I would like to take this opportunity to not only commend, but to also nominate Deputy Brandon Marston/19219 for his outstanding performance during a call in which he performed lifesaving measures for a woman who had been involved in a serious vehicle crash. (11-2401-008881)

On January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024, deputies responded to the 1500 block of S. Federal Hwy in reference to a report of a serious crash with injuries involving 2 vehicles. Upon arrival, Deputy Marston located one of the victims involved in the crash who suffered serious life threatening injuries/lacerations to her leg which was bleeding profusely. Deputy Marston, without hesitation, immediately jumped into action and began life saving efforts by applying a tourniquet. Deputy Marston maintained a calm demeanor, comforting the victim and notifying dispatch that a tourniquet had been applied so this information could be relayed to rescue personnel.

Pompano Beach Fire Rescue arrived and transported the victim to Broward Health North. Due to the seriousness of the injuries, a deputy was assigned to accompany Fire Rescue to the hospital and relay the victim's status to the On-Scene Commander. Upon their arrival at the hospital, it was noted that the attending doctor and medical staff stated had it not been for the tourniquet being applied it was very possible that the victim could've succumbed to her injuries and that the tourniquet saved her life.

Due to his outstanding job performance and actions, I would like to nominate Deputy Brandon Marston for the Broward Sheriffs Office Life Saving Award and for the Employee of the Month for the Pompano District, for had it not been for his life saving efforts the victim of the serious crash may have passed away from her injuries.
