Grants Awarded

District 3

Community Foundation of Broward Grant - Art of Community
Asphalt Art - The Crossroads Connection
Awarded 2020.

The City was awarded the Community Foundation of Broward Grant- Art of Community Grant. The City, who's grant is entitled *Asphalt Art; The Crossroads Connection*, commissioned South Florida artist Bill Savarese to hold community engagement activities that served as inspiration in designing the 12 street art murals. This project involved community volunteers, local artists, and various city departments including the Utilities Department in the production of public art in pedestrian space creating street art on asphalt and storm drains. The storm drains, in particular, focused on the importance of keeping our waterways clean and not littering. Whether called street paintings, sidewalk paintings or asphalt art, street art has the ability to turn ordinary pavement into a canvas. Four large scale asphalt murals are planned to be installed in FY 2023. The project is located along the City Hall/Cultural Center/Library portion of the Pompano Beach Crossroads Corridor. To date, the Crossroads Corridor Project has created a one-mile trail of public art, performance art, "drop-in" activities, and literary events that help connect our residents, businesses and visitors to each other.

Innovation District

Pompano Beach Crossroads
Awarded 2017

The City received a \$100,000 Our Town "creative placemaking" grant from the National Endowments of the Arts (NEA) for a two-year grant period October 2017 – September 2019. *Pompano Beach Crossroads* is a collaborative project of the City and Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA). Projects associated with the Grant are featured in the City's Creative Arts District. Public Art Projects completed associated with this Grant to this date are the *Trail of the Honey Bees*, a *Painted Pompano Round 2* sculpture located at the Cultural Arts Plaza, multiple murals located in Artists Alley, and *We Go Together*.

Public Art Video Series

The Cultural Affairs Department and the Public Art Committee understand the need to adapt with these very unique times. The Department and the Committee have begun a Public Art Video series in order to inform and educate the public. These videos help create awareness as well as provide outreach. The videos also serve as a way to archive the Public Art projects and programs.

Proposed Projects Planned for FY 2023 Descriptions

- Community Park Sculpture on Federal Highway (\$150,000) (District 3): A major outdoor sculpture to be located in Community Park on Federal Highway. Two possible locations have been proposed in the Master Plan. The City will use \$5,000 from the budget to shortlist artists to create mockups that will be used in the final selection process. Selected artist is responsible for the design, fabrication, and installation of the artwork.
- Mosaic Team Term 3 (\$125,000) (District 4) (In Progress): The Mosaic Team is a multi-year program that consists of mosaic artworks created and installed by five (5) apprentices, under the leadership of a lead artist. Sonata Kazimieraiteine has been recommended by the Public Art Committee as the lead artist for the program. Kazimieraiteine has completed Term 1 and Term 2 of the Mosaic Team Program. Kazimieraiteine’s Agreement will go before the City Commission December 2022. If approved, she will be responsible to pay the apprentices \$3,000.00 each for a total of \$15,000.00 each year. Once the City has entered into an Agreement with the Kazimieraiteine, she and the apprentices will develop mosaics for representing the gateway into the Innovation District on the front and back of the overpass columns under I-95 over MLK Blvd. The artist and team will have two (2) years to complete the project and will tentatively be completed in FY 2025. Due to size of the project and the amount of columns, twenty-six (26) total columns measuring 137.5 inches in diameter and are 12 feet tall, additional funding is being requested.
- Opportunity/Contingency Projects (\$10,000): The Public Art Committee sets aside funding to be able to take advantage of unknown opportunities throughout the year. As stated in the Master Plan, this is flexible money for new project ideas. This money could also be used as a small contingency for unknown expenses associated with other projects. All purchasing thresholds and building requirements will be met. Staff can take recommendations to the City Commission if it is deemed appropriate. Anything that would otherwise need Commission approval will be taken to the City Commission. Any Opportunity/Contingency Projects will be reported in the next FY 2024 Annual Plan.

Administration and Maintenance

- Maintenance (\$20,833): 10% of the cost of permanent work will be reserved for maintenance and used as needed.
- Program Management (\$42,000): The Public Art Program has grown to a level that requires an individual dedicated to the management as his/her sole responsibility. A part-time staff employee has been hired to continue to operate this program.
- Operations (\$5,000): This funding is set aside to operate the program. Expenses could be used for areas such as permitting, supplies, printing, administrative expenses, minor project needs, etc.

Rolled Forward Projects Descriptions

- Utility Box Wrap (\$0): The Public Art Committee has completed three (3) phases of the Utility Box Wrap Project. A new utility box has been installed at the intersection of NW 27th Ave. and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard. The Committee will select a Pompano Beach historic photograph to be placed on the box. The Parks and Recreation Department will be funding the installation of the wrap.
- Light Pole Sculpture (\$15,000): The City will commission an artist or artist team to design, fabricate, and install an artistic light pole sculpture to be attached to the existing light pole. A theme has not been selected. The selected artist or artist team is responsible for any required permitting and engineering. Location to be at the northeast corner of N. Flagler Avenue & NE 1st Street.
- Art Installation in Collier City/McNair Park Mural (\$15,000): An artist/artist team will be selected to design and install an artwork in Collier City. The exact location and form of artwork have yet to be decided. Possible artworks include a mural or sculpture. Original location noted in Master Plan: McNair Park Gymnasium Wall. This project has been on hold due to renovations to the Park.
- Modernized Oceanside Sculpture (A.K.A. A1A & Atlantic Boulevard Median Sculpture) (\$30,000): An artist/artist team will be commissioned to design, fabricate and install a free-standing sculpture located at the median of the terminus of Atlantic Blvd (intersection of Atlantic Blvd. and A1A). The sculpture's theme is modernizing the Oceanside sculpture that used to be placed near this location. Any necessary engineering and permitting will be the responsibility of the artist. The Call to Artists has been approved by the Public Art Committee. The Committee is currently looking for a location for the project.

Project Descriptions

- McNair Painted Pompano Sculpture (In Progress): The City Manager's Office requested a Painted Pompano sculpture to be located in the newly renovated McNair Park. The Public Art Committee circulated a Call to Artists with the Bailey Contemporary Arts (BaCA) Artists in Residence (AiR). The artist Deracy Roberts was selected to design and fabricate the sculpture. The sculpture is planned to be installed FY 2023. The budget for the project is \$1,500.00 and funded through the Opportunities Fund.
- Hola Mundo *Trash the Wave* (In Progress): The Public Art Committee was approached by a Pompano Beach summer Camp Hula Mundo to temporarily display an artwork created by their Green Team camp. The artwork is entitled *Trash the Wave* and will be displayed at the beach, 100 Pompano Beach Blvd. for one year. The artwork is completed and is set to be installed before January 2023.
- Underwater Sculpture Park Round 2 (\$40,000) (In Progress): This program takes place every two years until 2026. This will be the second sculpture as part of this program. Artist Tyler FuQua Creations, Inc. has been approved to create a sculpture entitle *Mechan H2O* (Ordinance #2021-91). The artwork itself has a budget of \$35,000 and a \$5,000 budget for installation and other fees concerning installation and documentation. The sculpture is installed on the beach just south of the Fisher Family Pier. It will be submerged into the ocean and attached to *Lady Luck* in Shipwreck Park Summer 2023.
- Domino/Chess Tables (\$10,000) (In Progress): The City has commissioned Kirk Seese to design, fabricate, and install three (3) artistic dominos/chess tables to be placed at the new

Pompano Beach Senior Activity Center. The tables must include chairs. The project is set to be completed in FY 2023.

- Hazel Armbrister Dedication Bust (\$49,400) (In Progress): The City will commission an artist to design and fabricate a bronze bust of the iconic Hazel Armbrister to be placed in the Ali Cultural Arts Courtyard, 353 Dr. Martin Luther King Blvd. The bust must include a pedestal. The Historic Preservation Committee (HPC) will provide wording and contribute funds for a plaque to be placed on the pedestal. An Artist Team has been recommended for the project and set to go before the City Commission for approval FY 2023.
- Artist Old Town Plaza Mural (\$15,000) (In Progress): A mural has entered into an Agreement with artist Carrie Bennet to install a mural located on the back-exterior wall of Benzer Pharmacy and Odd Breed Brewery, located at 60 & 50 NE 1st St. The size of the wall is approximately 130' long by 20' high. The mural will be a significant gateway to downtown. This project was requested by Mayor Hardin and the Benzer Pharmacy property owners. The funding for this project was reallocated from the Fishing Village project. The project will be completed in FY 2023.
- Pompano Pier Mural (\$15,000) (In Progress): The Public Art Committee has entered into an Agreement with Taylor Smith for the design and installation of an ocean themed mural to be placed on the southeast corner of the Pier Parking Garage on the stairwell next to the Pompano Beach Tourism Center. The project will be completed FY 2023.
- Asphalt Art - The Crossroads Connection (\$60,000) (Partially Completed): The City was awarded the Community Foundation of Broward Grant- Art of Community Grant in 2020. The City, who's grant is entitled *Asphalt Art - The Crossroads Connection*, commissioned South Florida artist Bill Savarese to hold community engagement activities that served as inspiration in designing the 12 street art murals. This project involved community volunteers, local artists, and various city departments including the Utilities Department in the production of public art in pedestrian space creating street art on asphalt and storm drains. The eight storm drain murals have been installed. Four large scale asphalt murals are planned to be installed in FY 2023. The project is located along the City Hall/Cultural Center/Library portion of the Pompano Beach Crossroads Corridor.
- Powerline Road Sculpture (Delayed due to COVID-19): An artist/artist team will be commissioned to design, fabricate, and install a free-standing sculpture located on the east side of Powerline Road and McNab Road. This will be an entryway sculpture. Fee includes the creation of proper foundation and exterior lighting. An artist has been recommended by the Committee; however, City Commission approval and the project have been delayed due to Covid-19.
- Blanche Ely High School Mural (Delayed due to COVID-19): At its September 25, 2018, the Commission directed the Public Art Committee to research and commission a mural honoring Melvin Randall, the Blanche Ely Basketball Coach and Broward County Sports Hall of Fame inductee. The Public Art Committee is looking into placing the mural on an exterior wall located at Blanche Ely High School with a theme of the School's mascot the Mighty Tiger, and Coach Randall. The project is currently on hold for further information from the School Board.
- Cultural Center Crosswalk (Paused): This project is currently on hold.

- South Dixie Highway Project (Paused): Originally budgeted for FY2016. This is an ongoing project and is currently on hold.
