

# INCIDENT SUMMARY REPORT

Pompano Beach North West — CRA District, Pompano Beach, FL 33060

Reporting Period: March 1 – 31, 2026

## Overview

This report compiles all incident and patrol activity logged by FPI Security Services officers assigned to the Pompano Beach North West CRA corridor during March 2026. A total of 180 reports were filed — nearly double the volume of the East zone — reflecting the significantly higher activity level and transient population concentration across this district. Coverage spanned the Old Town area, the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard corridor, Fountain Square Park, the Big Fields, and the South Bar / Vault entertainment district.

## Routine Foot Patrols

Officers conducted regular walk-and-talk patrols throughout the corridor, with consistent coverage of:

- South Bar & Kitchen (165 NE 1st Ave)

- The Vault (61 NE 1st Ave / 61 NE First St)
- Fountain Square Park (42 NE First St)
- Old Town area and N Flagler Ave corridor
- 212 NW 10th Ave / Big Fields (patrolled daily by Officer Vega)
- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd corridor

Business contacts at South Bar & Kitchen, The Vault, Chicken Box (204 N Flagler Ave), and Kelly Chemical Cleaning (135 E 1st Ave) all expressed satisfaction with FPI's visibility and service.

## Trespassing Incidents

Trespassing by transient/homeless individuals was the dominant actionable issue for the month, accounting for approximately 50% of all reports. Individuals were found sleeping or sitting at business entrances, church grounds, open fields, and public parks across the district. In nearly all cases, individuals complied voluntarily when verbally contacted.

The MLK Jr. Blvd church corridor (335–713 MLK Jr. Blvd) was the single most active area, with contacts occurring on virtually every patrol day throughout the month. The same individuals appeared to return between shifts, suggesting a persistent encampment presence in this corridor.

March 30 was the busiest single day for trespassing, with 7+ contacts across the MLK corridor, Fountain Park, and the Big Fields during one daytime shift by Officer Burns and Supervisor LeBlanc — including discovery of a tent encampment at 224 NW 7th Ave.

## Loitering Incidents

Approximately 15 loitering incidents were documented at the following locations:

- N Flagler Ave (114, 120 N Flagler) — groups and individuals, primarily evenings and overnight
- The Hive (353 MLK Jr. Blvd) — recurring morning loitering contacts
- 501 MLK Jr. Blvd — groups observed on March 28
- Fountain Park — sleeping individual behind bushes (March 21)

- 114 N Flagler Ave — loitering at night (multiple dates)

All individuals except one complied when approached (see BSO-Assisted Removals below).

## **BSO-ASSISTED REMOVALS — ESCALATED INCIDENTS**

**Two incidents during the month required law enforcement assistance from the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO). These are the only incidents that could not be resolved through officer verbal contact alone:**

- **March 16, ~5:00 AM — 114 N Flagler Ave: Officer Thompson encountered a woman sleeping on the property who refused to leave when approached. BSO was contacted and responded; she was removed from the premises.**
- **March 24, ~1:00 AM — Fountain Square Park (60 NE 1st St): Officer Thompson observed a male moving erratically and screaming. BSO was contacted and removed the individual from the park.**

Both incidents occurred during overnight/early morning hours. This pattern suggests elevated risk during late-night shifts in the North West zone compared to the East zone, where no BSO calls were recorded in March.

## **Disturbance**

---

One disturbance was documented:

- March 27 — Officer Jean observed a female disturbing customers at South Bar & Kitchen (165 NE 1st Ave). She was verbally redirected and agreed to leave.

## **Illegal Dumping / Vandalism**

---

Officer Vega documented recurring trash and illegally dumped items at the 212 NW 10th Ave / Mossie Lee Jackson Ave location on the following dates: March 14, 27, 28, and 29. This site is designated a "prone-to-dumping area" and is monitored regularly. No suspects were identified. The issue persisted throughout the month without resolution, suggesting the need for a formal notification to the CRA and/or code enforcement.

## **Parking Conditions**

---

Overnight parking was monitored at 201 NE 1st Ave throughout the month. Recurring vehicles of note:

- Silver Chevy — Plate RDG-TOE / RDG-TO3: Observed overnight on March 1 and March 8.
- Silver Nissan — Plate HOG-F55: Observed overnight on March 28 (documented in two separate entries).

No enforcement action was taken beyond documentation. If overnight parking continues to be a pattern concern, signage and towing authorization should be considered.

## **Weather-Related Patrol Interruptions**

---

Approximately 10 patrol scans were unable to be completed due to adverse weather (heavy rain). Affected dates:

- March 15 — Multiple officers; afternoon scans aborted
- March 18 — Officer Jean; full-day scan interruption (multiple entries)
- March 20 — Officers Thompson and Jean; early AM and mid-morning

- March 29 — Officers Jean and Vega; morning scans incomplete
- March 30 — Officer Thompson; early AM unable to scan

## Key Findings & Recommendations

---

- **This zone carries significantly higher activity than the East corridor — 180 reports vs. ~100. Staffing levels and patrol frequency should be evaluated accordingly.**
- **The MLK Jr. Blvd church corridor requires daily dedicated attention. The same individuals are returning between shifts; coordination with local outreach services or BSO may be warranted for repeat subjects.**
- **Two BSO calls occurred during overnight hours — both handled by Officer Thompson. Night shift protocols and escalation criteria should be reviewed for this zone.**
- **Illegal dumping at 212 NW 10th Ave is a persistent, unresolved issue. A formal notification to the CRA and/or Pompano Beach Code Enforcement is recommended.**
- **The tent encampment discovered on March 30 (224 NW 7th Ave) represents a potential escalation from sleeping individuals to established encampments. Monitoring frequency for this location should be increased.**
- **No thefts, assaults, or weapons-related incidents were logged for the month.**
