ASHANTI CULTURAL ARTS & ENRICHMENT, INC.: Turn Around Arts - \$5,000.00 to give children an opportunity to improve their academic and life skills through the Arts.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: College and Career Readiness - \$10,000.00 for the promotion of higher education and higher level career aspirations to over 3,000 Broward County teens through real world, hands-on learning experiences and provides them with the tools to get started on their professional journeys. The Workforce Development Initiative is designed to promote the development of critical employment skills among our youth through research-informed youth development practice, training and experiential learning opportunities that lead to first job readiness and a plan for pursuing post-secondary and/or career aspirations.

BRAZILIAN BUSINESS GROUP INC.: Small Business & Entrepreneurship Training - \$10,000.00 to provide an online program on ways to become an entrepreneur, build a business plan, financing & funding your business, marketing, accounting principles & quickbooks, general HR information, and why the City of Pompano Beach - opportunities and benefits.

BROWARD EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC.: Broward Education Foundation School Supply Center - \$13,500.00 to provide school supplies to the City of Pompano Beach high-need students.

BROWARD PERFORMING ARTS FOUNDATION, INC.: Student Enrichment in the Arts - \$15,000.00 to provide_high-quality virtual performances that reinforce reading, math and science skills, bring historical events to life and immerse students in the art forms and traditions of different cultures. All SEAS presentations are directly aligned with Florida state standards and classroom curriculum, with an emphasis on literacy.

BROWN'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CENTER, INC.: 6th Annual Collier City Family Fun Day - \$3,000.00 for a community event that brings families and community partners together. It consists of free food distribution, back pack give-a-ways, health and wellness screenings, job and career fair, numerous exhibitors, free haircuts for the children, games and activities for the children, and live entertainment in which consist of cultural music for all ethnic groups to enjoy and learn each other cultures.

CANINE ASSISTED THERAPY, INC.: Pet Therapy for Seniors - \$5,500.00 for in person (when they resume) and/or virtual visits with seniors, especially those isolated in nursing homes, assisted living facilities, dementia care centers, hospice, and hospitals, help reduce depression, and feelings of isolation in the elderly.

COVENANT HOUSE FLORIDA, INC.: Youth Employment Services (YES) program for Pompano Beach Youth Under 21 Experiencing Homelessness - \$7,500.00 to help young adults ages 16-21 from the City of Pompano Beach develop skills by engaging them over time with robust learning experiences. The program incorporates career path assessments, job readiness training, clinical groups and life skills, as well as connecting them with employer partner work-based learning experiences to increase the opportunity for at-risk youth to gain the skills, experience, and confidence needed to secure employment that pays a living wage.

CROCKETT FOUNDATION INC.: PEACE Program - \$10,000.00 to engage 50 at-promise students in PEACE - building academic, social/emotional, and life skills through robust after-school and summer programming. Youth follow individualized plans, supported by success coaches and mentors and incentivized for goal progress.

EARLY LEARNING COALITION OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: Child Care Match Program - \$22,500.00 to be used to match funding from state and federal dollars to reimburse child care centers and child care home facilities that provide care to low income children and families in the City of Pompano Beach eligible for child care subsidies.

FAMILY CENTRAL, INC.: The Training Academy at FCI - \$7,500.00 to provide a variety of annual training hours, Continuing Education Units (CEUs) and credentialing programs that support Early Childhood Education (ECE) by preparing child care professionals in all types of early care and education settings, as well as directors and owners of child care centers.

FIRST CALL FOR HELP OF BROWARD, INC.: General Helpline - \$20,000.00 to connect residents in need with services that can help them. First Call for Help of Broward, Inc. dba 2-1-1 provides free and anonymous, round the clock access to crisis intervention, suicide prevention, and general requests for support.

FORT LAUDERDALE INDEPENDENCE TRAINING & EDUCATION CENTER, INC.: Supporting One United Resource Center (SOURC) - \$9,000.00 to serve at least 50 of our youth who are from/reside in Pompano. FLITE Center will specifically target this portion of the population that we serve in order to help them attain and retain employment, housing or continue their education. FLITE Center will recruit youth from Pompano to our GED program or link them to post secondary education.

FRIENDS OF THE NORTHWEST BRANCH OF POMPANO BEACH, INC: Blues and Sweet Potato Festival - \$2,000.00 for a cultural awareness event that celebrates Juneteenth as a reminder of the end of slavery in the United States that features lots of exciting, yet educational attractions.

Fun Day - \$1,000 for a fun filled day for a large number of children/students within the NW, SW and some in the NE sections of Pompano Beach. This event includes handing out between 1300 to 1500 or more backpacks filled with essential school supplies, fun games activities, exhibitors,

free food and drink items, health screenings, educational mentors, financial and self help resources, tennis shoes, hair cuts, food distribution and music.

\$7,000.00 to provide year-round programming and activities for at-risk middle school age youth from Pompano Beach Middle School. The purpose of this program is to strengthen protective factors by helping youth develop resiliency, a positive outlook, healthy family dynamics, prosocial relationships with peers and adults, positive decision making, strong community attachment, and academic success. This program reduces risk factors associated with teen pregnancy, delinquency, substance abuse, family dysfunction, mental and physical health problems, negative peer associations, and school failure.

HILLSBORO LIGHTHOUSE PRESERVATION SOCIETY, INC.: Hillsboro Lighthouse - \$2,500.00 to support free monthly historical tours of the 110-year-old Hillsboro Inlet Lighthouse and the continued operation, maintenance, and preservation of a local, historic monument.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: JA BizTown / JA Finance Park / Personal Finance - \$15,000.00 for a virtual simulated town experience. This is done based on an assigned life-scenario that includes family size, marital status, credit score,education and salary. JA Personal Finance explores fundamental elements of personal finance: earnings, saving and investing, budgeting, credit, risk management, and giving.

LEARNING FOR SUCCESS, INCORPORATED: Kids and the Power of Work (KAPOW) - \$15,000.00 for a unique collaboration between the school district, area businesses, community organizations, and schools. This is accomplished through a powerful set of in-school lessons taught by business volunteers with teachers from local elementary-high schools, field trips to partner work sites, and integrated curriculum activities for teachers to incorporate the real-life application of the skills they teach on a daily basis.

LEARNING FOR SUCCESS, INCORPORATED: My Future Is Now (MFIN) - \$10,000.00 to change the way students experience school by organizing the curriculum, instruction, and guidance services around their strengths, skills, talents, interests, plans and dreams. When this transformation occurs, academic achievement, engagement and motivation increase; student aspirations rise; and many of the difficulties found in our schools are eliminated. Students who have never linked school to a successful future are motivated to do so.

MEN2BOYS, INC.: M2BS Job Readiness, Job Preparedness Program - \$5,000.00 to use field trips in a structured program to promote achievement of the program milestones. In addition

to vocation specific skills, beneficiaries will be taught other lessons in professionalism and money management to make their experience in the workforce as positive as possible. The M2B High Power High School Program will offer two different and complimentary educational programs to its current and new, incoming student mentor beneficiaries. The STEM/Robotics program will take place over the school year and be open to the participation of middle and high school students. The SAT/ACT test preparation program will take place over the school year and be open to the participation of high school students.

MENTAL HEALTH AMERICA OF SOUTHEAST FLORIDA, INC.: Thumbody Programs - \$5,000.00 for a social-emotional learning program for second graders that teaches respect for self, respect for others, responsibility for attitudes and behavior, and knowledge of sources of safe help. Students learn what good mental health means. They also learn to identify and communicate their feelings, positive and negative, so they can be successful in their relationships with others.

OUR FATHER'S HOUSE SOUP KITCHEN, INC.: Bike Academy - \$5,000.00 for a program to receive discarded/used/damaged bicycles and employ one of the area homeless individuals to organize and determine the needs of what is needed to get them back into use.

THE RUSSELL LIFE SKILLS AND READING FOUNDATION, INC.: Russell Reading Room - \$10,000.00 to serve a minimum of 65 elementary school students from low-income families in Pompano Beach who have been identified as at-risk in literacy skills due to a variety of factors, such as learning, economic or language-based difficulties.

UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY OF POMPANO BEACH, INC.: Unity in the Community Family Fun Day - \$6,000.00 for a free of charge Family Fun Day so that residents from all walks of life may attend. There are three components: Exhibitor Area, featuring over 140 booths; Main Stage featuring multi-cultural entertainment and a KidZone with activities for children. At the event, we conduct a live auction and raffle drawings to raise funds for academic scholarships. Food and soft drinks are available at no charge. For 2021, the event will be completely virtual with live and pre-recorded entertainment and presentations.

WOODHOUSE INC.: "Pompano Beach Is Able" - \$5,700.00 to host informational sessions related to keeping seniors and persons with disabilities as independent as long as possible along with connecting them to local services and businesses to help them with that goal.
