SUBJECT: Hauling Contract  
DATE: 8 December 2021 – Updated 5 January 2022



At the October 12<sup>th</sup> 2021 Commission Meeting, the commission approved the ranking order for the RFP and authorized City staff to negotiate a contract with the highest ranked company, Coastal Waste and Recycling, Inc. Even though Coastal proposed a \$29.89 monthly household residential rate, staff was able to negotiate the rate to \$24.98 (Note: Current household residential rate is \$20.37) per month. Please be advised that the rate is subject to an annual price change, per the contract.

The contract also provides for; annual scholarship commitment of \$10,000; annual environmental art commitment of \$5,000; 100 portable toilets a year for City events; annual emergency assistance to Pompano Beach residents of \$25,000; and annual environmental school club commitment: \$5,000.

The Solid Waste Services department is proposing executing the contract with Coastal Waste & Recycling for hauling services, commencing October 1<sup>st</sup> 2022. The current contract with Waste Management expires September 30<sup>th</sup> 2022. The proposed contract will allow for up to four additional five (5) year term extensions.

### UPDATE

There were three amendments/corrections to the contract from the first to the second reading. They are minor in nature and are listed below:

Page 9... Article 2. TERM... Section 2.2

*The term of this Agreement shall be a five (5) year contract with the option for the parties to renew for up to an additional two (2), ten (10) year terms, with mutual agreement between parties. All contract renewal options shall occur by amendment with City Commission Approval. A notice of 18 months must be given in writing if Franchise Collector does not wish to renew this agreement and/or under the current terms.*

This amendment will require the contract to go before the City Commission for renewal; and removes the obligation for the City to provide to the hauler an 18 month notice not to renew this agreement.

Page 43... Section 19.8

First sentence: *This Agreement may be terminated pursuant to Article 17.4.4...* corrected to 17.3.4
