



T-43-20 EMERGENCY RENTAL OF TENTS AND CANOPIES

1. City shall contact Contractor for a quote for each event to include a full scope of work, including, but not limited to: labor, permits, insurance, taxes, overhead, profit, and if required engineered drawings as required by the City's Building Department. RFP requires that responders provide an hourly rate for installation services and a square footage rent fee rate.

RESPONSE:

- a. Labor shall be included in tent rental rate.
- b. Additional labor that may be required due to size of order, or rush conditions etc. shall be additionally included at \$25 per man, per hour.
- c. Insurance cost included in rental fee unless any specific required coverages incur additional cost. The "added" costs would be added to final invoice.
- d. Engineering drawings, provided by outside independent engineer, may take approximately 3 business days from confirmation of order/tent size.
- e. Engineering Fee's shall be \$350 for each different tent size, and added to invoice.
- f. A permit processing fee of \$350 shall be charged by Elite for each permit required to be filed.
- g. City issued Building Permit Fee's are unknown until permit is issued. These fee's will paid by Elite Tent Company, and added as a reimbursement cost to the invoice.
- h. For all tent structures over 10'x20' in size the square foot price shall be:
 - 1. \$1 per square foot per week (when ordered by the week)
 - 2. **\$2.25 per square foot per month** (when ordered by the month)
 - 3. 10'x10's staked shall be \$125 per week or \$250 per month
 - 4. 10'x20's staked shall be \$200 per week or \$500 per month
- 2. Mobilization and install upon 24 hours of request.

RESPONSE:

- a. Following confirmation of order and site visit (when possible)
- b. If permitting required, this would need to be done simultaneously, as turn around of engineering drawings, and processing by Building Department is not with in the control of Elite Tent Company.
- 3. The City requires, at a minimum, the following equipment:
- a. Area 1: Two (2) Fifty (50) feet long by twenty (20) feet wide frame white tents Water Barrels for stabilization 3 RFP T-43-20

 - 2. Weekly: \$1,000 each or \$2,000 for both
 - 3. Monthly: \$2,250 each or \$4,500 for both
 - 4. Water barrels presuming 1 per leg (subject to engineering approval) shall be invoiced on the initial invoice at \$25 each.

- a. 20'x50' Requires 12 at \$25 = \$300 or \$600 for (2) tents
- b. City of Pompano to provide water to fill barrels.

b. Area 2: One (1) One hundred and sixty (160) feet long by thirty (30) feet wide frame white tents Water Barrels for stabilization Ten (10) foot upright legs to increase height

- b. 30' x 160' Frame Tents w/ White Top and 10' Uprights
 - 5. Estimated Installation time 6-8 hours
 - 6. Weekly: \$4,800
 - 7. Monthly: \$10,800
 - 8. Water barrels presuming 1 per leg (subject to engineering approval) shall be invoiced on the initial invoice at \$25 each.
 - c. 30'x160' Requires 38 at \$25 = \$300 or \$950
 - d. City of Pompano to provide water to fill barrels.
- c. Area 3: Miscellaneous: i. Ten (10) feet long by ten (10) feet wide frame white tents ii. Tent Siding, it requested iii. Air conditioning hook up, if requested iv. Fire Extinguishers with No Smoking Sign, in accordance to Fire Prevention Code v. Round Trip Transportation Fee vi. Fee for dismantle and install due to upcoming storm preparation
 - 1. 10'x10's staked shall be \$125 per week or \$250 per month
 - a. 40' Solid Sidewall \$80 per week or \$120 for 1st month
 - 2. 10'x20's staked shall be \$200 per week or \$500 per month
 - a. 60' Solid Sidewall \$120 per week or \$180 for 1st month
 - 3. AC Unit (City to Provide Power) for 10x10 or 10x20 \$285 per week or \$600 per month.
 - 4. 5lb. ABC Tagged Fire Extinguisher \$35 ea, (including No Smoking Sign) first invoice only.
 - 5. Standard Delivery during regular hours for the 20x50's or 30'x160's would be \$200. For after hours or weekend additional fees may apply.
 - 6. In event of storm a fee of \$1 p/s/f + \$200 RT Delivery to dismantle and reinstall.
- 4. All tents and canopies must be composed of flame-resistant material.

RESPONSE: All tents & sidewall have a flame certificate and are made from flame-resistant material.

5. During an Event occurrence, there may be a need for the City of Pompano Beach to access your business for products and/or services after normal business hours and/or holidays.
