AREAWIDE COUNCIL ON AGING OF BROWARD COUNTY,INC.: Fair Share 2023: \$50,000 to prevent or delay premature institutionalization of elders.

ASHANTI CULTURAL ARTS & ENRICHMENT, INC.: Turn Around Arts: \$10,000 to give children an opportunity to improve their academic and life skills through the Arts.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: College and Career Readiness: \$10,000 to progress critical employment skills among youth through research-informed youth development practices, training and experiential learning opportunities. Teens, who learn interview skills, dress for success tips and more, become employable individuals. Most earn their first jobs, and all begin planning their career paths.

BROWARD EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC.: Broward Education Foundation School Supply Center: \$15,000 to provide school supplies to the City of Pompano Beach high-need students.

BROWARD PERFORMING ARTS FOUNDATION, INC.: Student Enrichment through the Arts: \$15,000 to provide high-quality, professionally produced performances at the Broward Center or the Parker that reinforce reading, math and science skills, bring historical events to life and immerse students in the art forms and traditions of different cultures. All SEAS presentations are directly aligned with Florida state standards and classroom curriculum, with an emphasis on literacy.

BROWN'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CENTER, INC.: 7th Annual Collier City Family Fun Day: \$3,000 for an event the brings families and community partners together. This event consists of free food distribution, backpack give-a-ways, health and wellness screenings, job and career fair, numerous exhibitors, free haircuts for the children, games for and activities for children. Also, live entertainment in which consist of cultural music for all ethnic groups to enjoy and learn each other cultures.

COVENANT HOUSE FLORIDA, INC.: Workforce Development Program: \$5,000 to help disadvantaged and at-risk youth from Pompano Beach transition into full-time work. YES helps youth ages 16-21 develop skills by engaging them over time with robust learning experiences. The program incorporates career path assessments, job readiness training, clinical groups and life skills, as well as connection with employer/partner work-based learning experiences to increase the opportunity for youth to gain the skills and experience, to secure employment.

EARLY LEARNING COALITION OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: School Readiness Match Program: \$21,500 to help parents and guardians who are working and/or attending school access affordable child care at a quality, licensed facility of their choice. The program is specifically designed to serve the vulnerable ALICE

population (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) who live paycheck to paycheck and were economically impacted by COVID-19.

FAMILY CENTRAL, INC.: The Training Academy Programs at Family Central Inc.: \$10,000 to provide a variety of annual training hours, Continuing Education Units (CEUs) and credentialing programs that support Early Childhood Education (ECE) by preparing child care professionals in all types of early care and education settings, as well as directors and owners of child care centers.

FEEDING SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: Mobile FARMacy: \$10,000 to provide access to high-quality and nutritious food, with an emphasis on fruits and vegetables, to the almost 100 older adults and their households in the City of Pompano Beach.

FIRST CALL FOR HELP OF BROWARD, INC.: General Helpline: \$22,000 to connect residents in need with services that can help them. First Call for Help of Broward, Inc. dba 2-1-1 provides free and anonymous, round-the-clock access to crisis intervention, suicide prevention, and general requests for emotional support.

FLORIDA FINE ARTS INC.: Namaste! 2022 Festival: \$7,500 for the Namaste! 2022 Festival event on Dec 3 that will be a free, outdoor cultural event featuring curated Indian music, dance, food, and a multitude of other Indian art forms. The event will be held from 10:00am-6:00pm at the Pompano Beach Amphitheater and adjacent grounds. The event will feature roughly 100 youth performers under 21 and an equal number of adult artists.

FORT LAUDERDALE INDEPENDENCE TRAINING & EDUCATION CENTER, INC.: SOURC (Supporting One United Resource Center): \$10,000 to serve at least 50 of our youth who are from/reside in Pompano. FLITE Center will specifically target this portion of the population that we serve in order to help them attain and retain employment, housing or continue their education. FLITE Center will recruit youth from Pompano to our GED program or link them to post secondary education.

FRIENDS OF THE NORTHWEST BRANCH OF POMPANO BEACH, INC: Blues and Sweet Potato Pie Festival: \$2,000 for a cultural awareness event that celebrates Juneteenth as a reminder of the end to slavery in the United States that features lots of exciting, yet educational attractions.

FRIENDS OF THE NORTHWEST BRANCH OF POMPANO BEACH,INC: Community Back To School Fun Day: \$1,000 for a fun filled day for a large number of children/students within the NW, SW and some NE communities of Pompano Beach. This event includes handing out approximately 1300 to 1500 backpacks filled with essential school supplies, fun games, exhibitors, free food items, health screenings, educational mentors, financial and self help resources, free tennis shoes, hair cuts, and music.

HELPING ABUSED, NEGLECTED, DISADVANTAGED YOUTH, INC.: HANDY LIFE Program: \$9,500 to provide year-round programming and activities for at-risk middle school age youth from Pompano Beach Middle

School. The purpose of this program is to strengthen protective factors by helping youth develop resiliency, a positive outlook, health family dynamics, pro-social relationships with peers and adults, positive decision making, strong community attachment and academic success. This program reduces risk factors associated with teen pregnancy delinquency, substance abuse, family dysfunction, mental and physical health problems, negative peer associations, and school failure.

HILLSBORO LIGHTHOUSE PRESERVATION SOCIETY, INC.: Hillsboro Lighthouse: \$2,500 to support continued operation and preservation of the Hillsboro Inlet Lighthouse.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: JA Biztown/JA Finance Park: \$15,000 for a fully interactive, true-to-life, simulated town experience, following up to 16 hours of in-class curriculum, where students work and live as citizens and employees of JA BizTown, while utilizing their newly learned soft skills necessary for successful participation in the world of work. Students run the various eighteen businesses, earn paychecks, open/manage bank accounts, take out and repay business loans, vote, price and advertise goods and services for sale, and more. JA Finance Park starts with up to 16 hours of in-class curriculum and culminates in a one-day experience during which students explore careers and figure out how much to spend on housing, insurance, transportation, etc. to create/balance a 21-line item budget. This is all done based on an assigned life-scenario that includes family size, marital status, credit score, education and salary. By taking on adult roles, kids become better prepared for their future as consumers, investors & workers.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: JA Inspire: \$7,500 to introduce students to high growth/high wage career fields following 3 hours of career readiness curriculum. Students engage with JA Inspire volunteers at the career fair (in-person or virtually) to create connections that allow them to build an understanding of the cross-section of high demand jobs available to them in the future, from midskilled trades to highly technical STEM related careers.

LEARNING FOR SUCCESS, INCORPORATED: Kids and the Power of Work (KAPOW): \$15,000 for a unique collaboration between the school district, area businesses, community organizations, and schools. This is accomplished through a powerful set of in-school lessons taught by business volunteers with teachers from local elementary-high schools, field trips to partner work sites, and integrated curriculum activities for teachers to incorporate the real-life application of the skills they teach on a daily basis.

LEARNING FOR SUCCESS, INCORPORATED: My Future Is Now (MFIN): \$15,000 to change the way students experience school by organizing the curriculum, instruction, and guidance services around their strengths, skills, talents, interests, plans and dreams. When this transformation occurs, academic achievement, engagement and motivation increase; student aspirations rise; and many of the difficulties found in our schools are eliminated. Students who have never linked school to a successful future are motivated to do so.

NECESSITIES FOR CHILDREN FOUNDATION CORP.: Tech for Kids: Cyber Tech for Teens, Cyber Safety & Cybersecurity: \$5,000 for the implementation of the Cyber Tech for Teens initiative. This 8-week course offers a hands-on experience with relevant, up-to-date technology.

OUR FATHER'S HOUSE SOUP KITCHEN, INC.: Bike Academy: \$5,000 for a program that receives, repairs and gives away bicycles.

THE RUSSELL LIFE SKILLS AND READING FOUNDATION, INC.: Russell Reading Rooms: \$10,000 to serve a minimum of 70 elementary school students from low-income families in Pompano Beach who have been identified as at-risk in literacy skills due to a variety of factors, such as learning, economic or language-based difficulties.

SOUTHEAST POLICE MOTORCYCLE RODEO COMMITTEE I, INC.: 34th Annual Southeast Police Motorcycle Rodeo: \$7,500 for the 34th Anniversary Police Motorcycle Skills Rodeo on April 29, 2023, at the Pompano Beach Citi Centre. The purpose of this event is for the motorcycle Law Enforcement Officers who participate, to become more proficient and safe while working on a motorcycle. The competing motorcycle Officers hail from agencies all across the United States.

TAKE STOCK IN CHILDREN OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: Project FLIGHT: Facilitating Long-term Improvements in Graduation and Higher education for Tomorrow: \$5,000 for low-income, at-risk students from the City of Pompano Beach to receive comprehensive services starting in middle school, continuing through high school, and including post-secondary retention and completion services. Students will be matched with caring volunteer mentors, and will participate in college and career readiness activities. Upon success completion of high school and the Take Stock in Children program, students will be awarded a 2-year tuition Florida Prepaid Scholarship to use toward the pursuance of a post-secondary education.

UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY OF POMPANO BEACH, INC.: UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY FAMILY FUN DAY 2023: \$6,000 for a free of charge so that residents from all walks of life may attend. There are three components: Exhibitor Area, featuring over 140 booths; Main Stage featuring multi-cultural entertainment and a KidZone with activities for children. At the event, we conduct a live auction and raffle drawings to raise funds for academic scholarships. Food and soft drinks are available at no charge. This event is a family friendly event to allow every age to be impacted.

WOODHOUSE INC.: Healthcare and Independence Workshop for Seniors and those with disabilities: \$5,000 to host informational sessions (booths) related to keeping seniors and persons with disabilities and their caregivers independent as long as possible and encourage them to remain in their homes. This will be accomplished by connecting them to local services and business to help them with that goal.
