Choices Network Systems, Inc serves as the parent company of Choices Children and Families Consortium which is a foster care management agency with locations in Dade County. Choices has three homes for adults/or children transitioning out of the system of care. These homes are in Pompano Beach, Florida. He is also the founder of Choices Community Development Organization a multiple housing entity for low-income families.

He is currently focused on providing alternative education opportunities to those youth who have chosen a SACS Accredited High School Diploma instead of a GED. Through Choices Virtual High School Diploma Program, children who have not been successful in a mainstream public school can effectively reach their educational goals. Choices Virtual High School Diploma Program is in Pompano Beach and Atlanta, Georgia. There are plans to bring this educational initiative to Dade and Palm Beach County as well. Rev. Howard works closely with BSO of Pompano Beach by providing Drug Prevention and Intervention Programs to at-risk youths.
