The meeting was held to evaluate the proposals received in response to the City's solicitation to select a firm to provide professional consulting services for design, bidding, and construction phase services to the City for the Public Safety Complex. This meeting was posted as a "Public Meeting" both at City Hall and at the Purchasing Division office, and on the City's website. Seven (7) firms submitted responses to the City's Request for Qualifications (RFQ).

Horacio Danovich led the technical discussion. The Purchasing Agent reviewed evaluation procedures and distributed Conflict of Interest Statements for completion by all voting members. The Purchasing Agent distributed a spreadsheet indicating the points to be assigned for MBE participation. Each Committee member had reviewed all of the responses in advance of the meeting.

The Committee discussed each of the proposals in alphabetical order, and scored the responses using voting forms containing the evaluation criteria published in the RFQ, with the following results:

The consensus of the Committee was that the top scored firm would be recommended for a contract. An agenda item will be prepared to present the Committee's recommendation to the City Commission for their approval to negotiate a contract with the highest ranked firm as detailed above.
