SUBJECT: Interlocal Agreement with Broward County for Shared Resource Burdens and Technical Activities required under the systemwide MS4 Permit

Purpose

To obtain City Commission approval authorizing the execution of the Interlocal Agreement (ILA) among Broward County, the City of Pompano Beach, and other Broward County municipalities. The ILA provides for the sharing of resources and technical responsibilities associated with compliance under the system-wide National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit.

Background

The City of Pompano Beach is one of twenty-six (26) co-permittees under the Broward County NPDES stormwater permit (Permit No. FLS000016-004). This permit is administered by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) and Broward County, which serves as the lead permittee.

Under the Interlocal Agreement (ILA), Broward County provides services to the co-permittees to support compliance with permit requirements. These services include implementing stormwater management programs (Part III.A), conducting monitoring activities (Part V), and complying with stormwater discharge regulations and water quality standards (Part VIII).

The current operating Interlocal Agreement (ILA) was approved by the City of Pompano Beach Commission on July 11, 2017, pursuant to Resolution No. 2017-279, and was fully executed by Broward County on November 7, 2017. The current ILA will terminate upon the Florida Department of Environmental Protection's (FDEP) issuance of the next iteration of the NPDES MS4 permit.

The City shall continue to undertake the actions to assure surface water quality including impacts on the ocean are minimized and all conditions of the City’s National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit are met.

Goal 13 / Objective 13.04.00 - Interlocal Agreements – Pursue and execute interlocal agreements and contracts with other local governments and the County to provide for the most efficient and effective delivery of public services.

Recommendation

Utilities recommends that the City Commission approve and authorize execution of the Interlocal Agreement among Broward County, the City of Pompano Beach, and other Broward County cities to share resource burdens of the system-wide National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit.
