AREAWIDE COUNCIL ON AGING OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: Fair Share 2026: \$25,000 to help administer the Aging & Disability Resource Center (ADRC), which is the prime planning, coordinating, and funding source for our network of more than 40 service providers.

BIG BROTHERS/BIG SISTERS OF BROWARD, INC.: Big Futures: \$10,000 to guide eighth-to-12th graders to graduating high school and moving on to college, job placements or trade programs.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: College and Career Readiness: \$10,000 to equip youth with the skills and knowledge necessary to achieve their full potential in higher education and rewarding careers.

BROWARD EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC.: Broward Education Foundation School Supply Center: \$20,000 to provide free school supplies to teachers from 19 Title I schools within the City of Pompano Beach-part of Broward County Public Schools.

BROWARD MOMS INCORPORATED: Diaper Bank Program: \$5,000 to support our Diaper Bank Program which provides free diapers for babies and toddlers, period products for women, and incontinence supplies for seniors in need through community distribution events and partnerships with 30+ local social service agencies.

BROWARD PARTNERSHIP FOR THE HOMELESS, INC.: North Homeless Assistance Center Workforce Development Program: \$15,000 to sustainably employ people experiencing homelessness as quickly as possible.

BROWARD PERFORMING ARTS FOUNDATION, INC.: Student Enrichment through the Arts (SEAS): \$15,000 to support the Student Enrichment through the Arts (SEAS) program for the 2025-2026 academic year, which will benefit a minimum of 3,000 K-12 public school students in the City of Pompano Beach and increase their potential for success in school, the workforce and in life through cultural arts enrichment activities that take place in both the theater and the classroom.

BROWN'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CENTER, INC.: 11th Annual Collier City Family Fun Day: \$5,000 to produce an event that brings families and the community together and improve the quality of life. This event consists of free nutritional groceries, free shoes and backpack and school supplies, free haircuts, health and wellness screening, job and career opportunities, number exhibitors with resources.

COVENANT HOUSE FLORIDA, INC.: Workforce Development for Youth Experiencing Homelessness: \$10,000 to equip youth with the essential skills and knowledge to thrive in the workforce and build sustainable earning potential.

CROCKETT FOUNDATION INC.: Community Wellness Fair: \$10,000 to host an annual community health fair to help local children and families across Pompano Beach prepare for the new academic school year.

EARLY LEARNING COALITION OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: School Readiness Match Program: \$15,000 to provide financial assistance to more Broward Residents at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

FEEDING SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: Mobile FARMacy: \$10,000 to support the Mobile FARMacy, a one-aisle grocery store on wheels designed to increase access to fresh, nutritious food for communities facing food insecurity, with a focused emphasis on low-income seniors in underserved areas like the City of Pompano Beach.

FIRST CALL FOR HELP OF BROWARD, INC.: 211 Broward Helpline and 988 Crisis Line: \$30,000 to provide residents in need with free, confidential support via phone, text, chat, and email to residents of Pompano Beach and beyond.

FORT LAUDERDALE INDEPENDENCE TRAINING & EDUCATION CENTER, INC.: Youth take FLITE in Pompano Beach: \$5,000 to help develop youth in the areas of education, employment, housing, health, and economic self-sufficiency. Programming not only provides support with general education development, post-secondary planning, job readiness and life skills development, but also helps to build youth's interpersonal, prosocial, and leadership capacity through social emotional learning, peer coaching and advocacy.

FRIENDS OF THE NORTHWEST BRANCH OF POMPANO BEACH, INC: Blues & Sweet Potato Pie Festival: A Juneteenth Celebration: \$3,000 to assist with continued operation of the long standing community event, the Annual Blues and Sweet Potato Pie Festival that takes place in the month of June each year called Juneteenth as one of the oldest known celebrations commemorating the end to slavery in the United States and has been an African American tradition since the 19th century.

HEAL THE PLANET TOGETHER, INC.: Heal The Planet's SEED Program: \$5,000 to teach children in Broward County's Title 1 Schools about the power of choice and worthiness through the topics of mindfulness, nutrition, sustainability, and physical exercise.

HEALING ARTS INSTITUTE OF SOUTH FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL INC: Youth Resilience Workshop Series: \$7,500 to address the rising mental health and behavioral challenges facing youth in the City of Pompano Beach.

HELPING ADVANCE AND NURTURE THE DEVELOPMENT OF YOUTH, INC.: Handy YouthForce: \$15,000 to deliver high-impact, year-round support to middle school students at Pompano Beach Middle School. Designed to build both academic and workforce readiness, the program combines daily afterschool tutoring, mentoring, life skills training, and social-emotional development in a consistent, structured setting.

HILLSBORO LIGHTHOUSE PRESERVATION SOCIETY, INC.: Hillsboro Lighthouse Annual Gala Event: \$5,000 to support the Annual Gala which serves as both a celebration of the Hillsboro Lighthouse and also a critical fund raising event providing us with financial resources needed to execute various maintenance and preservation activities.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: JA BizTown/JA Finance Park: \$25,000 to support a fully interactive, true-to-life, simulated town experience, following up to 16 hours of in-class curriculum, where students work and live as citizens and employees of JA BizTown, while utilizing their newly

learned soft skills necessary for successful participation in the world of work. Students run the various eighteen businesses, earn paychecks, open/manage bank accounts, take out and repay business loans, vote, price and advertise goods and services for sale, and more.

NAMASTE A GRAND INDIAN ART AND FOOD FESTIVAL, CORPORATION: Namaste!: \$7,500 to help produce Namaste!, a free outdoor cultural extravaganza, promises an immersive experience featuring curated Indian music, dance, culinary delights, and a myriad of other captivating art forms.

OUR FATHER'S HOUSE SOUP KITCHEN, INC.: Our Father's House Bike Academy: \$5,000 to provide vocational development and transportation for homeless and low-income volunteers of OFH. We acquire bicycles that have been abandoned or donated through Broward Sheriff's Office, local condominiums, and faith-based organizations. Then, homeless and LMI individuals can volunteer in our Bike Academy to learn how to fix bicycles.

SERVING WITH GRACE, INC.: Adopt a School Program: \$7,000 to support an Adopt-a-School program, a targeted initiative that focuses on Title I elementary schools in Broward County. The program assists students with classroom essentials and supplies, thereby playing a crucial role in combating poverty.

SOUTHEAST POLICE MOTORCYCLE RODEO COMMITTEE I, INC.: 37th Annual Southeast Police Motorcycle Rodeo: \$5,000 to help support the 37th Anniversary Police Motorcycle Skills Rodeo on April 25, 2026. This event is designed to help motorcycle law enforcement officers from across the United States enhance their riding skills and improve safety while operating in the line of duty.

TAKE STOCK IN CHILDREN OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: Project FLIGHT: \$5,000 to provide low-income, at-risk students from the City of Pompano Beach with comprehensive services starting in middle school, continuing through high school, and including post- secondary retention and completion services.

THE RUSSELL LIFE SKILLS AND READING FOUNDATION, INC.: Russell Reading Foundation STEAM Program: \$10,000 to serve at least 100 elementary students from low-income families in Pompano Beach during the 2025-26 school year. Students will rotate through age-appropriate modules in coding, robotics, music (in partnership with Volta Music Foundation), and science experiments (in partnership with MAD Science), reinforcing reading and math skills while igniting curiosity and collaboration.

UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY OF POMPANO BEACH, INC.: Unity in the Community Family Fun Day: \$5,000 to support a Family Fun Day designed to provide the city with a day of unity filled with fun, free food, free entertainment to all who attend with a major focus on the residents and visitors in Pompano Beach. The event will also host a charity auction with gifts and prizes to support Unity's scholarship program for high school students that reside in the city.

URBAN LEAGUE OF BROWARD COUNTY, INCORPORATED: Living Well Chronic Disease Self-Management and Health Literacy Program: \$10,000 to address the high rates of diabetes and chronic disease in the African American and Hispanic communities in Broward County. Living Well serves primarily senior African American and Hispanic low- to moderate-income individuals living in Broward County who have been diagnosed with a chronic disease and/or diabetes, or have been deemed at risk to be diagnosed with a chronic disease and/or diabetes.
