APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT FOR CONSULTING/PROFESSIONAL SERVICES BETWEEN THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH AND SYNALOVSKI ROMANIK SAYE, LLC FOR DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION SERVICES FOR THE FIRE/EMERGENCY **OPERATIONS** CENTER PROJECT: **PROVIDING** SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to law, ten (10) days' notice has been given by publication in a paper of general circulation in the City, notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a public hearing in the City Commission Chambers of the City of Pompano Beach; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing before the City Commission was held pursuant to the published notice described above, at which hearing the parties in interest and all other citizens so desiring had an opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard; now, therefore,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That an Agreement between the City of Pompano Beach and Synalovski Romanik Saye, LLC for design and construction administration services, a copy of which Agreement is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth in full, is hereby approved.

SECTION 2. That the proper City officials are hereby authorized to execute said Agreement.

SECTION 3. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of

this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL/CONSULTING SERVICES

THIS PROFESSIONAL/CONSULTING	SERVICES AGREEMENT is made and
entered into this _/2 _ day of \(\frac{1}{16} \) (9)	, 2019, by the City of Pompano
Beach, a Florida municipal corporation ("City") an	nd Synalovski Romanik Saye, LLC, a Florida
corporation ("Consultant"), collectively referred to	as "the Parties."

WHEREAS, City advertised RFQ P-54-18 in September 22, 2018, requesting firms to submit qualifications and experience for consideration to provide professional consulting services to the City for the design, bidding, and construction phase services to the City for the Fire/Emergency Operations Center ("Project");

WHEREAS, City desires to retain Consultant to provide professional architectural design and engineering consulting and related services, which Consultant is capable of providing under the terms and conditions described in this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of those mutual promises and the terms and conditions set forth hereafter, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Contract Documents. This Agreement consists of the Scope of Work ("Exhibit A"), the Insurance Requirements ("Exhibit "B"), and RFQ P-54-18 and the Consultant's Response ("Exhibit C"), all of which are attached and made a part of this Agreement. It is further agreed that no modification, amendment or alteration in the terms or conditions shall be effective unless contained in a written document executed with the same formality and off equal dignity as this Agreement. None of the provisions, terms and conditions contained in this Agreement may be added to, modified, superseded or otherwise altered, except by written instrument executed by the parties in accordance with Paragraph 24, Waiver and Modification. In the event of any conflict or inconsistency between this Agreement and the provisions in the incorporated Exhibits, resolution shall be attained by giving precedence in the following order: (i) this Agreement, (ii) Exhibit "A", and (iii) Exhibit "C".
- 2. Scope of Work. Consultant shall provide the services set forth in Exhibit "A", including all necessary, incidental and related activities required for full and complete performance of this Agreement ("Scope of Work"). This Agreement does not delineate every detail and minor work task required to be performed by Consultant to complete the Project. During the course of the Services included in this Agreement, if Consultant determines that work should be performed to complete the Project and, in Consultant's opinion, that work is outside the level of effort originally anticipated, whether or not the Scope of Work identifies the work items, Consultant shall notify the City's Contract Administrator in writing in a timely manner before proceeding with the Work. If Consultant proceeds with such work without notifying the City's Contract Administrator, the Work shall be deemed to be within the original level of effort, whether or not specifically addressed in the Scope of Work. Notice to City's Contract Administrator does not constitute authorization or approval by City to Consultant to perform the Work. Performance of

work by Consultant outside the originally anticipated level of effort without prior written City approval shall be at no additional cost to City.

- 3. City shall assist Consultant by placing at Consultant's disposal all information City has available pertinent to the Project, at no charge, including previous reports and any other data relative to design or construction of the Project. City shall arrange for access to, and make all provision for, Consultant to enter upon public and private property as required for Consultant to perform its Services. City shall review any itemized deliverables and documents required to be submitted by Consultant and respond in writing with any comments within the time set forth in Exhibit A. City shall give prompt written notice to Consultant whenever City observes or otherwise becomes aware of any material defect in the work of the Contractor or other material development that aaffects the scope or timing of Consultant's Services.
- A. Consultant agrees to meet with City at reasonable times after reasonable notice.
- B. Consultant acknowledges that it is aware of all the duties and responsibilities and agrees to perform such duties and responsibilities in a professional manner.
- C. Notwithstanding any other remedy otherwise available to City, where the work product of Consultant is found to be deficient for the purpose for which it was produced, Consultant shall correct the deficiency at no cost to City.
- D. Consultant shall pay its subconsultants, subcontractors and suppliers consistent with Chapter 218, Florida Statutes.
- 4. <u>Term.</u> The term of this Agreement shall begin upon complete execution by all Parties and shall end on the fifth (5th) anniversary of that date, provided that either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement as set forth below.
- 5. Extension. In the event City determines Consultant to be in full compliance with this Agreement and Consultant's performance to be satisfactory, the City Contract Administrator, with City Commission approval, may extend the term of this Agreement for one two (2) year term beyond the term established above. The exercise of this option shall be by written notification issued by the City Contract Administrator and furnished to Consultant not less than sixty (60) days prior to the termination date of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Maximum Obligation</u>. City agrees to pay Consultant as compensation for performance of all services as related to the Scope of Work as required under the terms of this Agreement, including salary costs and reimbursables. It is understood that the method of compensation is that of "maximum amount not-to-exceed" which means that Consultant shall perform all services set forth for total compensation in the amount of or less than that agreed to by City and Consultant for the Project.

7. Price Formula, Payment and Invoices.

A. Price Formula. City agrees to pay Consultant for performance of the Work set forth in this Agreement as follows:

Services and reimbursable expenses shall not exceed one million three hundred and twenty thousand three hundred dollars and 40/100 (\$1,320,300.40).

- B. Payment. Consultant shall submit invoices to City in accordance to the fee schedule for each task under Exhibit "A", on a monthly basis, based on the progress of each task. All payments by City shall be made after the Work or task described in the Invoice has been verified as completed. Unless disputed by City as provided below, following City's receipt of a Proper Invoice as defined in §218.72, Florida Statutes, as amended, City shall forward Consultant payment for services as defined under Exhibit "A" Compensation. The City shall not be liable for any reimbursable expenses that have not been approved in advance, in writing, by City's Contract Administrator.
- C. City may temporarily remove for review any disputed amount, by line item, from an invoice and shall timely provide Consultant written notification of any such disputed charge. Consultant shall provide clarification and a satisfactory explanation to City, along with revised copies of all such documents if inaccuracies or errors are discovered, within ten (10) days of receipt of City's notice of the disputed amount.
- D. In the event City has a claim against Consultant for Work performed pursuant to this Agreement, which has not been timely remedied in accordance with the provisions of this Paragraph, City may withhold payment for the contested amount, in whole or in part, to protect itself from loss on account of defective Work, claims filed or reasonable evidence indicating probable filing of claims by other parties against Consultant, or Consultant's failure to make proper payments to subcontractors or vendors for material or labor. When the reason(s) for withholding payment are removed or resolved in a manner satisfactory to City, payment shall be made.
- E. Resolution of improper payment requests or invoices shall be in accordance with §218.76, Florida Statutes, as amended.
- 8. <u>Disputes.</u> Any factual disputes between City and the Consultant in regard to this Agreement shall be directed to the City Manager for the City, and such decision shall be final.
 - 9. Contract Administrators, Notices and Demands.
- A. <u>Contract Administrators</u>. During the term of this Agreement, the City's Contract Administrator shall be Horacio Danovich and the Consultant's Contract Administrator shall be Deborah Martin (or their authorized written designee) as further identified below.
- B. <u>Notices and Demands</u>. A notice, demand, or other communication hereunder by either party to the other shall be effective if it is in writing and sent via email, facsimile, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid to the representatives named below or is addressed and delivered to such other authorized representative at the address as that party, from time to time may designate in writing and forward to the other as provided herein.

10. Ownership of Documents and Information. All information, data, reports, plans, procedures or other proprietary rights in all Work products, developed, prepared, assembled or compiled by Consultant as required for the Work described in this Agreement, whether complete or unfinished, shall be owned by the City without restriction, reservation or limitation of their use and made available at any time and at no cost to City upon reasonable written request for its use or distribution as City deems appropriate, provided City has compensated Consultant for such Work product. City's re-use of Consultant's Work product shall be at its sole discretion and risk if done without Consultant's written permission. Upon completion of all Work or termination of this Agreement, copies of all of the above documents shall be promptly delivered to the City's Contract Administrator upon written request. The Consultant may not disclose, use, license or sell any work developed, created, or otherwise originated pursuant to this Agreement to any third party whatsoever. The rights and obligations created under this Paragraph shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

11. Termination.

A. City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, for cause by the Consultant, if the Consultant has not corrected the breach within ten (10) calendar days after written notice to Consultant identifying the breach. If the City erroneously, improperly or unjustifiably terminates for cause, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience, which shall be effective thirty (30) days after such notice of termination for cause is provided.

- B. Termination for convenience shall be effective on the termination date stated in written notice provided by the City, which termination date shall be not less than thirty (30) days after the date of such written notice.
- C. This Agreement may also be terminated by the City upon such notice as the City Manager deems appropriate under the circumstances in the event that the City Manager determines that termination is necessary to protect the public health or safety.
- D. The Notice of Termination may include City's proposed Transition Plan and timeline for terminating the Work, requests for certain Work product documents and materials, and other provisions regarding winding down concerns and activities.
- E. If there is any material breach or default in Consultant's performance of any covenant or obligation in this Agreement which has not been remedied within ten (10) business days after City's written Notice of Termination, City, in its sole discretion, may terminate this Agreement immediately and Consultant shall not be entitled to receive further payment for services rendered from the effective date of the Notice of Termination.
- F. In the event of termination, City shall compensate Consultant for all authorized Work satisfactorily performed through the termination date under the payment terms set forth in Paragraph 7 above and all Work product documents and materials shall be delivered to City within ten (10) business days from the Notice of Termination. If any Work is in progress but not completed as of the date of the termination, then upon City's written approval, this Agreement may be extended until such Work is completed and accepted by City.
- 12. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be obligated to perform any duty, requirement or obligation in this Agreement if such performance is prevented by fire, hurricane, earthquake, explosion, war, civil disorder, sabotage, accident, flood, acts of God or by any reason of any other matter or condition beyond the control of either party, which cannot or could not be overcome by reasonable diligence and without unusual expense ("Force Majeure"). In no event shall economic hardship or lack of funds be considered an event of Force Majeure. If either party is unable to perform or is delayed in their performance of any obligations in this Agreement by reason of any event of Force Majeure, such inability or delay shall be excused for the time period during which compliance is prevented by such event and during such period thereafter as may be reasonably necessary for either party to correct the adverse effect of such event of Force Majeure.

In order to be entitled to the benefit of this provision, within five (5) days after the beginning of any such delay, a party claiming an event of Force Majeure shall have given the other party written notice of the cause(s), requested an extension for the period and also diligently proceeded to correct the adverse effect of any Force Majeure. The parties agree that, as to this provision, time is of the essence.

- 13. <u>Insurance</u>. Consultant shall maintain insurance in accordance with Exhibit "B" throughout the term of this Agreement.
- 14. <u>Indemnification</u>. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, no liability shall attach to the City by reason of entering into this Agreement.

- A. Consultant shall at all times indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officials, employees, volunteers and other authorized agents from and against any and all claims, demands, suit, damages, attorneys' fees, fines, losses, penalties, defense costs or liabilities suffered by the City to the extent caused by any negligent act, omission, breach, recklessness or misconduct of Consultant or any of its agents, officers, or employees, including any inaccuracy in or breach of any of the representations, warranties or covenants made by the Consultant, its agents, officers and employees, in the performance of services of this contract. To the extent considered necessary by City, any sums due Consultant pursuant to this Agreement may be retained by City until all of City's claims for indemnification have been settled or otherwise resolved, and any amount withheld shall not be subject to payment or interest by City.
- B. Consultant acknowledges and agrees that City would not enter into this Contract without this indemnification of City by Consultant. The parties agree that one percent (1%) of the total compensation paid to Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall constitute specific consideration to Consultant for the indemnification provided under this Paragraph and these provisions shall survive expiration or early termination of this Agreement.
- 15. <u>Sovereign Immunity</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to affect in any way the rights, privileges and immunities of the City and its agencies, as set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

16. Non-Assignability and Subcontracting.

- A. Non-Assignability. This Agreement is not assignable and Consultant agrees it shall not assign or otherwise transfer any of its interests, rights or obligations in this Agreement, in whole or in part, to any other person or entity without City's prior written consent, which must be sought in writing not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of any proposed assignment. Any attempt by Consultant to assign or transfer any of its rights or obligations in this Agreement without first obtaining City's written approval shall not be binding on City and, at City's sole discretion, may result in City's immediate termination of this Agreement, at which time, City shall be released of any of its obligations under this Agreement. In addition, this Agreement and the rights and obligations in this Agreement shall not be assignable or transferable by any process or proceeding in court, or by judgment, execution, proceedings in insolvency, bankruptcy or receivership. In the event of Consultant's insolvency or bankruptcy, City may, at its option, terminate and cancel this Agreement without any notice of any kind whatsoever, in which event all rights of Consultant under this Agreement shall immediately cease and terminate.
- B. Subcontracting. Prior to subcontracting for Work to be performed pursuant to this Agreement, Consultant shall be required to obtain the written approval of the City's Contract Administrator. If the City's Contract Administrator, in their sole discretion, objects to the proposed subcontractor, Consultant shall be prohibited from allowing that subcontractor to provide any Work pursuant to this Agreement. Even if the Consultant is permitted to subcontract Work in accordance with this Paragraph, Consultant shall remain responsible for any and all contractual obligations and shall also be responsible to ensure that none of its proposed subcontractors are listed on the *Convicted Vendors List* referenced in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 28 below.

- 17. <u>Performance Under Law</u>. The Consultant, in the performance of duties under the Agreement, agrees to comply with all applicable local, state and federal laws and ordinances including, but not limited to, standards of licensing, conduct of business and those relating to criminal activity.
- 18. <u>Audit and Inspection Records</u>. The Consultant shall permit the authorized representatives of the City to inspect and audit all data and records of the Consultant, if any, relating to performance under the contract until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment under this contract.

The Consultant further agrees to include in all its subcontracts arising from this Agreement a provision to the effect that the subcontractor agrees that City or any of their duly authorized representatives shall, until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment under the subcontractor, have access to and the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers and records of such subcontractor, involving transactions related to the subcontractor.

- 19. <u>Adherence to Law</u>. The Consultant shall adhere to all applicable laws governing its relationship with its employees including, but not limited to, laws, rules, regulations and policies concerning worker's compensation, unemployment compensation and minimum wage requirements.
- 20. <u>Independent Consultant</u>. The Consultant shall be deemed an independent Consultant for all purposes, and the employees of the Consultant or any of its Consultants, subcontractors and the employees, shall not in any manner be deemed to be employees of City. As such, the employees of the Consultant, its Consultants or subcontractors, shall not be subject to any withholding for tax, social security or other purposes by City, nor shall such Consultant, subcontractor or employee be entitled to sick leave, pension benefits, vacation, medical benefits, life insurance, workers or unemployment compensation or the like from City.
- 21. <u>Mutual cooperation</u>. The Consultant recognizes that the performance of the Scope of Work pursuant to this Agreement is essential to the provision of vital public services and the accomplishment of the stated goals and mission of City. Therefore, the Consultant shall be responsible to maintain a cooperative and good faith attitude in all relations with City and shall actively foster a public image of mutual benefit to both parties. The Consultant shall not make any statements or take any actions detrimental to the City's effort.

22. Public Records.

- A. The City of Pompano Beach is a public agency subject to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Consultant shall comply with Florida's Public Records Law, as amended. Specifically, the Consultant shall:
- 1. Keep and maintain public records required by the City in order to perform the service.
- 2. Upon request from the City's custodian of public records, provide the City with a copy of requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a

reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes or as otherwise provided by law.

- 3. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement's term and following completion of the Agreement if the Consultant does not transfer the records to the City.
- 4. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost to the City, all public records in possession of the Consultant, or keep and maintain public records required by the City to perform the service. If the Consultant transfers all public records to the City upon completion of the contract, the Consultant shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Consultant keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Consultant shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the City, upon request from the City's custodian of public records in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the City.
- B. Failure of the Consultant to provide the above described public records to the City within a reasonable time may subject Consultant to penalties under §119.10, Florida Statutes, as amended.

23. Governing Law; Venue; Waiver of Jury Trial. This Agreement has been and shall be construed as having been made and delivered within the State of Florida, and it is agreed by the Parties that this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida, both as to interpretation and performance. Any action at law, or in equity, shall be instituted and maintained only in courts of competent jurisdiction in Broward County, Florida. This Agreement and its terms, conditions and requirements comply with §287.055, Florida Statutes. BY ENTERING INTO THIS AGREEMENT, CONSULTANT AND CITY EXPRESSLY WAIVE ANY RIGHTS

EITHER PARTY MAY HAVE TO A TRIAL BY JURY OF ANY CIVIL LITIGATION RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT. IF A PARTY FAILS TO WITHDRAW A REQUEST FOR A JURY TRIAL IN A LAWSUIT ARISING OUT OF THIS AGREEMENT AFTER WRITTEN NOTICE BY THE OTHER PARTY OF VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION, THE PARTY MAKING THE REQUEST FOR JURY TRIAL SHALL BE LIABLE FOR THE REASONABLE ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS OF THE OTHER PARTY IN CONTESTING THE REQUEST FOR JURY TRIAL, AND SUCH AMOUNTS SHALL BE AWARDED BY THE COURT IN ADJUDICATING THE MOTION.

24. Waiver and Modification.

- A. No waiver made by either party with respect to performance, manner, time, or any obligation of either party or any condition in this Agreement shall be considered a waiver of that party's rights with respect to the particular obligation or condition beyond those expressly waived in writing or a waiver of any other rights of the party making the waiver or any other obligations of the other party.
- B. No Waiver by Delay. The City shall have the right to institute such actions or proceedings as it may deem desirable for effectuating the purposes of this Agreement provided that any delay by City in asserting its rights in this Agreement shall not operate as a waiver of such rights or limit them in any way. The intent of this provision is that City shall not be constrained to exercise such remedy at a time when it may still hope to otherwise resolve the problems created by the default or risk nor shall any waiver made by City with respect to any specific default by Consultant be considered a waiver of City's rights with respect to that default or any other default by Consultant.
- C. Either party may request changes to modify certain provisions of this Agreement; however, unless otherwise provided for in this Agreement, any such changes must be contained in a written amendment executed by both parties with the same formality of this Agreement.
- 25. No Contingent Fee. Consultant warrants that other than a bona fide employee working solely for Consultant, Consultant has not employed or retained any person or entity, or paid or agreed to pay any person or entity, any fee, commission, gift or any other consideration to solicit or secure this Agreement or contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Agreement. In the event of Consultant's breach or violation of this provision, City shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without liability and, at City's sole discretion, to deduct from the Price Formula set forth in Paragraph 7 or otherwise recover the full amount of such fee, commission, gift or other consideration.
- 26. Attorneys' Fees and Costs. In the event of any litigation involving the provisions of this Agreement, both parties agree that the prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party reasonable attorney and paraprofessional fees as well as all out-of-pocket costs and expenses incurred by the prevailing party in such litigation through all appellate levels.

- 27. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. Consultant and City agree that this Agreement and other agreements pertaining to Consultant's performance hereunder shall not create any obligation on Consultant or City's part to third parties. No person not a party to this Agreement shall be a third-party beneficiary or acquire any rights hereunder.
- 28. Public Entity Crimes Act. As of the full execution of this Agreement, Consultant certifies that in accordance with §287.133, Florida Statutes, it is not on the Convicted Vendors List maintained by the State of Florida, Department of General Services. If Consultant is subsequently listed on the Convicted Vendors List during the term of this Agreement, Consultant agrees it shall immediately provide City written notice of such designation in accordance with Paragraph 9 above.
- 29. Entire Agreement. This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements or understandings applicable to the matters contained herein, and the parties agree that there are no commitments, agreements or understandings concerning the subject matter of this Agreement that are not contained in this document. Accordingly, it is agreed that no deviation from the terms of this Agreement shall be predicated upon any prior representations or agreements, whether oral or written.
- 30. <u>Headings</u>. The headings or titles to Articles of this Agreement are not part of the Agreement and shall have no effect upon the construction or interpretation of any part of this Agreement.
- 31. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. A photocopy, email or facsimile copy of this Agreement and any signatory hereon shall be considered for all purposes as original.

Pursuant to Florida Statutes Chapter 287.055 "Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act" the City of Pompano Beach invites professional firms to submit qualifications and experience for consideration to provide architectural design services to the City for the Fire/Emergency Operations Center.

The City will receive sealed proposals until <u>2:00 p.m. (local)</u>, <u>October 31, 2018</u>. Proposals must be submitted electronically through the eBid System on or before the due date/time stated above. Any proposal received after the due date and time specified, will not be considered. Any uncertainty regarding the time a proposal is received will be resolved against the Proposer.

A pre-proposal conference will be held on <u>October 4, 2018 beginning at 10:00 a.m.</u> (local) in the Public Works Conference Room, 1201 N. E. 5th Avenue, Pompano Beach, Florida 33060.

Proposer must be registered on the City's eBid System in order to view the solicitation documents and respond to this solicitation. The complete solicitation document can be downloaded for free from the eBid System as a pdf at: https://pompanobeachfl.ionwave.net/CurrentSourcingEvents.aspx. The City is not responsible for the accuracy or completeness of any documentation the Proposer receives from any source other than from the eBid System. Proposer is solely responsible for downloading all required documents. Responses will be electronically unsealed in a public forum and the proposers names will be read aloud.

1. Scope Of Services

The City intends to issue a single contract to an engineering and/or, architectural, firm to provide professional consulting services to the City for the design, bidding, and construction phase services to the City for the Fire/Emergency Ops Center.

The project entails the construction of a new fire rescue and logistics complex to include an administrative center, emergency operations center, and a fire and EMS distribution center with storage space for emergency apparatus to be located in the Downtown Pompano Transit Oriented Corridor (DPTOC). This project has a design and construction administration budget of \$1 million and anticipated construction costs are estimated to be \$15 million.

The scope of services may include, but is not limited, to the following:

- Prepare preliminary design reports, feasibility analyses, site plans and/or design alternative recommendations and preliminary cost estimates.
- Conduct presentations to elected officials, staff, and the public.
- Prepare required bidding and construction documents for the projects. This will include preparing surveys, design plans, supplementary contract requirements, technical specifications, and cost estimates.
- Attendance at City Commission, pre-design, design, bidding and bid award meetings may be required.
- Coordinate processing the projects through all required governmental and quasigovernmental agencies, City Departments and other appropriate review boards.
- Prepare and process all required permit applications and submittal packages as required for permit issuance of all agency permits (i.e. State, County and City)
- Attend pre-bid meeting, respond to bidder questions, and prepare possible bid addendums for project revisions.
- Assist the City in making bid award recommendations for contracting/construction services.
- Provide construction administration/management services for the project. Services
 during construction may include periodic or routine inspections, threshold
 inspections, shop drawing/contractor submittal reviews and approvals, responding to
 contractor requests for information, and reviewing contractor payment applications.
- Provide project closeout services. This may include preliminary and final acceptance
 of projects, preparation and approval of punch list items and project certification as
 required to all permitting agencies.

Firms must have previous municipal experience.

2. Tasks/Deliverables

Firms will provide plans at various intervals (30-60-90%) for City staff review. Firms will prepare 100% construction plans. Firms will assist during the permitting process and ensure RFIs are addressed in a timely fashion. Firms will provide onsite supervision on an as needed basis and as required for final project certification.

3. Local Business Program

On March 13, 2018, the City Commission approved Ordinance 2018-112, establishing a Local Business Program, a policy to increase the participation of City of Pompano Beach businesses in the City's procurement process.

For purposes of this solicitation, "Local Business" will be defined as follows:

- 1. TIER 1 LOCAL VENDOR. POMPANO BEACH BUSINESS EMPLOYING POMPANO BEACH RESIDENTS. A business entity which has maintained a permanent place of business within the city limits and maintains a staffing level, within this local office, of at least ten percent who are residents of the City of Pompano Beach or includes subcontracting commitments to Local Vendors Subcontractors for at least ten percent of the contract value. The permanent place of business may not be a post office box. The business must be located in a non-residential zone, and must actually distribute goods or services from that location. The business must be staffed with full-time employees within the limits of the city. In addition, the business must have a current business tax receipt from the City of Pompano Beach for a minimum of one year prior to the date of issuance of a bid or proposal solicitation.
- 2. TIER 2 LOCAL VENDOR, BROWARD COUNTY BUSINESS EMPLOYING POMPANO BEACH RESIDENTS OR UTILIZING LOCAL VENDOR SUBCONTRACTORS. A business entity which has maintained a permanent place of business within Broward County and maintains a staffing level, within this local office, of at least 15% who are residents of the City of Pompano Beach or includes subcontracting commitments to Local Vendors Subcontractors for at least 20% of the contract value. The permanent place of business may not be a post office box. The business must be located in a non- residential zone, and must actually distribute goods or services from that location. The business must be staffed with full-time employees within the limits of the city. In addition, the business must have a current business tax receipt from the respective Broward County municipality for a minimum of one year prior to the date of issuance of a bid or proposal solicitation.
- 3. LOCAL VENDOR SUBCONTRACTOR. POMPANO BEACH BUSINESS. A business entity which has maintained a permanent place of business within the city limits of the City of Pompano Beach. The permanent place of business may not be a post office box. The business must be located in a non-residential zone, and must actually distribute goods or services from that location. The business must be staffed with full-time employees within the limits of the city. In addition, the business must have a current business tax receipt from the City of Pompano Beach for a minimum of one year prior to the date of issuance of a bid or proposal solicitation.

You can view the list of City businesses that have a current Business Tax Receipt on the City's website, and locate local firms that are available to perform the work required by the bid specifications. The business information, sorted by business use classification, is posted on the webpage for the Business Tax Receipt Division: www.pompanobeachfl.gov by selecting the Pompano Beach Business Directory in the Shop Pompanol section.

The City of Pompano Beach is **strongly committed** to insuring the participation of City of Pompano Beach Businesses as contractors and subcontractors for the procurement of goods and services, including labor, materials and equipment. Proposers are

required to participate in the City of Pompano Beach's Local Business Program by including, as part of their package, the Local Business Participation Form (Exhibit A,) listing the local businesses that will be used on the contract, and the Letter of Intent Form (Exhibit B) from each local business that will participate in the contract.

The required goal for this RFP is 10% for Local Vendor.

If a Prime Contractor/Vendor is not able to achieve the level of goal attainment of the contract, the Prime Vendor will be requested to demonstrate and document that good faith efforts were made to achieve the goal by providing the Local Business Unavailability Form (Exhibit C), listing firms that were contacted but not available, and the Good Faith Effort Report (Exhibit D), describing the efforts made to include local business participation in the contract. This documentation shall be provided to the City Commission for acceptance.

The awarded proposer will be required to submit "Local Business Subcontractor Utilization Reports" during projects and after projects have been completed. The reports will be submitted to the assigned City project manager of the project. The Local Business Subcontractor Utilization Report template and instructions have been included in the bid document.

Failure to meet Local Vendor Goal commitments will result in "unsatisfactory" compliance rating. Unsatisfactory ratings may impact award of future projects if a sanction is imposed by the City Commission.

The city shall award a Local Vendor preference based upon vendors, contractors, or subcontractors who are local with a preferences follows:

- 1. For evaluation purposes, the Tier 1 and Tier 2 businesses shall be a criterion for award in this Request for Proposal (RFP). No business may qualify for more than one tier level.
- 2 For evaluation purposes, local vendors shall receive the following preferences:
 - a. Tier 1 business as defined by this subsection shall be granted a preference in the amount of five percent of total score.
 - b. Tier 2 business as defined by this subsection shall be granted a preference in the amount of two and one-half percent of total score.
- 3. It is the responsibility of the awarded vendor/contractor to comply with all Tier 1&2 guidelines. The awarded vendor/contractor must ensure that all requirements are met before execution of a contract.

4. Required Proposal Submittal

Submission/Format Requirements

Sealed proposals shall be submitted electronically through the eBid System on or before the due date/time stated above. Proposer shall upload response as one (1) file to the

eBid System. The file size for uploads is limited to 100 MB. If the file size exceeds 100 MB the response must be split and uploaded as two (2) separate files.

Information to be included in the proposal: In order to maintain comparability and expedite the review process, it is required that proposals be organized in the manner specified below, with the sections clearly labeled:

Title page:

Show the project name and number, the name of the Proposer's firm, address, telephone number, name of contact person and the date.

Table of Contents:

Include a clear identification of the material by section and by page.

Letter of Interest:

A Letter of Interest, signed by an authorized representative of your firm, expressing your understanding of the project and expressing a positive commitment to provide the services described herein. In the letter, include:

- · complete corporate name of the primary firm responding
- applicable Federal Tax Identification Number
- address
- telephone and fax numbers
- name, title, and email of the person to contact regarding your submission

Please limit this section to two pages.

Technical Approach:

Firms or teams shall submit their technical approach to the tasks described in the scope, including details of how each phase of the project would be completed, and how their firm proposes to maintain time schedules and cost controls.

Schedule:

Proposer shall provide a timeline that highlights proposed tasks that will meet all applicable deadlines.

Project Tearn Form:

Submit a completed "Project Team" form. The purpose of this form is to identify the key members of your team, including any specialty subconsultants.

Organizational Chart:

Specifically identify the management plan (if needed) and provide an organizational chart for the team. The proposer must describe at a minimum, the basic approach to these projects, to include reporting hierarchy of staff and sub-consultants, clarify the individual(s) responsible for the co-ordination of separate components of the scope of services.

Statement of Skills and Experience of Project Team:

Describe the experience of the entire project team as it relates to the types of projects described in the Scope section of this RLI. Include the experience of the prime consultants as well as other members of the project team; i.e., additional personnel,

sub-consultants, branch office, team members, and other resources anticipated to be utilized for this project. Name specific projects (successfully completed within the past five years) where the team members have performed similar projects previously.

Resumes of Key Personnel

Include resumes for key personnel for prime and subconsultants.

References:

References for past five (5) projects in the tri-county area (Broward, Palm Beach, and Miami-Dade.) Describe the scope of each project in physical terms and by cost, describe the respondent's responsibilities, and provide the contact information (name, email, telephone number) of an individual in a position of responsibility who can attest to respondent's activities in relation to the project.

List any prior projects performed for the City of Pompano Beach.

Office Locations:

Identify the location of the office from which services will be rendered, and the number of professional and administrative staff at the prime office location. Also identify the location of office(s) of the prime and/or sub consultants that may be utilized to support any or all of the professional services listed above and the number of professional and administrative staff at the prime office location.

If firms are situated outside the local area, (Broward, Palm Beach, and Miami-Dade counties) include a brief statement as to whether or not the firm will arrange for a local office during the term of the contract, if necessary.

Local Businesses:

Completed Local Business program forms, Exhibits A-D.

Minority Business Enterprises:

It is the intent of the City of Pompano Beach to encourage minority and women owned firms to participate in the process. The methods by which this is accomplished should be developed and presented by the respondents in their submissions.

For any member of your tearn that is a certified Minority Business Enterprise (as defined by the State of Florida) you must include copies of their certifications for them to be considered toward Item 5 in the evaluation criteria. Complete Exhibit I and include all certificates in your electronic submittal.

Litigation:

Disclose any litigation within the past five (5) years arising out your firm's performance, including status/outcome.

City Forms:

Responses should include all City forms as stated above. Required forms must be completed and submitted electronically through the City's eBid System.

5. <u>Insurance Requirements</u>

The insurance described herein reflects the insurance requirements deemed necessary for this contract by the City. It is not necessary to have this level of insurance in effect at the time of submittal, but certificates indicating that the insurance is currently carried or a letter from the Carrier indicating upgrade ability will speed the review process to determine the most qualified Proposer.

The successful Proposer(s) shall not commence operations until certification or proof of insurance, detailing terms and provisions of coverage, has been received and approved by the City of Pompano Beach Risk Manager.

If you are responding to a bid and have questions regarding the insurance requirements hereunder, please contact the City's Purchasing Department at (954) 786-4098. If the contract has already been awarded, please direct any queries and proof of the requisite insurance coverage to City staff responsible for oversight of the subject project/contract.

CONTRACTOR shall not commence services under the terms of this Agreement until certification or proof of insurance detailing terms and provisions has been received and approved in writing by the CITY's Risk Manager. If you are responding to a bid and have questions regarding the insurance requirements hereunder, please contact the CITY's Purchasing Department at (954) 786-4098. If the contract has already been awarded, please direct any queries and proof of the requisite insurance coverage to CITY staff responsible for oversight of the subject project/contract.

CONTRACTOR is responsible to deliver to the CITY for timely review and written approval/disapproval Certificates of Insurance which evidence that all insurance required hereunder is in full force and effect and which name on a primary basis, the CITY as an additional insured on all such coverage.

Throughout the term of this Agreement, CITY, by and through its Risk Manager, reserve the right to review, modify, reject or accept any insurance policies required by this Agreement, including limits, coverages or endorsements. CITY reserves the right, but not the obligation, to review and reject any insurer providing coverage because of poor financial condition or failure to operate legally.

Failure to maintain the required insurance shall be considered an event of default. The requirements herein, as well as CITY's review or acceptance of insurance maintained by CONTRACTOR, are not intended to and shall not in any way limit or qualify the liabilities and obligations assumed by CONTRACTOR under this Agreement.

Throughout the term of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR and <u>all subcontractors or other</u> <u>agents hereunder</u>, shall, at their sole expense, maintain in full force and effect, the following insurance coverages and limits described herein, including endorsements.

A. Worker's Compensation Insurance covering all employees and providing benefits as required by Florida Statute, Chapter 440. CONTRACTOR further agrees to be responsible for

employment, control and conduct of its employees and for any injury sustained by such employees in the course of their employment.

B. Liability Insurance.

- Naming the City of Pompano Beach as an additional insured as CITY's interests may appear, on General Liability Insurance only, relative to claims which arise from CONTRACTOR's negligent acts or omissions in connection with Contractor's performance under this Agreement.
- Such Liability insurance shall include the following checked types of insurance and indicated minimum policy limits.

- C. <u>Employer's Liability</u>. If required by law, CONTRACTOR and all subcontractors shall, for the benefit of their employees, provide, carry, maintain and pay for Employer's Liability Insurance in the minimum amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per employee, Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) per aggregate.
- D. <u>Policies</u>: Whenever, under the provisions of this Agreement, insurance is required of the CONTRACTOR, the CONTRACTOR shall promptly provide the following:
 - (1) Certificates of Insurance evidencing the required coverage;
 - (2) Names and addresses of companies providing coverage;
 - (3) Effective and expiration dates of policies; and
- (4) A provision in all policies affording CITY thirty (30) days written notice by a carrier of any cancellation or material change in any policy.

- E. <u>Insurance Cancellation or Modification</u>. Should any of the required insurance policies be canceled before the expiration date, or modified or substantially modified, the issuing company shall provide thirty (30) days written notice to the CITY.
- F. <u>Waiver of Subrogation</u>. CONTRACTOR hereby waives any and all right of subrogation against the CITY, its officers, employees and agents for each required policy. When required by the insurer, or should a policy condition not permit an insured to enter into a pre-loss agreement to waive subrogation without an endorsement, then CONTRACTOR shall notify the insurer and request the policy be endorsed with a Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others, or its equivalent. This Waiver of Subrogation requirement shall not apply to any policy which includes a condition to the policy not specifically prohibiting such an endorsement, or voids coverage should CONTRACTOR enter into such an agreement on a pre-loss basis.

The successful proposer shall furnish to the City the certification or proof of insurance required by the provisions set forth above, within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract. Certificate(s) to be issued to City of Pompano Beach, Attention Risk Manager, 100 West Atlantic Boulevard, Pompano Beach, Florida, 33060...

6. Selection/Evaluation Process

A Selection/Evaluation Committee will be appointed to select the most qualified firm(s). The Selection/Evaluation Committee will present their findings to the City Commission.

The Committee will rank responses based upon the following criteria.

Additional 0-5% for Tier1/Tier2 Local Business will be calculated on combined scoring totals of each company.

NOTE:

Financial statements that are required as submittals to prequalify for a solicitation will be exempt from public disclosure; however, financial statements submitted to prequalify for a solicitation, and are not required by the City, may be subject to public disclosure.

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<u>Value of Work Previously Awarded to Firm (Tie-breaker)</u> - In the event of a tie, the firm with the lowest value of work as a prime contractor on City of Pompano Beach projects within the last five years will receive the higher ranking, the firm with the next lowest value of work shall receive the next highest ranking, and so on. The analysis of past work will be based on the City's Purchase Order and payment records.

The Committee has the option to use the above criteria for the initial ranking to short-list Proposers and to use an ordinal ranking system to score short-listed Proposers following presentations (if deemed necessary) with a score of "1" assigned to the short-listed Proposer deemed most qualified by the Committee.

Each firm should submit documentation that evidences the firm's capability to provide the services required for the Committee's review for short listing purposes. After an initial review of the Proposals, the City may invite Proposers for an interview to discuss the proposal and meet firm representatives, particularly key personnel who would be assigned to the project. Should interviews be deemed necessary, it is understood that the City shall incur no costs as a result of this interview, nor bear any obligation in further consideration of the submittal.

When more than three responses are received, the committee shall furnish the City Commission (for their approval) a listing, in ranked order, of no fewer than three firms deemed to be the most highly qualified to perform the service. If three or less firms respond to the RLI, the list will contain the ranking of all responses.

The City Commission has the authority to (including, but not limited to); approve the recommendation; reject the recommendation and direct staff to re-advertise the solicitation; or, review the responses themselves and/or request oral presentations and determine a ranking order that may be the same or different from what was originally presented to the City Commission.

7. Hold Harmless and Indemnification

Proposer covenants and agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless the City and all of its officers, agents, and employees from any claim, loss, damage, cost, charge or expense arising out of any act, action, neglect or omission by the Proposer, whether direct or indirect, or whether to any person or property to which the City or said parties may be subject, except that neither the Proposer nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of the City or any of its officers, agents or employees.

8. Right to Audit

Contractor's records which shall include but not be limited to accounting records, written policies and procedures, computer records, disks and software, videos, photographs, subcontract files (including proposals of successful and unsuccessful bidders), originals estimates, estimating worksheets, correspondence, change order files (including documentation covering negotiated settlements), and any other supporting evidence necessary to substantiate charges related to this contract (all the foregoing hereinafter

referred to as "records") shall be open to inspection and subject to audit and/or reproduction, during normal working hours, by Owner's agent or its authorized representative to the extent necessary to adequately permit evaluation and verification of any invoices, payments or claims submitted by the contractor or any of his payees pursuant to the execution of the contract. Such records subject to examination shall also include, but not be limited to, those records necessary to evaluate and verify direct and indirect costs (including overhead allocations) as they may apply to costs associated with this contract.

For the purpose of such audits, inspections, examinations and evaluations, the Owner's agent or authorized representative shall have access to said records from the effective date of this contract, for the duration of the Work, and until 5 years after the date of final payment by Owner to Consultant pursuant to this contract.

Owner's agent or its authorized representative shall have access to the Contractor's facilities, shall have access to all necessary records, and shall be provided adequate and appropriate work space, in order to conduct audits in compliance with this article. Owner's agent or its authorized representative shall give auditees reasonable advance notice of intended audits.

Contractor shall require all subcontractors, insurance agents, and material suppliers (payees) to comply with the provisions of this article by insertion of the requirements hereof in any written contract agreement. Failure to obtain such written contracts which include such provisions shall be reason to exclude some or all of the related payees' costs from amounts payable to the Contractor pursuant to this contract.

9. Retention of Records and Right to Access

The City of Pompano Beach is a public agency subject to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Contractor shall comply with Florida's Public Records Law, as amended. Specifically, the Contractor shall:

- a. Keep and maintain public records required by the City in order to perform the service:
- b. Upon request from the City's custodian of public records, provide the City with a copy of requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes or as otherwise provided by law;
- c. Ensure that public records that are exempt or that are confidential and exempt from public record requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law;
- d. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the Contractor does not transfer the records to the City; and

e. Upon completion of the contract, transfer, at no cost to the City, all public records in possession of the Contractor, or keep and maintain public records required by the City to perform the service. If the Contractor transfers all public records to the City upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. 10.

Communications

No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed by the firm as a result of any discussions with any City employee. Only those communications, which are in writing from the City, may be considered as a duly authorized expression on behalf of the City. In addition, only communications from firms that are signed and in writing will be recognized by the City as duly authorized expressions on behalf of firms.

11. No Discrimination

There shall be no discrimination as to race, sex, color, age, religion, or national origin in the operations conducted under any contract with the City.

12. Independent Contractor

The selected firm will conduct business as an independent contractor under the terms of this contract. Personnel services provided by the firm shall be by employees of the firm and subject to supervision by the firm, and not as officers, employees, or agents of the City. Personnel policies, tax responsibilities, social security and health insurance, employee benefits, purchasing policies and other similar administrative procedures applicable to services rendered under this agreement shall be those of the firm.

13. Staff Assignment

The City of Pompano Beach reserves the right to approve or reject, for any reasons, Proposer's staff assigned to this project at any time. Background checks may be required.

14. Contract Terms

The contract resulting from this RFQ shall include, but not be limited to the following terms:

The contract shall include as a minimum, the entirety of this RFQ document, together with the successful Proposer's proposal. Contract shall be prepared by the City of Pompano Beach City Attorney.

If the City of Pompano Beach defends any claim, demand, cause of action, or lawsuit arising out of any act, action, negligent acts or negligent omissions, or willful misconduct of the contractor, its employees, agents or servants during the performance of the contract, whether directly or indirectly, contractor agrees to reimburse the City of Pompano Beach for all expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs incurred in defending such claim, cause of action or lawsuit.

15. Waiver

16. Survivorship Rights

This contract resulting from this RFQ shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the respective parties and their executors, administrators, heirs, personal representative, successors and assigns.

17. Termination

The contract resulting from this RFQ may be terminated by the City of Pompano Beach without cause upon providing contractor with a least sixty (60) days prior written notice.

Should either party fail to perform any of its obligations under the contract resulting from this RFQ for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such failure, the non-defaulting part will have the right to terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of written notice to the defaulting part of its election to do so. The foregoing rights of termination are in addition to any other rights and remedies that such party may have.

18. Manner of Performance

Proposer agrees to perform its duties and obligations under the contract resulting from this RFQ in a professional manner and in accordance with all applicable local, federal and state laws, rules and regulations.

Proposer agrees that the services provided under the contract resulting from this RFQ shall be provided by employees that are educated, trained and experienced, certified and licensed in all areas encompassed within their designated duties. Proposer agrees to furnish the City of Pompano Beach with all documentation, certification, authorization, license, permit, or registration currently required by applicable laws or rules and regulations. Proposer further certifies that it and its employees are now in and will maintain good standing with such governmental agencies and that it and its employees will keep all license, permits, registration, authorization or certification required by

applicable laws or regulations in full force and effect during the term of this contract. Failure of Proposer to comply with this paragraph shall constitute a material breach of contract.

19. Acceptance Period

Proposals submitted in response to this RFQ must be valid for a period no less than ninety (90) days from the closing date of this solicitation.

20. RFQ Conditions and Provisions

The completed proposal (together with all required attachments) must be submitted electronically to City on or before the time and date stated herein. All Proposers, by electronic submission of a proposal, shall agree to comply with all of the conditions, requirements and instructions of this RFQ as stated or implied herein. All proposals and supporting materials submitted will become the property of the City.

Proposer's response shall not contain any alteration to the document posted other than entering data in spaces provided or including attachments as necessary. By submission of a response, Proposer affirms that a complete set of bid documents was obtained from the eBid System or from the Purchasing Division only and no alteration of any kind has been made to the solicitation. Exceptions or deviations to this solicitation may not be added after the submittal date.

All Proposers are required to provide all information requested in this RFQ. Failure to do so may result in disqualification of the proposal.

4. Technical Approach



TECHNICAL APPROACH

The Project Manager for your proposed project, in this case, a Principal of the Firm, is personally responsible for Quality and Cost Control. Introducing low in initial investment that provide responsible, appropriate and money wise benefit to the City of Pompano Beach and the community will be easily accomplished. At the end of design development, a progress set of plans and an updated opinion of probable cost will be issued to the City of Pompano Beach for review and evaluation.

DOCUMENT. Upon receipt of the City's review of the design development plans, SRS will shepherd the completion of the construction documents. Architectural, Civil Engineering, Landscape Architecture, Structural Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Plumbing and Fire Protection Engineering, Communications Engineering, Site Lighting, Interior Design, Acoustical Design and Cost Estimating plans (where applicable) will be created and Code compliant detailed plans, sections, details, schedules, and specifications will be provided. 

The renovations & addition was completed without interrupting the daily operations of the fire fighters.

In addition, the interior of the building was updated to complement the corporate headquarters that now surround the facility, and the structure and site were brought up to the current City of Miramar ordinances in the process.

SARASOTA COUNTY EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER Sarasota, Florida



This storm-hardened emergency operations center (EOC) replaces Sarasota County's outdated EOC built in 1974 and not rated to withstand a major hurricane. The two-story EOC meets FEMA 361 standards and can withstand 253 mph wind speeds and a category 5 hurricane. During a countywide emergency, it can remain operational for up to 72 hours by self-generating power and can accommodate more than 300 people. A 250 foot communications tower is attached to the building and grounded for lightning strikes to further assure communication continuity during an emergency.

The 40,439 sf EOC houses Sarasota County's 911 emergency communications, 311 call center and sheriff's and fire administration training. It includes administrative offices, a main data room, intermediate distribution frame rooms, conference rooms and multipurpose rooms, along with police and fire response training areas. A media briefing room is equipped with press and FEMA truck pedestals to keep the public informed on a real-time basis.

The EOC has plenty of large displays, projection screens, projectors and LED TV monitors to provide continuous emergency communications and to assist responders in the call center with queuing and call efficienc.

The Category 6A structured cabling system includes 120 terminations that support multiple audio, visual, data and multimedia systems and that link a series of network devices from the EOC to other buildings on the 25-acre government campus. The system also transmits audio and video to the Sheriff's department and press area.

A radio room is used to distribute radio cables from the EOC to radio vendors. Smart-card technology allows keyless entry into and within the building. A CCTV recording system includes high definition (HD)-quality IP cameras with 30-day storage capacity.

The building features automated building systems controls for lighting and HVAC, along with low-flow metered fixtures to conserve water. Other energy efficien enhancements include LED lighting throughout most of the building.

To continue operations for weatherrelated or other emergency events, the EOC includes redundancies in the HVAC system, utility provider and voice and data feeds, along with uninterruptible power supply (UPS) backup and two 1250-kilowatt generators. 

CHARLESTON COUNTY EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER AND CONSOLIDATED 911 CENTER Charleston, South Carolina



Located in the Deep South in beautiful Charleston, South Carolina, this new center brings together the 911 and emergency dispatch operations for law enforcement, EMS and fire operations for multiple jurisdictions operating within Charleston County. The two-story building consolidates the EOC and 911 Call Center functions into one location and includes a backup data center for Charleston County and a Sensitive Compartmented Information Facility (SCIF).

Flexibility, redundancy and survivability were among TLC's design goals. The security systems are fully integrated to include intrusion detection, access control, detention, and video surveillance throughout the facility and parking areas.

Voice Over IP (VOIP) telecommunications are provided by both wired and wireless network communications. Redundant service entrance feeds serve the facility to provide for survivability and connectivity options.

Audio/visual technology was incorporated throughout the facility including training rooms, EOC, 911 center, conference rooms and support spaces. High definition streaming audio and video are controlled using touch screen wired and wireless control systems to facilitate quick access to any number of internal or external audio video resources to allow for quick response to public safety situations.

SUNRISE PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING AND FIRE STATION #72 SUNRISE, FLORIDA

Security, efficiency and cost-effectiveness are the hallmarks of the new Public Safety Building and Fire Station #72. Located on the City's Municipal Complex which includes City Hall, Library, Senior Center and a Cultural/Community Center, the two new buildings were designed to be contextual, efficient to construct and able to withstand natural or man-made disasters and continue to operate for a minimum of 72 hours.

Together, the Public Safety Building and the Fire Station combine to provide the City with a secure, storm-hardened, technologically sophisticated command center for Police and Fire Rescue Services. The five-story Public Safety Building houses the entire operations of the Police Department's 300 employees and includes Joint-use Broward County/City of Sunrise 911 Communications Center, Municipal Emergency Operations Center, data center, indoor eight-lane firing range, law enforcement command vehicle storage and fire-rescue administration/training facilities.

Fire Station #72 is a two-story, four-bay building adjacent to the Public Safety Building and the two buildings share a 4,900 sf central energy plant that provides 100% redundancy to all critical infrastructure components through two 1-megawatt diesel generators and parallel switching gear. Dual water-cooled chillers with a VAV system support the two buildings, providing a comfortable

climate for safety personnel while CRAC units provide the proper environmental conditions in IT rooms on the third and fifth floors of the public safety building. The IT rooms are also equipped with clean agent fire protection systems.

Security and communications are crucial to public safety. TLC designed an IP-based access control system utilizing smart cards that limit access in the complex, with biometric finger print readers on evidence storage lockers. A CCTV system with HD quality IP cameras monitors both interior and exterior of the building and has 30-day capacity. Suspect interview rooms have covert cameras and microphones with a recording system that is independent from the building CCTV system.

Voice/data requirements were met through creatively locating backbone routing for ease in connections. Audio/visual systems are zoned by floors and accessible from the phone system and incorporated with the community room, 911 center, EOC and conference rooms. Additional capacity is provided to a media pedestal external to the building.

Economic conditions benefitted the project through an advantageous bidding climate and created challenges due to reduced tax revenues. TLC's experience on numerous prior public safety complexes led to cost efficient solutions while providing a technologically advanced facility for the future of Sunrise.

Under contract to Harvard Jolly, TLC was part of the design build criteria development team, responsible for the MEP and fire protection systems, along with audio-visual, voice-data and security systems. Subsequently, during the design-build delivery of this project, TLC engineers completed the structural design for this one-story emergency operations communications center.

The facility is situated between the existing Police Department Headquarters and City Hall and serves as a centralized law enforcement communications, emergency dispatch services and city-wide information system, including the 911 center, data center and dispatch center for the cities of Palm Beach Gardens, Jupiter and Juno Beach, along with hosting the city's emergency radio station, AM-1670.

The facility's structural design was developed in accordance with DOE-STD-1020, FEMA 361 and ARC 4496 standards to withstand a minimum of 205 MPH winds. The building structure is 12" concrete masonry units, reinforced and grout-filled solid to resist both wind and impact requirements. The roof is precast concrete joists supporting a 4" reinforced concrete deck. The roof system is supported by the exterior reinforced masonry walls, interior reinforced CMU masonry walls, concrete beams and concrete columns.

The backup generator is located in a hardened space within the building, while the mechanical systems are enclosed in an equipment yard with reinforced concrete masonry and a steel bar grating roof to prevent impact from flying debris.

The 911 call center and data rooms floor slabs were stepped down to accommodate a raised computer floo . The building has no windows and all doors are high impact rated doors to protect the occupants inside.

The facility is connected to the two adjacent buildings with cast-in-place covered walkways that include expansion joints between the canopies and the adjacent buildings. Exterior amenities include a concrete stage from which officials may address the public and hold news casts.

Project challenges included a tight project site and location directly adjacent to two existing buildings. In addition, a major water line along the property required the foundations be stepped down nearly six feet along one side of the building to protect the facility during future utility work.

One of the most technically advanced emergency operation centers in the country, the Collier County Emergency Services Center is also home to the county sheriff's department, EMS team, numerous other county offices and the 9 1 call center.

As a means of meeting the diverse needs and space requirements, TLC met with department representatives in a series of intense user group workshops. Meticulous coordination was required to integrate the heating, ventilation, air conditioning, power, lighting, audio/visual and voice/data and security systems throughout the facility.

The building functions include: New Sheriff's Communications Center with state-of-the-art 911 & dispatch

The technology systems serving the various departments are tied together with a series of network devices that allow each area to communicate with other areas – and enables users to access this information from any computer in the building. The system also sends audio and video from the EOC to other areas such as the 911 center, the Sheriff's department, the press area (which feeds remote satellite truck pedestals for broadcasting) and even a FEMA trailer pedestal.

In addition, TLC implemented a video communications system that allows telephone and video communication between Collier County and other county, state or regional entities. This way, critical documents and crisis updates can be seen as well as heard. The design includes a high-definition video wall with 18-foot-wide split screen and eight 63-inch plasma screens, as well as flat panels monitors throughout the facility.

The building and components were designed to withstand 175 mph wind loads and is in compliance with Collier County Standards for Vertical Construction. The tower was designed to withstand 140 mph sustained winds and 175 mph, three-second bursts with less than 2° sway at the top.

Project Description: The City's new main fire rescue headquarters and emergency management facility were developed to achieve LEED Silver Certification and include a 25,000-SF, two-story complex with four apparatus bays and living quarters for up to 16 firefighters. The new facility will be at SW Corner of Foster Road and NW 1st Avenue. In addition to on-duty fire rescue staff, the building will house the City's Fire Prevention Bureau including office space for fire inspectors, plans review and public education. The City's fire rescue administrative headquarters will be located within the new facility, in addition to its emergency operations, as well as meeting space. Construction documents for the project are complete and it is currently in the permitting phase.
