in 2015. These fires resulted in 501,500 structural fires causing 2,685 civilian fire fatalities and an estimated \$1.8 billion in property

loss; and

WHEREAS: the City of Pompano Beach is committed to ensuring the safety

and security of all those living in and visiting our city; and

WHEREAS: fires can take lives, devastate communities, and destroy our

homes and businesses. They pose a threat to Americans across

our Nation; and

WHEREAS: working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires

in half; and

WHEREAS: three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in properties

without working smoke alarms; and

WHEREAS: when smoke alarms should have operated but did not do so, it

was usually because batteries were missing, disconnected, or

dead; and

WHEREAS: Pompano Beach residents should install smoke alarms in every

sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every

level of the home; and

WHEREAS: residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape

plan are more prepared and will therefore be more likely to survive

a fire; and

WHEREAS: the City of Pompano Beach's first responders are dedicated to

reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries

through prevention and protection education; and

WHEREAS: the 2016 Fire Prevention Week (October 9-15, 2016) theme,

"Don't Wait: Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10

Years" effectively serves to remind us that we need working

smoke alarms to give us time to get out safely.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Lamar Fisher, Mayor of the City of Pompano Beach, do hereby proclaim October as Fire Prevention Month throughout this City. I urge all the people of Pompano Beach to check their smoke alarms at least every month by pushing the test button, and to support the many public safety activities and efforts of Pompano Beach Fire Rescue during Fire Prevention Week 2016.
