AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING ARTICLE XXV, SECTIONS 250, 251 AND 253 TO CHAPTER 57-174, LAWS OF FLORIDA SPECIAL ACTS OF 1957 AS SUBSEQUENTLY AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA, TO MODIFY **REQUIREMENTS** AND RESTRICTIONS RELATING TO CONTRACTS AND LEASES AND TO REVISE LANGUAGE TO BE CONSISTENT WITH STATE LAW AS TO USE OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS; TO AMEND CRITERIA FOR TRANSFER OF **CITY-OWNED** PROPERTY TO OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES; PROVIDING THAT IF THE AMENDMENTS ARE APPROVED BY A MAJORITY OF THE VOTERS AT THE GENERAL **ELECTION OF NOVEMBER 5, 2024, THEN SUCH AMENDMENTS** SHALL BECOME A PART OF THE CITY'S CHARTER UPON **CERTIFICATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF ELECTION RESULTS; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**
