Mosaic Team

Mosaic Team started in 2016 with Lead Artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene.

Since then, 2 Terms have been completed, both with Kazimieraitiene as the Lead Artist.

A total of 5 art projects have been installed, consisting of 140 total mosaics.

This will be Term 3 of the Program.

Term 3 consists of covering 27 columns, 137.5 inches in diameter and 12 feet tall, with artwork incorporating mosaics.

5 apprentices will be selected to learn the mosaic and public art craft. Kazimieraitiene will pay her apprentices a total of \$15,000.00. Program will be for 2 years.



















Mosaic Team Term 1: Community




Mosaic Team Term 1: WOW

This mosaic is 10 foot in diameter and located at the Palm Airegazebo on the northeast corner West Palm Aire Drive and Oaks Drive.




Mosaic Team Term 2: Sea Life
