10/13/18	11 am – 3 pm	Venetian Carnival Masks Workshop	This four-hour workshop will introduce students to mask decoration following Venetian Carnival style. The class includes all materials and no experience is necessary. Space available for 12 students. Ages 16+
10/20/18	11 am – 1 pm (this workshop is shorter)	Paper Making Workshop	<p>Participants will get a brief introduction to paper-making, followed by instructor artist talk displaying books with handmade paper, illustrations and printmaking done on handmade paper, my paper relief sculptures, and paper casting sculptures; and a paper-making demo. Each participant will make six sheets of paper and one envelope, they will also keep the seven couch sheets that they will use to transfer and dry the paper which tends to have a "mono-print" like effect once the paper is dried and removed. Students of all levels of experience are welcomed. Open to all ages (Instructor will provide copy of background level II to be able to teach to minors).</p> <p>Shawna Molton was born in the Bahamas and raised in Jamaica and America. I moved to Florida two years ago after finishing my BFA at the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (sculpture major and I worked in the Museum Education department). Now I work in Education at the Young At Art Museum, developing and teaching art classes to schools around Broward County and assisting special guest artist with their lectures and workshops. I also conduct independent art workshops around South Florida.</p>

MUCE presents its annual exhibition "As a Matter of Black, a Seat at the Table." This show is a collective of three visual artists that explores the table as a constant to discuss a seat at the table in the context of family, food, policy and celebration of the Black life experience. Three artists bring the concept to life through visual painting, sculpture, and storytelling. A table installation is included as part of the exhibit and utilized as an interactive art piece during the opening reception. Opening ceremony (Jan 4, 2019) includes dinner reception from local Pompano chef, which includes Q&A with visual artists and Chef to discuss what a seat at the table looks like intergenerationally.
