMERALD shall provide a minimum of six (6) enclosed, secured storage units, capable of storing a minimum of three (3) vehicles each inside as well as property of evidentiary value for law enforcement purposes only. The inside storage units will have lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of one-hundred fifty (150) feet and will be weatherproof. EMERALD shall provide a minimum of one (1) storage unit with a hydraulic lift to permit inspection of underside of vehicles. The inside storage units shall have paved floors, i.e., concrete or asphalt, and be free of dirt, standing water

and vegetation. The work area shall be a minimum of eight (8) feet by twenty (20) feet per vehicle with at least an eighty-one (81) inch ceiling. Each inside storage unit must have an electrical and lighting source sufficient to allow for the processing of a vehicle.

- 34. Any area within the facility, that is designated a police storage lot for the purpose of holding vehicles that may be evidence in a criminal cause, will have the appropriate security fencing and a working electronic surveillance system. The CITY's Police Department/BSO will conduct, at a minimum, annual Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) security assessments. EMERALD shall make every effort to complete any recommendations from the completed assessment.
- 35. EMERALD may subcontract with another storage facility to meet short-term demands, provided that the temporary storage facility meets all of the requirements as set forth in RFP H-52-10 and in this Agreement.
- 36. EMERALD shall provide, at the request of the CITY's Fire Rescue Department or Police Department/BSO, use of their storage facility as an extrication site, and shall cover a vehicle with weatherproof material or otherwise provide weatherproof protection or storage when required in the opinion of EMERALD and with the concurrence of the owner or CITY's Police Department/BSO. A one-time fee as set forth in the rate schedule attached hereto as Exhibit "B," may be charged for this service, and no additional charges for this service may be required.
- 37. EMERALD will not change the storage facility location without written permission from the CITY.
- EMERALD's liability for a towed vehicle, and all personal property contained therein, will commence within the time the wrecker is hooked onto the vehicle to be towed. EMERALD will have its employee, representative, or agent review the inventory of all personal property in the vehicle(s) that he or she is directed to tow with a CITY Police Officer/BSO Deputy Sheriff or the owner or possessor of the vehicle(s). Such inventory shall be made in triplicate and shall be maintained by EMERALD as a permanent record. One copy of the inventory shall be given to the owner/operator of the vehicle towed, if known, or securely attached to the vehicle, and the CITY Police Department/BSO shall retain one copy. EMERALD shall be solely liable and responsible to the owner, or person or legal entity entitled to lawful possession, for all personal property in any vehicle towed under this Agreement.

- 39. EMERALD agrees to assume responsibility for any articles of personal property left in the vehicle and listed on the vehicle storage receipt form. EMERALD agrees to replace with an equivalent any such article, or to reimburse the owner for the value of any missing article upon verification of the loss by the CITY's Police Department/BSO.
- 40. EMERALD shall allow the owner, or authorized agent of the owner of the vehicle to have access to their vehicles in the storage compound during normal business hours. Access shall be limited to any lawful purpose including, but not limited to, removal of personal items from the vehicle or inspection for insurance purposes. There shall be no charge attached to this access.
- 41. EMERALD agrees to accept, at a minimum, the following forms of payment at the storage compound and in the field, if necessary, from the public: cash, at least one major credit card, any commercial business check, traveler's check, or money order.
- 42. Personal property in the vehicle stored by EMERALD shall not be disposed of to defray any charges for towing or storage of vehicles without a Court Order or other proper legal procedure.
- 43. EMERALD will provide to the CITY's Police Department/BSO, on a monthly basis, a complete and detailed listing of all personal property coming into EMERALD's control as a result of this Agreement, and which has remained in EMERALD's control for a period in excess of thirty (30) days. Said listing may consist of copies of the tow reports if said property is clearly documented in same.
- 44. EMERALD shall allow members of the CITY's Police Department/BSO to inspect the storage facility and the vehicles stored therein without previous notice and the address of the compound shall be supplied to the CITY's Police Department/BSO and kept current, including all temporary facilities utilized by EMERALD.
- 45. EMERALD shall be responsible for clean up of accident debris and the removal of hazardous waste spills at the scene of the accident when EMERALD is requested to remove one or more vehicles and EMERALD shall transport and dispose of all such debris and hazardous materials in accordance with all applicable laws, rates and regulations.

- 46. EMERALD shall furnish inside storage or other form of adequate protection for all vehicles, which are of a body type, or in a physical condition, which is such that inclement weather could result in damage thereto.
- 47. In the event that EMERALD has in its possession vehicle(s) or personal property, arising out of this Agreement, for a period in excess of thirty (30) days and is ordered to turn this property over to the County or Circuit Court, the Sheriff of Broward County, or the CITY's Police Department pursuant to Chapter 705 or 715 of the Florida Statutes, as amended, EMERALD agrees to forego its possessory garageman's lien to collect any storage or towing charges due and owing.
- EMERALD agrees to release any vehicle that has not been marked "HOLD," providing proof of identification and ownership is presented. EMERALD further agrees that any vehicle towed that is marked "HOLD" cannot be released without written authority from the CITY's Police Department/BSO. EMERALD shall not divulge any information with respect to a towed vehicle when such a vehicle has a police hold. Anyone wishing to obtain such information shall be referred to the designated person(s) who placed the "HOLD" at the CITY's Police Department/BSO. Persons who make application for the release of towed and/or stored vehicles shall be required to present a copy of the tow-in sheet and proof of ownership by presentation of a title or registration which shall be permitted to be retrieved from the vehicle, if applicable.
- EMERALD shall keep such records and accounts, and require any and all subcontractors to keep records and accounts, as may be necessary to record complete and correct entries as to personnel hours charged to this engagement, and any expenses for which EMERALD expects to be reimbursed. Such books and records will be available at all reasonable times for examination and audit by CITY and shall be kept for a period of three (3) years after the completion of all work to be performed pursuant to this Agreement. Incomplete or incorrect entries in such books and records will be grounds for disallowance by CITY of any fees or expenses based upon such entries.
- 50. EMERALD shall have the capability of producing information and status reports concerning each vehicle serviced by the company as may be required by the CITY's Police Department/BSO for its purposes. EMERALD shall submit a report to the CITY, by the 21st of each month for the previous month, the following reports:

Towing Activity Report, to include for each tow:

- 1) Date of tow
- 2) Service call number assigned by the CITY's Police Department/BSO
- 3) Type of tow such as accident, parking, city vehicle, etc.

Vehicle Release Report, to include:

- 1) All information contained in the Towing Activity Report;
- 2) Date vehicle released or disposed of;
- Method of disposition, such as release to owner, release to law enforcement, etc.; and
- 4) A complete breakdown of all towing charges, including sales taxes.
- 51. EMERALD shall use the CITY's Police Department's/BSO's Vehicle Hold and Storage Receipt (BSO RP #53) (Attachment "C" of RFP H-52-10) to document vehicular as well as inventoried item information contained therein.
- 52. EMERALD shall have prepared billheads, setting forth the names and addresses of the places of business of EMERALD. Before the owner claims an impounded vehicle or person lawfully entitled to possession, EMERALD will provide such person with a list of its rates for towing, storage and other services under this Agreement, and an itemized statement of all charges for the towing and storage for the specific vehicle(s). EMERALD shall retain a duplicate copy of such bill and shall produce same upon demand of the CITY or its Police Department/BSO.
- 53. Before receiving payment, EMERALD, its agent, servant, employee or assign, will prepare a bill on the above billhead, in duplicate, containing the following information:
  - (a) name and address of the person engaging EMERALD;
  - (b) license number of the vehicle(s);
  - (c) motor and vehicle identification number;
  - (d) personal property recovered and returned to the owner of the vehicle or person lawfully entitled to its possession; and

- (e) make, year, model, color of vehicle(s) towed and/or stored.
- 54. EMERALD shall keep a hard covered log of the number and type of calls handled under this Agreement. The log shall contain the date the vehicle(s) were towed, the make, model, license plate (if known), the vehicle identification number, and the name and address of the owner or driver or person claiming the vehicle(s), and the date the vehicle(s) was released to the owner or driver, and charges for same.
- 55. EMERALD will provide to the CITY's Police Department/BSO, on a monthly basis, a complete and detailed listing of vehicles which have been towed pursuant to this Agreement, and which have remained on EMERALD's lots for a period in excess of thirty (30) days. The same information will be provided to the CITY relating to personal property coming into EMERALD's control as a result of this Agreement, which has remained in EMERALD's control for a period in excess of thirty (30) days.
- 56. EMERALD, during the term of this Agreement shall not engage directly or indirectly or through any subsidiary or other entity in the automobile repair, automobile paint and/or body repair business, salvage, junkyard, or automobile recycling or remove any parts from any vehicle towed or stored pursuant to the provisions herein. EMERALD, however, will not be precluded from subcontracting with a storage facility for the temporary storage of derelict vehicles or vessels.
- 57. Nothing contained herein shall prevent the owner or operator of a motor vehicle located within the corporate limits of Pompano Beach from requesting a wrecker or tow truck of his own choice or requesting that his vehicle be towed to a garage or compound other than that of EMERALD.
- 58. No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed by EMERALD because of any discussions with any CITY employee. Only those communications, which are in writing from the CITY, may be considered as a duly authorized expression on behalf of the CITY. In addition, only signed and written communication from authorized representatives of EMERALD will be recognized by the CITY as duly authorized expressions on behalf of EMERALD.
- 59. Whenever either party desires to give notice to the other, such notice must be in writing, sent by certified United States mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or by hand delivery with a request for a written receipt of acknowledgment of delivery, addressed to the party for whom it is intended at the place last specified. The place for giving notice shall remain the same as set forth herein

until changed in writing in the manner provided in this section. For the present, the parties designate the following:

FOR CITY:

City of Pompano Beach Attention: City Manager 100 West Atlantic Boulevard Pompano Beach, Florida 33060

FOR EMERALD:

James M. Jennings, President Emerald Transportation Corporation 4000 North Powerline Road Deerfield Beach, Florida 33073

- 60. All disputes concerning the level of service or any matter referred to herein will be referred to the City Manager of the City of Pompano Beach, or his designee, who shall conduct such investigation and inquiries, including discussions with the company which may be required to appropriately investigate the complaint and obtain accurate information. EMERALD agrees to cooperate with the City Manager or his designee in their investigation of such matters. The City Manager, or his designee, shall be the sole judge of the merits of the dispute and the company shall abide by their decision.
- 61. Unless specifically amended and except as otherwise provided herein, CITY and EMERALD agree to be bound by all terms, conditions, duties, obligations and specifications set forth in the "City of Pompano Beach Proposal for Vehicle Towing and Wrecker Service" from EMERALD, a copy of which is attached to the Agreement and incorporated herein by reference as composite Exhibit "D" (the "Proposal") and RFP H-52-10 from the City of Pompano Beach, a copy of which is attached to the Agreement and incorporated herein by reference as composite Exhibit "A."
- 62. EMERALD shall maintain during the term of this Agreement all books of account, receipt invoices, reports and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices and standards. The form of all records and reports shall be subject to the approval of the CITY's Internal Auditor. The CITY's Internal Auditor shall be permitted to audit and examine the books of account, reports, and records relating to this Agreement during normal business hours.

- 63. There shall be no discrimination as to race, gender, sex, color, creed or national origin in the operations conducted under this Agreement. EMERALD shall conduct its business in an orderly and ethical manner at all times and shall use every means to obtain and keep the confidence of the general public. All public contact shall be in a courteous and orderly manner.
- This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and Agreement between the parties and may not be changed, altered, or modified except by an instrument in writing signed by all parties against whom enforcement of such change would be sought. The parties agree that should any issue arise regarding conflicting language in the RFP and Proposal and this Agreement and or any additional exhibit, the language in this Agreement and/or other exhibits shall prevail. In the event any term or provision of this Agreement shall be determined by appropriate judicial authority to be illegal or otherwise invalid, such provisions shall be given its nearest legal meaning or be construed or deleted as such authority determines and the remainder of this Agreement shall be construed to be in full force and effect.
- 65. No waiver or modification of this contract or of any covenant, condition or limitation contained in it shall be valid unless it is in writing and duly executed by the party to be charged with it, and that no evidence of any waiver or modification shall be offered or received in evidence in any proceeding, arbitration or litigation between the parties arising out of or affecting this contract, or the right or obligations of any party under it, unless such waiver or modification is in writing, duly executed as above. The parties agree that the provisions of this paragraph may not be waived except by a duly executed writing.
- 66. EMERALD shall be deemed an independent Contractor for all purposes, and the employees of EMERALD or any of its contractors, subcontractors and the employees thereof, shall not in any manner be deemed to be employees of CITY. As such, the employees of EMERALD, its contractors or subcontractors, shall not be subject to any withholding for tax, social security or other purposes by CITY nor shall such contractor, subcontractor, or employee be entitled to sick leave, pension benefits, vacation, medical benefits, life insurance, workers compensation, unemployment compensation, or the like from CITY.
- 67. This Agreement, or any interest herein, shall not be assigned, transferred or otherwise encumbered, under any circumstances, by EMERALD without the prior written consent of CITY. For purposes of this Agreement, any change of ownership of EMERALD shall constitute an assignment that

requires CITY approval. However, this Agreement shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the respective parties and their executors, administrators, heirs, personal representative, successors and assigns.

- 68. This Agreement may be terminated by the CITY without cause upon providing EMERALD with at least sixty (60) days prior written notice. Should either party fail to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such failure, the non-defaulting party will have the right tot terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of written notice to the defaulting party of its election to do so. The foregoing rights of termination are in addition to any other rights and remedies that each party may have.
- 69. It is expressly understood by and between the parties to this Agreement that CITY is a municipal corporation and that this Agreement relates to services that clearly affect the health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Pompano Beach. The provision of towing and wrecker service is further clearly related to the maintenance of the CITY's vehicles and safety of the streets and thoroughfares of CITY. By virtue of the extraordinary nature of the obligations of CITY dealt with in this Agreement, it is understood and agreed by EMERALD that this Agreement shall be terminated by CITY immediately at any time that CITY has evidence that EMERALD has abandoned its duties and responsibilities under this contract by its failure to respond three (3) times during any year to requests by CITY or its Police Department/BSO for tows and therefore is not performing in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. (A delayed response in excess of the required times set forth in Section 30 may be considered a failure to respond unless EMERALD can demonstrate that such delay was caused by circumstances not attributable to them or beyond their control.) It is further understood and agreed that EMERALD shall have no claim for damages whatsoever and EMERALD does hereby release CITY from any claim for any damages of any kind in accordance with the performance and with the terms of this Agreement in the event of cancellation of this Agreement by CITY at any time for the grounds stated in this section. Further, it is understood that by the very nature of the terms of this Agreement and the municipal function related to herein that CITY may cancel this Agreement at any time pursuant to the procedures set forth in this Agreement.
- 70. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State of Florida. Venue for litigation between the parties to this Agreement shall be in Broward County, Florida.

#### CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA

#### REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS H-52-10

The City of Pompano Beach ("City") invites qualified firms to submit proposals to provide vehicle towing and wrecker services within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach for an initial term of five years, with the option of one renewal term for an additional five years.

The City will receive sealed proposals until 2:00 p.m. (local), August 27, 2010, in the City's Purchasing Office, 1190 N.E. 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Building C, Pompano Beach, Florida, 33060. E-mailed or faxed proposals will not be acceptable.

#### 1. Scope Of Services

The City of Pompano Beach, Florida desires to enter into a contract with a qualified firm to provide non-exclusive vehicle towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach. The Contractor shall have exclusive rights to provide service for private vehicles ordered towed by City authorities, within the City of Pompano Beach, Florida and during the designated period, except as otherwise noted herein. The towing service, at a minimum will include towing for all City vehicles, to include the City's Police Department or the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, within the corporate limits of Pompano Beach. In addition, the towing service will have the exclusive right to tow police confiscated vehicles that are towed from the City of Pompano Beach. When requested, the towing service will have the exclusive right to tow from any City property to include any CRA property and Air Park property. The vendor agrees to provide to the City at no charge appropriate "Tow Away" signs.

Based on historical information, it is estimated that the Contractor will perform approximately 3,000 tows per year as a result of this contract. This estimate is for informational purposes only, and no warranty or guarantee is given or implied as to the amount of tows a firm may conduct a result of this contract.

The specifications contained herein are meant to indicate minimum standards and requirements necessary for proper services as required by the City of Pompano Beach.

Nothing in these specifications shall be interpreted to limit the responsibilities of the Contractor from carrying out additional measures required to meet the intent and quality level specified.

Initial ...

Nothing contained herein shall prevent the owner or operator of a motor vehicle from calling a wrecker of their own choice or requesting that their vehicle be towed to a garage or storage compound other than that of the contract holder.

#### 2. Minimum Requirements

Note: Throughout this document, all references to the City's Police Department shall also be construed to refer to the City's contracted law enforcement provider.

a. Proposer shall be a holder of a general towing and wrecker service license, and must have been regularly engaged in the towing/wrecker/storage business for a minimum of five (5) years.

The Proposer must indicate the exact location of the facility from which vehicles will be dispatched, and if a separate location, where the home storage yard and office will be located.

The home storage yard must be located within a five-mile radius of the center of Pompano Beach; a map showing these boundaries is included herein; the boundaries are (approximate) north to Southwest 10th Street, west to 441, and south to Oakland Park Boulevard.

- b. All vehicles used during the term of this contract must contain a two-way radio communication system, to enable continuous direct contact with the vehicle driver from an office of the successful vendor.
- c. The vehicles used must be commercially manufactured, constructed, and equipped for the tow of vehicles as specified by the City's Police Department. The vehicles, at all times, must be properly maintained and kept in a high degree of mechanical and safe operating condition.
- d. Vehicle operator/drivers must meet the following qualifications:
  - 1) Possess a valid Commercial Driver's License.
  - 2) Have a detailed knowledge of the street names and street layout in the City.
  - 3) Shall certify that that the individual is familiar with current traffic laws of the State of Florida and the City of Pompano Beach regarding the operation of emergency equipment. The traffic laws may be obtained at the City's Police Department. Such certification must be kept on record at the home office of the successful vendor.
  - 4) Shall have physical qualifications to enable the individual to perform the normal tasks required to operate the various required equipment.

5) The vendor must conduct criminal history checks on all employees engaged in such towing for the City of Pompano Beach. Such criminal history checks must be available for review when requested by the City Manager or City's Police Department.

#### 3. Required Equipment

- a. The vendor shall provide and maintain a minimum of sixteen (16) vehicles as follows:
  - 1) Four (4) Class "A" Wreckers
  - 2) Three (3) Class "B" Wreckers
  - 3) Three (3) Class "C" Wreckers
  - 4) One (1) Class D Wrecker

Note: Wreckers above shall have the capability of towing or carrying motorcycles; must have a boom capacity and winch minimum of four (4) tons; and, range capacity shall be up to 25 tons.

5) Five (5) Roll-Back or Slide-Back Carriers

Minimum required equipment on each wrecker is listed on Attachments D-G.

NOTE: The proposer (company) shall attach a list to their response of all equipment available to be used under this RFP. The list shall include at a minimum the following for each unit: Class, Unit # (if so identified); Model Year; Make and Type; Wrecker Capacity, and vehicle condition.

- b. Vehicle class is described and required by the Florida Highway Patrol.
- c. All vehicles shall be equipped to provide the service required in this type of work.
- d. Vehicles should be based in close proximity to the City of Pompano Beach to respond to the various requests of the City in the time prescribed for the various situations.
- e. The company must have a minimum of two (2) vehicles available to respond within ten (10) minutes to an emergency scene, and a response time of no more than thirty (30) minutes for non-emergency calls, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis to assist the City's Police or Fire Departments.
- f. The list of equipment submitted with the Proposal shall also include a description of all types of extraction equipment available to be used under this RFP to include the availability of low-pressure air bags or equivalent type of equipment for use in handling propane or flammable liquid tanker trucks, etc.

g. The company shall equip all vehicles with equipment needed to "clean" a scene of an accident as prescribed by State statute.

#### 4. Storage Facility

- a. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to maintain on office, answering service or other type facility to receive telephone communications 24 hours per day, seven days per week, for immediate dispatch to location(s) as directed. The Contractor will maintain telephone communications 24 hours a day to answer calls from the City's Police Department, and public.
- b. The home storage yard shall contain, at a minimum, the following:
  - 1. The Contractor shall provide an outside storage area that holds a minimum of two hundred (200) vehicles, properly spaced to provide access and removal of vehicles. The outside storage area will have lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of 150 feet. The storage facility must be protected by an alarm system or guard dog, with a solid wall or substantial wire fence not less than six (6) feet in height. The fence shall screen the enclosed area from public view, the storage area fully illuminated, and barriers shall be affixed to the top of the fence to discourage access over the top.
  - 2. The Contractor shall provide a minimum of six (6) enclosed, secured storage units, capable of storing a minimum of three (3) vehicles each inside as well as property of evidentiary value for law enforcement purposes only. The inside storage units will have lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of 150 feet and will be weatherproof. The Contractor shall provide a minimum of one (1) storage unit with a hydraulic lift to permit inspection of underside of vehicles. The inside storage units shall have paved floors, i.e., concrete or asphalt, free of dirt, standing water or vegetation. The work area must be a minimum of 8' x 20' per vehicle with at least an 81" ceiling. Each inside storage unit must have an electrical and lighting source sufficient to allow for the processing of a vehicle.
  - 3. The Contractor does have the right to sub-contract with another storage facility to meet short-term demands due to an overflow of vehicles only. The sub-contracted yard must be approved by the City and must meet the requirements for a storage facility as indicated within this agreement. The storage compound shall be owned or leased by the Contractor. Such garage and storage facilities shall be capable of storing all vehicles towed by the company until these vehicles are lawfully reclaimed from the company or legally disposed of.

- c. The Contractor shall be responsible for all inventoried property at the moment the company's tow vehicle is attached to the "vehicle to be towed".
- d. Any area within the facility that is designated a police storage lot, will have the appropriate security fencing and will have working electronic surveillance system. The City's Police Department will conduct, at a minimum, annual CPTED (Crime Prevention through Environmental Design) security assessments. The Contractor will make every effort to complete any recommendation from the completed assessment.
- e. The Contractor shall be responsible for all vehicles and inventoried property therein while said vehicles are stored in the company storage facility and shall be prepared to release any vehicle between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The Contractor further agrees to provide on-call personnel to release vehicles between 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. and on Sunday.
- f. The Contractor shall allow members of the City's Police Department to inspect its storage facility and the vehicles stored therein without previous notice.
- g. Owners of towed vehicles must be granted access to their vehicles in the storage compound during normal business hours. Access is limited to any lawful purpose including but not limited to inspection for insurance purposes. There shall be no charge attached to this access.
- h. The Contractor agrees to accept, at a minimum, the following forms of payment, at the storage compound and in the field (if necessary) from the public: Cash, at least one major credit card and any commercial business check or travelers check.

#### 5. Business Conflict of Interest

- a. The Contractor shall not engage directly or indirectly or through any subsidiary or other entity in the following type ventures:
  - 1) Automobile repair
  - 2) Automobile paint and body repair
  - 3) Salvage, junkyard or auto-recycling
- b. The above does not preclude the Contractor from sub-contracting with a storage facility for temporary storage of derelict vehicles.

#### 6. Towing of City-Owned Vehicles

The Contractor shall provide all required towing and road service that may be required by the City of Pompano Beach in the operation and maintenance of its City owned and leased vehicles, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider if applicable, at no charge from sites within the limits of Broward County.

When such towing requirements are for City owned and leased vehicles outside of the limits of Broward County, the Contractor will be paid a reasonable fee in keeping with the charges customarily levied to the general public for rendering towing and road services of equal kind.

#### 7. Reporting Capability & Requirements

- a. The Contractor shall have the capability of producing information and status reports concerning each vehicle serviced by the company as may be required by the City's Police Department for policy purposes.
- b. Contractor shall submit a report to the City, by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month for the previous month, the following reports. The form of reports shall be determined by the Contractor, but are subject to the approval of the City.

Towing Activity Report, to include for each tow:

- 1) Date of tow.
- 2) Service call number assigned by the Police Department.
- 3) Type of tow such as accident, parking, City vehicle, etc.

Vehicle Release Report, to include:

- 1) All information contained in the Towing Activity Report.
- 2) Date vehicle released or disposed of.
- 3) Method of disposition such as release to owner, release to Police, etc.
- 4) A complete breakdown of all towing charges, including sales taxes.

#### 8. Impounded Vehicle Report

The Contractor will be provided a Vehicle Hold and Storage Receipt BSO RP #53 (see sample attached) by the City's Police Department. The form is used by the City's Police Department and the towing company, to document vehicular as well as inventoried item information contained therein.

#### 9. Fee to be Paid to the City

The successful proposer (Contractor) shall pay the City a fee of at least \$50,000.00 annually, payable in advance in equal monthly installments. Proposers are encouraged to submit fee proposals in excess of the \$50,000.00 minimum. Proposers must complete Attachment B indicating the annual fee offered to the City.

Monthly payments shall be payable on the first day of each calendar month until the termination of the contract. If the payment is delinquent by more than fifteen (15) days after the payment is due, an additional charge of one hundred (\$100) dollars per day will be due for each day's delay in payment, retroactive to and beginning with the due date of the payment. In the event that a delinquent payment and resulting penalties are due, any payments received will first be applied to the penalty amount, prior to being applied to the regular monthly payment due. In this respect, the \$100 penalty fee shall accrue until the monthly payment and all applicable penalties are paid in full

#### 10. Towing / Wrecker / Storage Charges to Public

A complete rate schedule must accompany this proposal (See Attachment A). The rates are those to be charged to the public and must be comprehensive and all-inclusive, containing rate charges for all types of towing, vehicle storage, additional equipment (dollies, etc.), and labor charges. Additional charges for trucks and unusual equipment shall be assessed only in accordance with a schedule of rates on file with the City's Police Department and approved by the City prior to posting.

The Contractor may not charge an additional fee ("franchise fee", etc.) directly to the consumer.

A copy of the rate schedule for services provided by the company under this RFP shall be posted for the length of the resulting contract in their home office, storage yard, etc. A copy should also be available in all units responding to calls from the City's Police Department. The City shall not be responsible for the collection of any charges from the public. Collection is the sole responsibility of the company.

These rates will be firm for the initial five (5) year period of the contract. Rates proposed are a factor in the Evaluation Criteria for this solicitation.

A request for tow rate adjustment by the Contractor must be made in writing to the City Manager ninety (90) days in advance of the contract renewal date. A request for an increased towing rate will also affect the fee paid to the City in an equal percentage increase.

When a vehicle is classified by the City's Police Department as "evidence" and a hold is placed on the vehicle, the provisions of section 323.001, Florida Statutes shall be applicable. However, having received consideration under the agreement with City, the selected contractor shall agree not to seek nor pursue collection of accrued towing and storage charges incurred pursuant to section 323.001(2)(b), Florida Statutes, from the City's Police Department per the statute, or from the City.

#### 11. Bonding Requirement

Before commencing operations under a contract based on this RFP, the successful proposer (Contractor) shall furnish the City of Pompano Beach a Performance Bond for the life of the contract in the amount of \$50,000.00, payable to the City of Pompano Beach should the company fail to perform as stipulated in this RFP and resulting agreement.

All bonds shall be in such form and executed by such sureties as are named in the current list of "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as acceptable Reinsuring Companies" as published in Circular 570 (amended) by the Financial Management Service, Surety Bond Branch, U.S. Department of the Treasury. All Bonds signed by an agent must be accompanied by a certified copy of such agent's authority to act.

The Performance Bond shall be obtained from surety or insurance companies that are duly licensed or authorized in the State of Florida.

The Performance Bond must contain a provision for notification to the City sixty (60) days in advance of bond cancellation.

The successful proposer (company) shall furnish to the City the required bond within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract.

All Proposers must include in their Proposal a letter from the surety company that would issue the Performance Bond, verifying that the firm is eligible to obtain the bond required herein.

In lieu of a Bond, the City would accept a cash deposit of \$50,000 to be held during the contract term to ensure performance as stated above. If the Proposer anticipates providing the City with cash in lieu of a bond, they must provide satisfactory evidence to the City that the firm has such cash available for this use:

#### 12. Hold Harmless and Indemnification

Proposer covenants and agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless the City and the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, and all of their officers, agents, and employees from any claim, loss, damage, cost, charge or expense arising out of any act, action, neglect or omission by the Proposer, whether direct or indirect, or whether to any person or property to which the City or said parties may be subject, except that neither the Proposer nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of the City or the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, or any of their officers, agents or employees

#### 13. Insurance

The insurance described herein reflects the insurance requirements deemed necessary for this contract by the City. It is not necessary to have this level of insurance in effect at the time of submittal, but certificates indicating that the insurance is currently carried or a letter from the Carrier indicating upgrade ability will speed the review process to determine the most qualified Proposer.

The successful Proposer(s) shall not commence operations until certification or proof of insurance, detailing terms and provisions of coverage, has been received and approved by the City of Pompano Beach Risk Manager. The following insurance coverage shall be required.

a. Worker's Compensation Insurance covering all employees and providing benefits as required by Florida Statute, Chapter 440, regardless of the size of the company (number of employees). The Contractor further agrees to be responsible for employment, control and conduct of its employees and for any injury sustained by such employees in the course of their employment.

#### b. Liability Insurance

- Naming the City of Pompano Beach as an additional insured, on General Liability Insurance only, in connection with work being done under this contract.
- 2) Such Liability insurance shall include the following checked types of insurance and indicated minimum policy limits.

The certification or proof of insurance must contain a provision for notification to the City, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider if applicable, thirty (30) days in advance of any material change in coverage or cancellation.

The successful Proposer shall furnish to the City the certification or proof of insurance required by the provisions set forth above, within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract.



#### 14. Retention of Records and Right to Access

The selected firm shall maintain during the term of the contract all books of account, receipt invoices, reports and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices and standards. The form of all records and reports shall be subject to the approval of the City's Internal Auditor. The selected firm must comply with recommendation for changes, additions, or deletions by the City's Internal Auditor. The City's Internal Auditor must be permitted during normal business hours to audit and examine the books of account, reports, and records relating to this contract. The selected firm shall maintain and make available such records and files for the duration of the contract and retain them beyond the last day of the contract term for the period of three (3) years following contract expiration.

#### 15. Communications

No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed by the firm because of any discussions with any City employee. Only those communications, which are in writing from the City, may be considered as a duly authorized expression on behalf of the City. In addition, only communications from firms that are signed and in writing will be recognized by the City as duly authorized expressions on behalf of firms.

#### 16. No Discrimination

There shall be no discrimination as to race, sex, color, creed, or national origin in the operations conducted under this contract.

#### 17. Independent Contractor

The selected firm shall be deemed an independent Contractor for all purposes, and the employees of the Contractor or any of its contractors, subcontractors and the employees thereof, shall not in any manner be deemed to be employees of City. As such, the employees of the Contractor, its Contractors or subcontractors, shall not be subject to any withholding for tax, social security or other purposes by City, nor shall such Contractor, subcontractor, or employee be entitled to sick leave, pension benefits, vacation, medical benefits, life insurance, workers, unemployment compensation, or the like from City.

#### 18. Staff Assignment

The City of Pompano Beach reserves the right to approve or reject, for any reasons, Proposer's staff assigned to this project at any time. Background checks may be required.

#### 19. Contract Terms

The contract shall include, but not be limited to the following terms:

The contract shall include as a minimum, the entirety of this RFP document, together with the successful Proposer's proposal. Contract shall be prepared by the City of Pompano Beach City Attorney.

If the City of Pompano Beach, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, defends any claim, demand, cause of action, or lawsuit arising out of any act, action, negligent acts or negligent omissions, or willful misconduct of the contractor, its employees, agents or servants during the performance of the contract, whether directly or indirectly, contractor agrees to reimburse the City of Pompano Beach, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider if applicable, for all expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs incurred in defending such claim, cause of action or lawsuit.

#### 20. Waiver

It is agreed that no waiver or modification of this contract or of any covenant, condition or limitation contained in it shall be valid unless it is in writing and duly executed by the party to be charged with it, and that no evidence of any waiver or modification shall be offered or received in evidence in any proceeding, arbitration, or litigation between the parties arising out of or affecting this contract, or the right or obligations of any party under it, unless such waiver or modification is in writing, duly executed as above. The parties agree that the provisions of this paragraph may not be waived except by a duly executed writing.

#### 21. Survivorship Rights

This contract shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the respective parties and their executors, administrators, heirs, personal representative, successors and assigns.

#### 22. Termination

The contract may be terminated by the City of Pompano Beach without cause upon providing contractor with a least sixty (60) days prior written notice.

Should either party fail to perform any of its obligations under this contract for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such failure, the non-defaulting part will have the right to terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of written notice to the defaulting part of its election to do so. The foregoing rights of termination are in addition to any other rights and remedies that such party may have.

#### 23. Manner of Performance

Proposer agrees to perform its duties and obligations under this contract in a professional manner and in accordance with all applicable local, federal, and state laws, rules, and regulations.

Proposer agrees that the services provided under this contract shall be provided by employees that are educated, trained and experienced, certified and licensed in all areas encompassed within their designated duties. Proposer agrees to furnish the City of Pompano Beach with all documentation, certification, authorization, license, permit, or registration currently required by applicable laws or rules and regulations. Proposer further certifies that it and its employees are now in and will maintain good standing with such governmental agencies and that it and its employees will keep all license, permits, registration, authorization or certification required by applicable laws or regulations in full force and effect during the term of this contract. Failure of proposer to comply with this paragraph shall constitute a material breach of contract.

#### 24. Submission/Format Requirements

Eligibility: To be eligible to considered for this contract Proposers must meet the following minimum requirements:

- a. The firm shall have regularly engaged in the towing/wrecker/storage business for a minimum of five (5) years.

A summary of proposer's experience for similar services provided on a daily basis and any governmental entities that are currently being served by the proposer (company).

#### Signature Page:

The Proposal Signature Page must be completed, signed, and returned.

#### References:

Submit a client reference list, including name of contact, firm and/or governmental entity, address, telephone number and type of service provided to each reference. Submit references for the past five years. References will be contacted.

#### Litigation:

Disclose any litigation within the past 5 years arising out your firm's performance.

#### Equipment:

The proposer (company) shall attach a list to their response of all equipment available to be used under this RFP. The list shall include at a minimum the following for each unit: Class, Unit # (if so identified); Model Year; Make and Type; Wrecker Capacity and vehicle condition. List any extraction equipment available for use under this contract.

If the proposer will lease additional equipment to service this contract, the Proposal must include a letter from Proposer's bank, etc., verifying they have access to funds to lease the equipment immediately upon commencement of the contract.

#### Home Storage Yard/Office:

Provide address of home storage yard and office. The proposer (company) shall provide proof that such home storage yard and office meets the requirements of the applicable City or County Zoning codes.

#### 25. Questions and Communication

All questions must include the inquiring firm's name, address, telephone number and RFP name and number. Questions must be received by 2:00 p.m. on August 20, 2010, at the above location. No further questions will be accepted after this date. Oral and other interpretations or clarifications will be without legal effect. Questions and answers will be distributed to all firms known to have obtained the RFP document from the City.

#### 26. Addenda

In the event it becomes necessary to revise, change, modify, or cancel this RFP, addenda will be issued to all known recipients of this solicitation.

#### 27. Acceptance Period

Proposals submitted in response to this RFP must be valid for a period no less than ninety (90) days from the closing date of this solicitation.

#### 28. RFP Conditions and Provisions

The completed and signed proposal (together with all required attachments) must be returned to City on or before the time and date stated herein. All proposers, by submission of a proposal, shall agree to comply with all of the conditions, requirements and instructions of this RFP as stated or implied herein. All proposals and supporting materials submitted will become the property of the City.

Any alteration, erasure, or interlineations by the proposer in this RFP shall constitute cause for rejection. Exceptions or deviations to this proposal may not be added after the submittal date.

All proposers are required to provide all information requested in this RFP. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of the proposal.

The City reserves the right to postpone or cancel this RFP, or reject all proposals, if in its sole discretion it deems it to be in the best interest of the City to do so.

The City reserves the right to waive any technical or formal errors or omissions and to reject all proposals, or to award contract for the items herein, in part or whole, if it is determined to be in the best interests of the City to do so.

The City shall not be liable for any costs incurred by the proposer in the preparation of proposals or for any work performed in connection therein.

#### 29. Selection/Evaluation Process

A Selection/Evaluation Committee will be appointed to select the most qualified firm(s). The Selection/Evaluation Committee will present their findings to the City Commission and, upon Commission approval, will negotiate a contract with the most qualified firm(s).

Proposals will be evaluated using the following criteria.

Each firm should submit documentation that evidences the firm's capability to provide the services required for the Committee's review for short listing purposes. After an initial review of the Proposals, the City may invite proposers for an interview to discuss the proposal and meet firm representatives, particularly key personnel who would be assigned to the project. Should interviews be deemed necessary, it is understood that the City shall incur no costs because of this interview, nor bear any obligation in further consideration of the submittal.

#### 30. Standard Provisions

#### a. Governing Law

Interested vendors will agree that the laws of the State of Florida shall govern agreements, and the venue for any legal action will be in Broward County, Florida.

#### b. Conflict Of Interest

For purposes of determining any possible conflict of interest, each Proposer must disclose if any City employee is also an owner, corporate officer, or an employee of the firm. If any City employee is an owner, corporate officer, or an employee, the Proposer must file a statement with the Broward County Supervisor of Elections pursuant to § 112.313, Florida Statutes.

#### c. Drug Free Workplace

The selected firm(s) will be required to verify they will operate a "Drug Free Workplace" as set forth in Florida Statute, 287.087.

#### d. Public Entity Crimes

A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for public entity crime may not submit a proposal on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a proposal on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit proposals on leases of real property to public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Florida Statute, Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

#### e. Patent Fees, Royalties, And Licenses

If the selected Proposer requires or desires to use any design, trademark, device, material or process covered by letters of patent or copyright, the selected Proposer and his surety shall indemnify and hold harmless the City from any and all claims for infringement by reason of the use of any such patented design, device, trademark, copyright, material or process in connection with the work agreed to be performed and shall indemnify the City from any cost, expense, royalty or damage which the City may be obligated to pay by reason of any infringement at any time during or after completion of the work.

#### f. Permits

The City of Pompano Beach ("City") invites qualified firms to submit proposals to provide vehicle towing and wrecker services within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach for an initial term of five years, with the option of one renewal term for an additional five years.

The City will receive sealed proposals until 2:00 p.m. (local), August 27, 2010, in the City's Purchasing Office, 1190 N.E. 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Building C, Pompano Beach, Florida, 33060. E-mailed or faxed proposals will not be acceptable.

### 1. Scope Of Services

The City of Pompano Beach, Florida desires to enter into a contract with a qualified firm to provide non-exclusive vehicle towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the City of Pompano Beach. The Contractor shall have exclusive rights to provide service for private vehicles ordered towed by City authorities, within the City of Pompano Beach, Florida and during the designated period, except as otherwise noted herein. The towing service, at a minimum will include towing for all City vehicles, to include the City's Police Department or the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, within the corporate limits of Pompano Beach. In addition, the towing service will have the exclusive right to tow police confiscated vehicles that are towed from the City of Pompano Beach. When requested, the towing service will have the exclusive right to tow from any City property to include any CRA property and Air Park property. The vendor agrees to provide to the City at no charge appropriate "Tow Away" signs.

Based on historical information, it is estimated that the Contractor will perform approximately 3,000 tows per year as a result of this contract. This estimate is for informational purposes only, and no warranty or guarantee is given or implied as to the amount of tows a firm may conduct a result of this contract.

The specifications contained herein are meant to indicate minimum standards and requirements necessary for proper services as required by the City of Pompano Beach.

Nothing in these specifications shall be interpreted to limit the responsibilities of the Contractor from carrying out additional measures required to meet the intent and quality level specified.

5) The vendor must conduct criminal history checks on all employees engaged in such towing for the City of Pompano Beach. Such criminal history checks must be available for review when requested by the City Manager or City's Police Department.

### 3. Required Equipment

- a. The vendor shall provide and maintain a minimum of sixteen (16) vehicles as follows:
  - 1) Four (4) Class "A" Wreckers
  - 2) Three (3) Class "B" Wreckers
  - 3) Three (3) Class "C" Wreckers
  - 4) One (1) Class D Wrecker
    Note: Wreckers above shall have the capability of towing or carrying
    motorcycles; must have a boom capacity and winch minimum of four (4)
    tons; and, range capacity shall be up to 25 tons.
  - 5) Five (5) Roll-Back or Slide-Back Carriers

Minimum required equipment on each wrecker is listed on Attachments D-G.

NOTE: The proposer (company) shall attach a list to their response of all equipment available to be used under this RFP. The list shall include at a minimum the following for each unit: Class, Unit # (if so identified); Model Year; Make and Type; Wrecker Capacity, and vehicle condition.

- b. Vehicle class is described and required by the Florida Highway Patrol.
- c. All vehicles shall be equipped to provide the service required in this type of work.
- d. Vehicles should be based in close proximity to the City of Pompano Beach to respond to the various requests of the City in the time prescribed for the various situations.
- e. The company must have a minimum of two (2) vehicles available to respond within ten (10) minutes to an emergency scene, and a response time of no more than thirty (30) minutes for non-emergency calls, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis to assist the City's Police or Fire Departments.
- f. The list of equipment submitted with the Proposal shall also include a description of all types of extraction equipment available to be used under this RFP to include the availability of low-pressure air bags or equivalent type of equipment for use in handling propane or flammable liquid tanker trucks, etc.

g. The company shall equip all vehicles with equipment needed to "clean" a scene of an accident as prescribed by State statute.

### 4. Storage Facility

- a. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to maintain on office, answering service or other type facility to receive telephone communications 24 hours per day, seven days per week, for immediate dispatch to location(s) as directed. The Contractor will maintain telephone communications 24 hours a day to answer calls from the City's Police Department, and public.
- b. The home storage yard shall contain, at a minimum, the following:
  - 1. The Contractor shall provide an outside storage area that holds a minimum of two hundred (200) vehicles, properly spaced to provide access and removal of vehicles. The outside storage area will have lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of 150 feet. The storage facility must be protected by an alarm system or guard dog, with a solid wall or substantial wire fence not less than six (6) feet in height. The fence shall screen the enclosed area from public view, the storage area fully illuminated, and barriers shall be affixed to the top of the fence to discourage access over the top.
  - 2. The Contractor shall provide a minimum of six (6) enclosed, secured storage units, capable of storing a minimum of three (3) vehicles each inside as well as property of evidentiary value for law enforcement purposes only. The inside storage units will have lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of 150 feet and will be weatherproof. The Contractor shall provide a minimum of one (1) storage unit with a hydraulic lift to permit inspection of underside of vehicles. The inside storage units shall have paved floors, i.e., concrete or asphalt, free of dirt, standing water or vegetation. The work area must be a minimum of 8' x 20' per vehicle with at least an 81" ceiling. Each inside storage unit must have an electrical and lighting source sufficient to allow for the processing of a vehicle.
  - 3. The Contractor does have the right to sub-contract with another storage facility to meet short-term demands due to an overflow of vehicles only. The sub-contracted yard must be approved by the City and must meet the requirements for a storage facility as indicated within this agreement. The storage compound shall be owned or leased by the Contractor. Such garage and storage facilities shall be capable of storing all vehicles towed by the company until these vehicles are lawfully reclaimed from the company or legally disposed of.

- c. The Contractor shall be responsible for all inventoried property at the moment the company's tow vehicle is attached to the "vehicle to be towed".
- d. Any area within the facility that is designated a police storage lot, will have the appropriate security fencing and will have working electronic surveillance system. The City's Police Department will conduct, at a minimum, annual CPTED (Crime Prevention through Environmental Design) security assessments. The Contractor will make every effort to complete any recommendation from the completed assessment.
- c. The Contractor shall be responsible for all vehicles and inventoried property therein while said vehicles are stored in the company storage facility and shall be prepared to release any vehicle between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The Contractor further agrees to provide on-call personnel to release vehicles between 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. and on Sunday.
- f. The Contractor shall allow members of the City's Police Department to inspect its storage facility and the vehicles stored therein without previous notice.
- g. Owners of towed vehicles must be granted access to their vehicles in the storage compound during normal business hours. Access is limited to any lawful purpose including but not limited to inspection for insurance purposes. There shall be no charge attached to this access.

The successful proposer (Contractor) shall pay the City a fee of at least \$50,000.00 annually, payable in advance in equal monthly installments. Monthly payments shall be payable on the first day of each calendar month until the termination of the contract. ### 10. Towing / Wrecker / Storage Charges to Public

A complete rate schedule must accompany this proposal (See Attachment A). The rates are those to be charged to the public and must be comprehensive and all-inclusive, containing rate charges for all types of towing, vehicle storage, additional equipment (dollies, etc.), and labor charges. Additional charges for trucks and unusual equipment shall be assessed only in accordance with a schedule of rates on file with the City's Police Department and approved by the City prior to posting.

The Contractor may not charge an additional fee ("franchise fee", etc.) directly to the consumer.

A copy of the rate schedule for services provided by the company under this RFP shall be posted for the length of the resulting contract in their home office, storage yard, etc. A copy should also be available in all units responding to calls from the City's Police Department. The City shall not be responsible for the collection of any charges from the public. Collection is the sole responsibility of the company.

These rates will be firm for the initial five (5) year period of the contract. Rates proposed are a factor in the Evaluation Criteria for this solicitation.

A request for tow rate adjustment by the Contractor must be made in writing to the City Manager ninety (90) days in advance of the contract renewal date. A request for an increased towing rate will also affect the fee paid to the City in an equal percentage increase.

When a vehicle is classified by the City's Police Department as "evidence" and a hold is placed on the vehicle, the provisions of section 323.001, Florida Statutes shall be applicable. However, having received consideration under the agreement with City, the selected contractor shall agree not to seek nor pursue collection of accrued towing and storage charges incurred pursuant to section 323.001(2)(b), Florida Statutes, from the City's Police Department per the statute, or from the City.

### 11. Bonding Requirement

Before commencing operations under a contract based on this RFP, the successful proposer (Contractor) shall furnish the City of Pompano Beach a Performance Bond for the life of the contract in the amount of \$50,000.00, payable to the City of Pompano Beach should the company fail to perform as stipulated in this RFP and resulting agreement.

All bonds shall be in such form and executed by such sureties as are named in the current list of "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as acceptable Reinsuring Companies" as published in Circular 570 (amended) by the Financial Management Service, Surety Bond Branch, U.S. Department of the Treasury. All Bonds signed by an agent must be accompanied by a certified copy of such agent's authority to act.

The Performance Bond shall be obtained from surety or insurance companies that are duly licensed or authorized in the State of Florida.

The Performance Bond must contain a provision for notification to the City sixty (60) days in advance of bond cancellation.

The successful proposer (company) shall furnish to the City the required bond within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract.

All Proposers must include in their Proposal a letter from the surety company that would issue the Performance Bond, verifying that the firm is eligible to obtain the bond required herein.

In lieu of a Bond, the City would accept a cash deposit of \$50,000 to be held during the contract term to ensure performance as stated above. If the Proposer anticipates providing the City with cash in lieu of a bond, they must provide satisfactory evidence to the City that the firm has such cash available for this use.

### 12. Hold Harmless and Indemnification

Proposer covenants and agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless the City and the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, and all of their officers, agents, and employees from any claim, loss, damage, cost, charge or expense arising out of any act, action, neglect or omission by the Proposer, whether direct or indirect, or whether to any person or property to which the City or said parties may be subject, except that neither the Proposer nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of the City or the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, or any of their officers, agents or employees

### 13. Insurance

The insurance described herein reflects the insurance requirements deemed necessary for this contract by the City. It is not necessary to have this level of insurance in effect at the time of submittal, but certificates indicating that the insurance is currently carried or a letter from the Carrier indicating upgrade ability will speed the review process to determine the most qualified Proposer.

The successful Proposer(s) shall not commence operations until certification or proof of insurance, detailing terms and provisions of coverage, has been received and approved by the City of Pompano Beach Risk Manager. The following insurance coverage shall be required.

a Worker's Compensation Insurance covering all employees and providing benefits as required by Florida Statute, Chapter 440, regardless of the size of the company (number of employees). The Contractor further agrees to be responsible for employment, control and conduct of its employees and for any injury sustained by such employees in the course of their employment.

### b. Liability Insurance

- Naming the City of Pompano Beach as an additional insured, on General Liability Insurance only, in connection with work being done under this contract.
- Such Liability insurance shall include the following checked types of insurance and indicated minimum policy limits.

The certification or proof of insurance must contain a provision for notification to the City, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider if applicable, thirty (30) days in advance of any material change in coverage or cancellation.

The successful Proposer shall furnish to the City the certification or proof of insurance required by the provisions set forth above, within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract.

### 14. Retention of Records and Right to Access

The selected firm shall maintain during the term of the contract all books of account, receipt invoices, reports and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices and standards. The form of all records and reports shall be subject to the approval of the City's Internal Auditor. The selected firm must comply with recommendation for changes, additions, or deletions by the City's Internal Auditor. The City's Internal Auditor must be permitted during normal business hours to audit and examine the books of account, reports, and records relating to this contract. The selected firm shall maintain and make available such records and files for the duration of the contract and retain them beyond the last day of the contract term for the period of three (3) years following contract expiration.

### 15. Communications

No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed by the firm because of any discussions with any City employee. Only those communications, which are in writing from the City, may be considered as a duly authorized expression on behalf of the City. In addition, only communications from firms that are signed and in writing will be recognized by the City as duly authorized expressions on behalf of firms.

### 16. No Discrimination

There shall be no discrimination as to race, sex, color, creed, or national origin in the operations conducted under this contract.

### 17. Independent Contractor

The selected firm shall be deemed an independent Contractor for all purposes, and the employees of the Contractor or any of its contractors, subcontractors and the employees thereof, shall not in any manner be deemed to be employees of City. As such, the employees of the Contractor, its Contractors or subcontractors, shall not be subject to any withholding for tax, social security or other purposes by City, nor shall such Contractor, subcontractor, or employee be entitled to sick leave, pension benefits, vacation, medical benefits, life insurance, workers, unemployment compensation, or the like from City.

### 18. Staff Assignment

The City of Pompano Beach reserves the right to approve or reject, for any reasons, Proposer's staff assigned to this project at any time. Background checks may be required.

### 19. Contract Terms

The contract shall include, but not be limited to the following terms:

The contract shall include as a minimum, the entirety of this RFP document, together with the successful Proposer's proposal. Contract shall be prepared by the City of Pompano Beach City Attorney.

If the City of Pompano Beach, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, defends any claim, demand, cause of action, or lawsuit arising out of any act, action, negligent acts or negligent omissions, or willful misconduct of the contractor, its employees, agents or servants during the performance of the contract, whether directly or indirectly, contractor agrees to reimburse the City of Pompano Beach, and the City's contracted law enforcement provider if applicable, for all expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs incurred in defending such claim, cause of action or lawsuit.

### 20. Waiver

It is agreed that no waiver or modification of this contract or of any covenant, condition or limitation contained in it shall be valid unless it is in writing and duly executed by the party to be charged with it, and that no evidence of any waiver or modification shall be offered or received in evidence in any proceeding, arbitration, or litigation between the parties arising out of or affecting this contract, or the right or obligations of any party under it, unless such waiver or modification is in writing, duly executed as above. The parties agree that the provisions of this paragraph may not be waived except by a duly executed writing.

### 21. Survivorship Rights

This contract shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the respective parties and their executors, administrators, heirs, personal representative, successors and assigns.

### 22. Termination

The contract may be terminated by the City of Pompano Beach without cause upon providing contractor with a least sixty (60) days prior written notice.

Should either party fail to perform any of its obligations under this contract for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such failure, the non-defaulting part will have the right to terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of written notice to the defaulting part of its election to do so. The foregoing rights of termination are in addition to any other rights and remedies that such party may have.

### 23. Manner of Performance

Proposer agrees to perform its duties and obligations under this contract in a professional manner and in accordance with all applicable local, federal, and state laws, rules, and regulations.

Initial

Proposer agrees that the services provided under this contract shall be provided by employees that are educated, trained and experienced, certified and licensed in all areas encompassed within their designated duties. Proposer agrees to furnish the City of Pompano Beach with all documentation, certification, authorization, license, permit, or registration currently required by applicable laws or rules and regulations. Proposer further certifies that it and its employees are now in and will maintain good standing with such governmental agencies and that it and its employees will keep all license, permits, registration, authorization or certification required by applicable laws or regulations in full force and effect during the term of this contract. Failure of proposer to comply with this paragraph shall constitute a material breach of contract.

### 24. Submission/Format Requirements

### Litigation:

Disclose any litigation within the past 5 years arising out your firm's performance.

### Equipment:

The proposer (company) shall attach a list to their response of all equipment available to be used under this RFP. The list shall include at a minimum the following for each unit: Class, Unit # (if so identified); Model Year; Make and Type; Wrecker Capacity and vehicle condition. List any extraction equipment available for use under this contract.

If the proposer will lease additional equipment to service this contract, the Proposal must include a letter from Proposer's bank, etc., verifying they have access to funds to lease the equipment immediately upon commencement of the contract.

### 26. Addenda

In the event it becomes necessary to revise, change, modify, or cancel this RFP, addenda will be issued to all known recipients of this solicitation.

### 27. Acceptance Period

Proposals submitted in response to this RFP must be valid for a period no less than ninety (90) days from the closing date of this solicitation.

### 28. RFP Conditions and Provisions

The completed and signed proposal (together with all required attachments) must be returned to City on or before the time and date stated herein. All proposers, by submission of a proposal, shall agree to comply with all of the conditions, requirements and instructions of this RFP as stated or implied herein. All proposals and supporting materials submitted will become the property of the City.

Any alteration, erasure, or interlineations by the proposer in this RFP shall constitute cause for rejection. Exceptions or deviations to this proposal may not be added after the submittal date.

All proposers are required to provide all information requested in this RFP. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of the proposal.

The City reserves the right to postpone or cancel this RFP, or reject all proposals, if in its sole discretion it deems it to be in the best interest of the City to do so.

The Committee has the option to use the above criteria for the initial ranking to short-list proposers and to use an ordinal ranking system to score short-listed proposers following presentations (if deemed necessary) with a score of "1" assigned to the short-listed proposer deemed most qualified by the Committee.

Each firm should submit documentation that evidences the firm's capability to provide the services required for the Committee's review for short listing purposes. ### f. Permits

The selected Proposer shall be responsible for obtaining all permits, licenses, certifications, etc., required by federal, state, county, and municipal laws, regulations, codes, and ordinances for the performance of the work required in these specifications and to conform to the requirements of said legislation.

### g. Familiarity With Laws

It is assumed the selected firm(s) will be familiar with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that may affect its services pursuant to this RFP. Ignorance on the part of the firm will in no way relieve the firm from responsibility.

### h. Withdrawal Of Proposals

### i. Composition Of Project Team

Firms are required to commit that the principals and personnel named in the proposal will perform the services throughout the contractual term unless otherwise provided for by way of a negotiated contract or written amendment to same executed by both parties. No diversion or substitution of principals or personnel will be allowed unless a written request that sets forth the qualifications and experience of the proposed replacement(s) is submitted to and approved by the City in writing.

### j. <u>Variances</u>

While the City allows Contractors to take variances to the RFP terms, conditions, and specifications, the material nature, number, and extent of variances taken will be considered in determining proposal responsiveness and in allocating proposal evaluation points.
