SUBJECT: Text Amendments to Chapter 155, Zoning Code

Article 4 – Outdoor Activity & Uses

DATE: August 27, 2024

The Development Services Department has prepared a text amendment to Chapter 155, which clarifies several Uses related to Outdoor Activity in Article 4. The City's Zoning Code explicitly prohibits any "use" not within a totally and permanently enclosed building; however, several uses are permitted where the definition implies that some activity will be performed outside of the building. These amendments distinguish between activities performed outside of a building during business hours and outdoor storage.

Outdoor storage is listed as a separate principal and accessory use. There may be multiple principal uses on a property. When a reference to outdoor storage is made in the definition of a use or outdoor storage is implied in the name, there has been confusion when the districts where permitted do not allow for outdoor storage. These changes aspire to clarify that certain principal uses include outdoor storage as part of the normal operations, but do not require the same perimeter buffer requirements as outdoor storage as a principal use.

In addition to the clarification of outdoor storage/activity, this text amendment creates a new automotive use for vinyl wrapping and tinting facilities as well as clarifies that retail showrooms are permitted within retail establishments.

§ 155.4201. GENERAL

B. Standards Applicable to all Uses

The following use standards shall be applicable to all uses:

1. All uses shall be totally and permanently enclosed within a building, <u>unless otherwise expressly permitted by the use-specific standards</u>.

155.4208.F. Government Maintenance, Storage, or Distribution Facility

2. Definition

A government maintenance, storage, or distribution facility is a facility housing government shops, maintenance and repair centers, equipment, and outdoor storage yards.

3. Standards

a. Outdoor storage yards shall comply with the relevant use-specific standards: Outdoor Storage (as a Principal Use) or Outdoor Storage (as an accessory use).

155.4215. COMMERCIAL: BOAT AND MARINE SALES AND SERVICE USES

A. Standards Applicable to Boat and Marine Sales, and Service, and Storage Uses

- I. Boat and Marine Sales and Service uses that include service, repair, installation, and/or maintenance shall comply with the following standards:
- a. If located in the Heavy Business (B-4) Zoning District, no service, repair, installation, and/or maintenance shall be made except within garages or other buildings designed for these purposes;
- b. In all other districts where permitted, if service, repair, installation and/or maintenance is performed outside of a fully enclosed structure, a type B perimeter buffer shall be provided along all perimeters of the site except where a type C perimeter buffer is required by Section 155.5203.F, Perimeter Buffers;
 - c. The use shall be designed so that the front façade is in compliance with Section 155.5602.C.7, Fenestration/Transparency.
- d. The use shall be designed to ensure proper functioning of the site as related to vehicle stacking, circulation, and turning movements.
- e. No operation associated with the use shall occur in a manner that impedes the normal free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic on adjacent right-of-ways.
- f. All boats shall be maintained in a condition that they may be moved under either under their own power or upon a trailer at any time except when the boat is under repair in garages, body shops, or other buildings.
- g. All trailers shall be maintained in an operable condition, including inflated tires, except when the trailer is under repair in garages, body shops, or other buildings.
 - h. Boats, trailers, and equipment shall not be stored as a source of parts.
- i. Boats, trailers, and equipment that are repaired and awaiting removal shall be stored for no more than 30 consecutive days. Boats, trailers, and equipment abandoned by its lawful owner before or during the repair process may remain on site after the 30 day period, provided the owner or operator of the establishment demonstrates steps have been taken to remove the boat and trailer from the premises using the appropriate legal means.
- 2. Boat Sales and Service uses that include the sale or rental of new or used boats or trailers shall comply with the following standards:
 - a. Boat display pads may be located within a perimeter buffer provided they comply with the following standards:
 - i. The use shall not have more than one display pad for every 100 feet of street frontage.
- ii. The display pads shall not exceed 500 square feet in area and may be elevated up to two feet above adjacent displays or grade level.
 - b. No boat or equipment shall be displayed on the top of a building.
- c. Boats and new trailers may be displayed in a vehicular use area provided the parking spaces used for display shall not be eligible for compliance with Minimum Off-Street Parking requirements.
 - d. No materials for sale, other than boats or equipment, shall be displayed between the principal structure and the street.
- 3. Boat or Marine uses that include the storage of boats or trailers, which are not on display for sale or rent, shall comply with the following standards:

a. A type B perimeter buffer shall be provided between the outdoor storage area(s) and the site's boundaries except where a type C perimeter buffer is required by Section 155.5203.F, Perimeter Buffers;

2. Definition

A boat dry storage facility is a facility used for the on-land storage of boats, other watercraft, and marine equipment. Boat dry storage facilities are distinguished by those where all boat storage occurs within a fully enclosed building and those where it does not.

3. Standards

a. Boat dry storage facilities may store boats both within a fully enclosed building or outdoors, without being classified as Outdoor Storage as defined in Article 9, Part 5 [Terms and Uses Defined]. Screening of this use shall meet the general requirements of section 155.4215.A. Standards Applicable to Boat and Marine Sales, Service, and Storage Uses.

- a. b. In a Marina Business-I (M-I) zoning district, all boat storage shall occur within a fully enclosed building.
- b. c. *In an Office Industrial Park (OIP) and General Industrial (I-I) zoning district, a boat dry storage facility where all any boat storage does not occur within a fully enclosed building is permitted only as a Special Exception.

2. Definition

A boat or marine parts sales with installation use consists of the on-site sale and subsequent installation of various boat or marine parts and accessories—including, but not limited to, engine parts, electronics, navigation systems, anchors, propellers, steering systems, sailing gear, audio systems, safety and flotation gear, and water sports and fishing gear.

3. Standards

a. In a Marine Business (M-I) and Marine Industrial (M-2) zoning district, installation may occur within a fully enclosed building or outdoors, without being classified as Outdoor Storage as defined in Article 9, Part 5 [Terms and Uses Defined]. Screening of this outdoor activity shall meet the general requirements of section 155.4215.A. Standards Applicable to Boat and Marine Sales, Service, and Storage Uses.

2. Definition

A boat or marine repair and servicing use is a business that focuses on the repair or maintenance of boats, marine engines, or marine equipment. Boat repair and servicing uses are distinguished by those where all repair and maintenance activities occur within a fully enclosed building and those where they do not.

a. Sales and rental of boat trailers may be allowed as an accessory use.

b. Boats and/or trailers may be displayed within a fully enclosed building or outdoors, without being classified as Outdoor Storage as defined in Article 9, Part 5 [Terms and Uses Defined]. 2. Definition

A marina is a harbor, boat basin, or other commercial facility that provides secured moorings and/or docking facilities, supplies, or other services for watercraft, including facilities for storing watercraft in or out of the water. This use type does not include the mooring or docking of watercraft at a private dock associated with a residential unit or on private property where no fee is charged.

155.4219. COMMERCIAL: MOTOR VEHICLE SALES AND SERVICE USES

A. Standards Applicable to Motor Vehicle Sales, and Service, and Storage Uses

- I. Motor Vehicle Sales and Service uses that include service, repair, installation, and/or maintenance shall comply with the following standards:
- a. In all Zoning Districts, no service, repair, installation, and/or maintenance shall be made except within garages or other buildings designed for these purposes.
- b. A type B perimeter buffer shall be provided along all perimeters of the site except where a type C perimeter buffer is required by Section <u>155.5203.F</u>, Perimeter Buffers;
 - c. The use shall be designed so that the front façade is in compliance with Section 155.5602.C.7, Fenestration/Transparency.
- d. The use shall be designed to ensure proper functioning of the site as related to vehicle stacking, circulation, and turning movements.
- e. No operation associated with the use shall occur in a manner that impedes the normal free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic on adjacent right-of-ways.
- f. All vehicles, trucks, and trailers shall be maintained in a condition that they may be moved under their own power at any time except when the boat vehicle is under repair in garages, body shops, or other buildings.
 - g. Vehicles, trucks, and trailers shall not be stored as a source of parts.

 - i. The use shall not have more than one display pad for every 100 feet of street frontage.
- ii. The display pads shall not exceed 500 square feet in area and may be elevated up to two feet above adjacent displays or grade level.
 - b. No vehicle, truck, and trailer shall be displayed on the top of a building.
- c. Vehicles, trucks, and trailers may be displayed in a vehicular use area provided the parking spaces used for display shall not be eligible for compliance with Minimum Off-Street Parking requirements.
- d. No materials for sale, other than vehicles, trucks and trailers, shall be displayed between the principal structure and the street.
- 3. Motor vehicle uses that include vehicular storage yards, which are not on display for sale or rent, shall comply with the following standards:

2. Definition

A car wash or auto detailing use is an establishment providing the washing of the exterior of vehicles where vehicles are manually driven or pulled by a conveyor through a system of rollers and/or brushes. Interior cleaning and/or drying may be conducted manually outdoors by vehicle operator or on-site attendants. Interior cleaning and/or drying may be conducted manually by the vehicle operator or on-site attendants.

3. Standards

A car wash or auto detailing use shall comply with the following standards:

- a. The use shall be designed to ensure proper functioning of the site as related to vehicle stacking, circulation, and turning movements.
 - b. No overhead doors shall face the front lot line.
- c. Each lane shall be covered with a permanent canopy which shall have a maximum clearance height of 14 feet above grade, except where state or federal law requires a higher clearance.
- d. Outdoor activity may occur during business hours; such activity shall be limited to the washing, drying and other superficial detailing of the interior/ exterior of the vehicles in accordance with an approved site plan.
- e. Screening of this use shall meet the general requirements of section 155.4219.A. Standards Applicable to Motor Vehicle Sales, Service, and Storage Uses.
- f. A drive-through that is incorporated as an essential function of the operation shall be permitted by right as accessory to the principal business. Therefore, this use shall not be subject to the accessory use standards for Drive-Through Services within Code Section 155.4303.1.

2. Definition

An automotive maintenance facility is an establishment primarily engaged in providing repair and maintenance services for automotive vehicles such as passenger cars, sports utility vehicles, pickup and other light trucks, small vans, and motorcycles. The use includes oil change and lubrication shops (which primarily engage in checking and changing motor oil and lubricating the chassis of automobiles), automotive glass shops (which primarily engage in replacing, and repairing, and/or tinting the windows and other glass in automobiles), and general automotive repair garages or shops (which primarily engage in providing a wide range of mechanical and electrical repair and maintenance services for automotive vehicles, including diagnosing, rebuilding, or reconditioning of engines and other mechanical and electrical systems). This use does not include automotive painting or body shops or establishments primarily engaged in the repair and servicing of large trucks, recreational vehicles, and trailers (which typically have greater impacts on adjacent properties), or tire sales and mounting, muffler/transmission sales and installation, and automotive parts and installation uses (which combine retail sales with installation and servicing of automotive components).

3. Standards

a. Fleet vehicles may be stored within a fully enclosed building or outdoors, without being classified as Outdoor Storage as defined in Article 9, Part 5 [Terms and Uses Defined]. Screening shall meet the general requirements for vehicular storage yards within section 155.4219.A. Standards Applicable to Motor Vehicle Sales, Service, and Storage Uses.

2. Definition

Other retail sales establishments include any establishment primarily engaged in the sale, rental, and incidental servicing of goods or commodities that are generally delivered or provided on the premises to a consumer, and that is not specifically listed in the principal use tables. Examples include, but are not limited to, furniture stores, floor covering stores, window treatment stores, computer and electronics stores, camera stores, optical goods stores, clothing stores, shoe stores, luggage stores, jewelry stores, sporting goods stores, piece goods stores, department stores, florists, office supply stores, gift stores, and pet supply stores. - d. The use shall be designed so that service bays are not visible from an adjoining street.
- e. No heavy equipment displays shall be located within a required yard or perimeter buffer.

 - g. No heavy equipment shall be displayed on the top of a building.

2. Definition

Outdoor storage as an accessory use is the keeping, in an area that is not totally and permanently enclosed on the site of a principal use, of any finished goods, material, merchandise, boats, or vehicles associated with the principal use in the same place for more than 24 hours. This use does not include fleet vehicles associated with an approved business, a junkyard or salvage facility or the display and storage of vehicles as part of an automobile, recreational vehicle, trailer, or truck sales or rental use.

3. Standards

Outdoor storage may be allowed as an accessory use to any commercial or industrial use, subject to the following standards:

- a. Perimeter buffer and screening standards
- i. A Type B perimeter buffer in accordance with Section <u>155.5203.F</u>, Perimeter Buffers, shall be provided between the outdoor storage area(s) and all property lines.
- (A) Existing properties. Lawfully existing outdoor storage established prior to 1999, or lawfully existing outdoor storage established prior to annexation without a Landscape Plan approved on record shall comply with the perimeter buffer and screening standards of this section. Submission and approval of a landscape plan shall be required for compliance with this section.
 - (I) The modifications permitted in Section <u>155.4228.A</u>.3.a.ii.(A) may be permitted.
- b. The total area of outdoor storage areas shall not exceed 35 percent of the total gross floor area of the building(s) containing the principal use(s) of the lot.
- c. Each outdoor storage area shall be incorporated into the overall design of the principal structure on the site, and shall be located to the side or rear of the principal structure, and not on the roof of a structure.
- d. Goods stored in an outdoor storage area intended for sale or resale shall be limited to those sold on the premises in conjunction with the principal use.
- e. Properties whose outdoor storage consists solely of building materials for sale by the principal business and are located within the Heavy Business (B-4) Zoning District may, as an alternative to the requirements in subsection i. above, provide a six foot high solid concrete wall and solid gate.

f. The height of the materials and equipment stored shall not exceed the height of the screening fence or wall.

Automotive Repair and Maintenance Facility

An establishment primarily engaged in providing repair and maintenance services for automotive vehicles such as passenger cars, sports utility vehicles, pickup and other light trucks, small vans, and motorcycles. The use includes oil change and lubrication shops (which primarily engage in checking and changing motor oil and lubricating the chassis of automobiles), automotive glass shops (which primarily engage in replacing, repairing, and/or tinting the windows and other glass in automobiles), and general automotive repair garages or shops (which primarily engage in providing a wide range of mechanical and electrical repair and maintenance services for automotive vehicles, including diagnosing, rebuilding, or reconditioning of engines and other mechanical and electrical systems). This use does not include automotive painting or body shops or establishments primarily engaged in the repair and servicing of large trucks, recreational vehicles, and trailers (which typically have greater impacts on adjacent properties), or tire sales and mounting, muffler/transmission sales and installation, and automotive parts and installation uses (which combine retail sales with installation and servicing of automotive components).

Automotive Vinyl Wrapping and Tinting Facility

An automotive vinyl wrapping and tinting facility is an establishment primarily engaged in providing vehicle wrapping and window tinting services for automotive vehicles such as passenger cars, sports utility vehicles, pickup and other light trucks, small vans, and motorcycles

Automotive Wrecker Service

An establishment operated for the purpose of temporary storage on-site of towed and recovered motor vehicles, including operable, wrecked or inoperable motor vehicles. If an establishment regularly stores inoperable vehicles for more than 90 days, stacks vehicles, or portions of the vehicles are dismantled or removed for sale, it shall be considered a salvage and junkyard.

Boat Dry Storage Facility

A facility used for the on-land storage of boats, other watercraft, and marine equipment. This use type is further divided into those facilities where all boat storage occurs within a fully enclosed building and those that where it does not.

Boat or Marine Repair and Servicing

A business that focuses on the repair or maintenance of boats, marine engines, or marine equipment. This use type is further divided into those facilities where all repair and maintenance activities occur within a fully enclosed building and those that where they do not.

Car Wash or Auto Detailing

An establishment providing the washing of exterior of vehicles where vehicles are manually driven or pulled by a conveyor through a system of rollers and/or brushes. Interior cleaning and/or drying may be conducted manually <u>outdoors</u> by vehicle operator or on-site attendants. Interior cleaning and/or drying may be conducted manually by the vehicle operator or on-site attendants.

Other Retail Sales Establishment

Examples include, but are not limited to, furniture stores, floor covering stores, window treatment stores, computer and electronics stores, camera stores, optical goods stores, clothing stores, shoe stores, luggage stores, jewelry stores, sporting goods stores, piece goods stores, department stores, florists, office supply stores, gift stores, and pet supply stores. A retail showroom shall be permitted within any retail sales establishment.
