Giving the morass of paperwork and requirements to apply for aid, it is understandable that this program would have been developed out of the need of both the service providers and the potential recipients to connect.

In addition, Site Directors (3): The Site Director for each center reports directly to the Director of Programs, acting as a liaison between the teachers and the Director of Programs. There are no alternative funding sources committed to the project; however, application is leveraged 30% which is reflected in the score.

Ratio of additional Directors to Teachers are excessive. Recommend project funding be limited to 3 additional Teachers.

Jean Dolan Notes: This program provides direct services to Pompano kids participating in aftercare at 4 of the City's community centers. I reduced their score under Quality/Cost Effectiveness because there is a 1:1 ratio of Directors to Teachers and the Directors (Administrators) make more money than the teachers that are actually providing the services to the children. The request is for a significantly larger sum than in previous years (2.5 times more money). I'm sure this is an excellent program and helps many of Pompano's kids to improve their reading but I would like to see a more balanced Teacher to Director ratio and more funds going to teachers vs. administrators.

The program, however, has not been struggling to spend the money granted in recent experience.

Pat Larkins and/or Skolnick) or are they happening at the Choices Network System office located on Powerline Road just south of Esquire Lake? The answers to D.1, D.2, D.3 and D.4 should be better prepared to explain the origin of the people being served and where the arts and crafts program is being conducted. Per the Parks and Recreation Staff, arts and crafts are not being offered by the City at E. Pat Larkins or the Skolnick Centers in Districts 4 and 5, however, they are part of the regular programming at the



Senior Center which is also in District 4. It appears the staff to conduct this program would be new hires so it isn't certain that they have a history of success administering these activities.

Jean Dolan Notes: This program is unique in that it provides culturally appropriate food directly to Seniors. The 72.5% of the funding requested is for the food boxes (estimate of 330 boxes) so very little is going for staff and transportation expenses and the rest goes for direct food assistance to seniors and their families. During COVID, the City managed and staffed distribution points for the Feeding South Florida food boxes and the program was impressive and helped many during that difficult year. The CDBG funding requested is only 15.8% of the total program budget so the service is well leveraged.

Though not many people will be helped, no one is helped when small amounts of money are allocated to homeless people when it's not enough to result in achieving housing. Many people have been granted vouchers only to find that no landlords will accept that voucher and the person remains homeless. Significant funds are necessary per person to get a person into housing so committing to providing adequate funds per person to actually make a difference that can become permanent is a unique and valuable approach to ending homelessness to those most likely to succeed after the massive cash outlay to get into a decent apartment is provided.
