Appendix A: Criteria

The City of Pompano Beach supports a variety of nonprofit organizations with a special emphasis on those that work to achieve our goals and objectives and highlight our rich cultural make-up as a community, in particular, those that support *workforce readiness, education, senior assistance* and/or *community events*.

Due to the number of requests the City of Pompano Beach receives, these funding priorities are meant to assist organizations in understanding the City's nonprofit focus areas. The proposed project, program, event and/or in-kind donation must focus on one of the four (4) Funding Priorities listed below.

The City of Pompano Beach receives many more requests than it can support. When a request is denied, it does not imply that the applicant's program is not vital. It may mean that the request does not fall within our funding priorities/giving guidelines or that all charitable funds for the year have been allocated.

Funding Priorities

1. Workforce Readiness

There's a job skills gap. Companies continue to share that they have a plethora of job openings, but do not have qualified people to fill it. Trade organizations state that they don't have enough people seeking employment to fill their vacancies. Other studies suggest we have the workers but they do not have the soft skills needed for the position. To assist with workforce readiness, the City of Pompano Beach looks to partner with organizations that can help its working population on the following:

- Give access to vocational assistance, training/education, technical skills, job search assistance, and referrals for job placement for high school age students in Pompano Beach and/or adult residents
- Train in interpersonal skills to assist in job-seeking
- Connect employers who need skilled workers
- Develop small business and entrepreneurship training for people with lack of access to jobs

2. Education

Education is the great equalizer. As South Florida competes for more headquarters and businesses to relocate to the area, cities must offer great schools to entice the workforce to move to the area. In addition, we must offer educational programming for our adult residents to aid them to succeed and prosper. The City of Pompano Beach looks to partner with organizations that can help with the following:

- Work with local schools on school readiness, low-performing schools' turnaround and the achievement gap
- Offer resources to schools in need and help teachers to be more effective
- Help children in underperforming schools acquire the knowledge, skills and behaviors they need to succeed in school, college or career pathways
- Offer education in financial literacy, budgeting, insurance, and home maintenance to teach residents to manage resources on a limited income.

3. Senior Assistance

We are facing a rapidly aging population in the U.S. and a large sector of the senior population is living on limited income. With few resources at their disposal, finding affordable products and services is crucial. City of Pompano Beach strives to meet the demands of our aging population by supporting nonprofits that:

- Assist senior residents to maintain their independence and improve their quality of life
- Provide transportation, meal assistance, support groups and healthy living programming for senior residents
- Assist senior homeowners that are unable to keep up with necessary home repairs

4. Community Events

Community events allow the City of Pompano Beach to showcase all that it has to offer to our residents, families and visitors. We are looking to partner with nonprofits that make City of Pompano Beach a great place to live, to visit and to do business by emphasizing our community as one. These nonprofits:

- Highlight our rich cultural make-up as a community
- Support the use of our growing downtown and Innovation District as an event venue
- Support events that drive economic development into the Pompano Beach area

Ineligible Organizations

As a standard practice, the City of Pompano Beach's Community Sponsorship Program does not support and considers ineligible:

- For-profit organizations or those without a nonprofit, tax-exempt status.
- Organizations that discriminate on the basis of race, color, creed, gender, sexual orientation or national origin.
- Organizations or programs designed to influence legislation or elect candidates to public office.
- Faith-based organizations or religious programs whose principle purpose is promulgating a particular religious faith, creed or doctrine.
- Private foundations
- Community or event advertising
- Athletic sponsorships or scholarships
- Student trips or exchange programs
- Telephone solicitations
- Recreational, sporting or athletic associations
- Individuals

Appendix F: Summary of Recommended Programs

Funding Priority: Workforce Readiness

Junior Achievement: Pompano Beach: JA BizTown - JA Finance Park - JA Inspire. This initiative includes three high-impact, hands-on workforce-readiness, educational programs, and delivers them to all of Pompano Beach's public school fifth and eighth grade students.

First Call for Help of Broward, Inc. dba 211-Broward: 211 Broward Helpline. 211 Broward's Helpline ensures that Pompano Beach residents have 24-hour access to any health or human service program to help meet their unique needs.

Urban League of Broward County: (1) Pompano Beach M3: Money, Markets & Management. The Entrepreneurship Center will host a series of small business orientations and coaching workshops for small business owners for Pompano Beach residents. **(2) Workplace Excellence.** The Workplace Excellence Series provides training, career building and employment resources to equip individuals with tools needed to enter or re-enter the workforce. We strategically integrate Financial Empowerment education to help jobseekers maximize their resources and build wealth with a plan, supports and steady steps towards self-defined goals.

Early Learning Coalition of Broward County: Child Care Match Program. The Child Care Match program is essential to the economically disadvantaged working families who live in the City of Pompano, and to all the working families in Broward County, who require child care for the children. The program allows those parents who are either working or attending school and who are at 150% of the federal poverty level to access affordable child care at a licensed facility of their choice. This program provides reimbursement, based on child attendance and parent eligibility, directly to the licensed child care provider.

Our Father's House Soup Kitchen, Inc.: Bike Academy. Provide transportation needs by supplying rehabbed bicycles and bus passes to either seek employment or transportation to existing employment.

The Cooperative Feeding Program Inc DBA LifeNet4Families: Workforce Ready. LifeNet is requesting funding for 24 workforce readiness sessions. Many of our clients are from Pompano Beach and come into our facility on a daily basis for services. There is a large group of clients who come in the morning to have breakfast and grab a to go lunch before heading to work for the day daily. This population of clients come in for help with job search assistance, help with their resumes and help with interpersonal skills. LifeNet also assists our working clients connect with employers who need skilled workers. These workshops will take place twice a month at our facility.

Save Our Boys, Inc.: Haitian Heritage and Cultural Arts Celebration. The Haitian Heritage and Cultural Arts Celebration is a series of cultural and educational events which will be held throughout the year. The community events include the Haitian Jazz Festival, Haitian Awards Presentation, Youth Leadership Summit and the planning for bringing a national Haitian conference to Pompano Beach.

Funding Priority: Education

Broward Education Foundation: Tools for Schools Broward. The school supply store provides teachers from Title 1 Schools the much "needed" supplies for their students and classrooms. Teachers are able to visit the center twice a year relieving them from out of pocket expense.

Pompano Beach Historical Society: Pompano Beach Historical Society Programs, Tours, and Events. Monthly programs and lectures based on a suitable historic theme are planned and operated throughout the year by members of the Historical Society. Lecturers in the past have included long-time Florida historian and author Sally Ling, as well as speakers from local organizations such as the Pompano Women's Club, and the Tiger Trail organization.

Broward Performing Arts Foundation, Inc.: Student Enrichment in the Arts (SEAS). All SEAS lessons and presentations are directly aligned with Florida state standards and classroom curriculum, with an emphasis on literacy.

Ashanti Cultural Arts and Enrichment, Inc.: Turn Around Arts. Ashanti will use City of Pompano Beach Funding for our Turn Around Arts Program. Ashanti's goal is to give children an opportunity to improve their academic and life skills through the Arts.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County: College & Career Readiness. The Boys & Girls Clubs of Broward County's College and Career Exploratory Program promotes higher education and higher-level career aspirations to over 3,000 teens through real world, hands-on learning experiences, and gives them the tools to get started on their professional journeys. Spanning the entire program year, the program keeps members engaged through four major components: Workforce Development, Career Exploration and College & Career Corner.

Community Reconstruction Housing Corporation: The Rites of Passage (ROP). Poor academic performance is a risk factor commonly associated with delinquency. The ROP seeks to improve academic performance and youth attitudes towards education, including advanced education opportunities. A total of 35 youth will be served. Services include group skills training (life and conflict resolution), academic remediation delivered by teachers), case management that is based on the results of assessments conducted by licensed behavioral health professionals.

Browns Community Development Center Inc.: 5th Annual Collier City Family Fun Day 2019. Annual Collier City Family Fun Day is an community event that brings families and community partners together. This event consist of free food distribution, back pack give-a-ways, health and wellness screenings, job and career fair, numerous exhibitors, free haircuts for the children, games and activities for the children, empowerment workshops and live entertainment. Free food the attendees. Businesses and organization showcases their products or services.

Funding Priority: Senior Assistance

Areawide Council on Aging of Broward County Inc: 2019 Fair Share. The Areawide Council on Aging, which administers the Aging and Disability Resource Center, is the prime planning, coordinating, and funding source for 23 Broward Projects. Those, which receive Federal Older Americans Act, and State Community Care for the Elderly Allocations, are mandated to raise a local 10% match. Our nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization employs a Fair Share Methodology to endeavor to raise as much of the required match as possible, by preparing computerized records of all services provided to each municipality's elder residents and then seeking contributions predicated on the number of seniors in the city times 2/3 of the dollar amount representing one elder. The County is requested to provide the other 1/3, plus the Total Fair Share representing residents of unincorporated Broward. Our prime goal is to prevent or delay institutionalization of elders.

Pompano Beach Historical Society: Pompano Beach Historical Society Programs, Tours, and Events. Monthly programs and lectures based on a suitable historic theme are planned and operated throughout the year by members of the Historical Society. On Saturdays between October and April, the Historical Society maintains a booth at Pompano's longest operating Green Market. The Historical Society is a founding partner of the Green Market and actively participates in its yearly planning and operations.

Unity in the Community of Pompano Beach, Inc. Unity in the Community Family Fun Day. The UIC Family Fun Day is free of charge so that residents from all walks of life may attend. There are three components: Exhibitor Area, featuring over 140 booths; Main Stage featuring multi-cultural entertainment and a Kid Zone with activities for children.

Friends of the Northwest Branch Library of Pompano Beach Inc.: (1) Blues and Sweet Potato Pie Juneteenth Festival . The Festival is an event that has been held for 18 years which educates our community on the historical significance of Juneteenth and African-American history in general. We have family fun, historical exhibits, food vendors, and summer reading program among other activities. The Festival typically runs from 11:00 am to 5:00 pm. **(2) Back to School Fun Day .** The Back to School Fun Day is a popular event where the youth of the Northwest Pompano community can acquire at no charge to them back packs and school supplies. Also, free food, treats, and refreshments are served. Plus, kids' games and vendors are all present at this event.
