Oasis Restoration Project



Located at the Pompano Beach Oasis Reuse Water Utilities.

A full restoration was completed under the artist's warranty for *Oasis*, by Cecilia Lueaza. This sculpture was completed to promote the City's Oasis Reuse Water Utilities Program. It was originally installed in 2019.



Art in the Alley

Located in Artists Alley on the exterior wall of the 135 NE 1st Ave,

Art in the Alley by Cynthia Trezona is a mural consisting of hand-made tiles. It was originally installed in 2019. The mural was power washed and the frame was painted as part of annual maintenance.





Art in the Alley



Located at the Pompano Beach Cultural Center, *Current by Michael Szabo was installed in 2020.* The sculpture received a patina painting and full waxing and in 2022.



Music Leads the Way





Located at the Pompano Beach Amphitheater, this project is part of the Mosaic Team Term 1 Program and is entitled *Music Leads the Way* created by Lead Artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene. It was originally installed in 2018. The mosaics were power washed and touched up as part of maintenance.





We Go Together



Located at the Pompano Beach Cultural Center South Entrance, *We Go Together by* Gillie and Marc Schattner was originally installed 2019. The sculpture was power washed and re-waxed as part of maintenance.



Unbroken Spine. The Tale of American Heroism



Located at Founders Park, the

9-11 Memorial created by Cherie Saleeby, which contains a fragment from the Twin Towers, was originally installed in 2019. The sculpture received minor touchups by the artist under warranty as part of maintenance.



Beautiful Day in the Garden





Located at the Patricia Davis Community Garden,

Beautiful Day in the Garden by Steven Lutz was originally installed 2020.

The benches were power washed as part of annual maintenance.



Family Roots Restoration Project



Located at the E. Pat Larkins Community Center. Family Roots By George Gadson received a full restoration.



WOW



Located in the Palm Aire Gazebo and part of the Mosaic Team Term 1 Program, WOW by Lead Artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene was originally installed in 2021.

The floor mosaic mural was power washed and missing tiles were replaced by the artist under warranty as part of maintenance.



Trail of the Honey Bees



Located in the Innovation District and part of the Mosaic Team Term 1 Program, *Trail of the Honey Bees* by Lead Artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene consists of 35 Mosaics ranging in Size. Originally installed in 2018. The mosaics were power washed and touched up as part of maintenance.

FY2023 PROPOSED ANNUAL PLAN PROJECTS

Community Park Sculpture on Federal Highway (\$150,000) (District 3): A major outdoor sculpture to be located in Community Park on Federal Highway. Two possible locations have been proposed in the Master Plan. The City will use \$5,000 from the budget to shortlist artists to create mockups that will be used in the final selection process. Selected artist is responsible for the design, fabrication, and installation of the artwork.

Mosaic Team Term 3 (\$125,000) (District 4) (In Progress): The Mosaic Team is a multi-year program that consists of mosaic artworks created and installed by five (5) apprentices, under the leadership of a lead artist. Sonata Kazimieraiteine has been recommended by the Public Art Committee as the lead artist for the program. Kazimieraiteine has completed Term 1 and Term 2 of the Mosaic Team Program. Kazimieraiteine's Agreement will go before the City Commission December 2022. If approved, she will be responsible to pay the apprentices \$3,000.00 each for a total of \$15,000.00 each year. Once the City has entered into an Agreement with the Kazimieraiteine, she and the apprentices will develop mosaics for representing the gateway into the Innovation District on the front and back of the overpass columns under I-95 over MLK Blvd. The artist and team will have two (2) years to complete the project and will tentatively be completed in FY 2025. Due to size of the project and the amount of columns, twenty-six (26) total columns measuring 137.5 inches in diameter and are 12 feet tall, additional funding of \$58,332.00 is being recommended and requested by the Public Art Committee.





Opportunity/Contingency Projects (\$10,000): The Public Art Committee sets aside funding to be able to take advantage of unknown opportunities throughout the year. As stated in the Master Plan, this is flexible money for new project ideas. This money could also be used as a small contingency for unknown expenses associated with other projects. All purchasing thresholds and building requirements will be met. Staff can take recommendations to the City Commission if it is deemed appropriate. Anything that would otherwise need Commission approval will be taken to the City Commission. Any Opportunity/Contingency Projects will be reported in the next FY 2024 Annual Plan.
