David Miller, 2621 NW 13th Street, Pompano Beach, FL, reiterated that there are so many ideas and stellar

things that can be done at the McNair Park. Therefore, he would recommend that the street signs similar to the ones at Mitchell Moore and Antioch the church, which are colored, to be used for the McNair Park, School, and Library area. In other words, he would like to see the current signs upgraded, which would be a better sign that would reflect what is happening in the Park, Library, and Elementary School.

Finally, Mr. Miller mentioned that he would love to be involved with the final designs for the McNair Park.

Mayor Hardin indicated that with the comments coming forward, it only shows that the work in the City is never finished.

Comr. Floyd asked if the sign mentioned by Mr. Miller earlier was too low.

Mr. Miller responded yes. The sign is approximately 3 feet high, but they could do something a little higher. He reiterated using color for the sign for better visuals.
