SUBJECT: Emergency Purchase Orders for 42" Force Main Repair

On January 4, 2019 a subcontractor working for Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) ruptured a 42" pressurized sewage pipe which spilled 52 MG into the canal system from NW 15th Street east to the Intracoastal Waterway. The City contacted several Utilities and companies to assist with the repair and remediation process. After the repair, over 118 Aerators were placed in the canals creating oxygen to minimize the odor. The City worked with environmental regulators from Broward County and the State of Florida to insure all environmental concerns were addressed.

Due to the state of the emergency we were unable to solicit bids. A number of emergency purchase orders were requested from our purchasing department. A list of all organizations, contractors and cost associated with the Force Main Break is attached. We are anticipating some additional charges from Broward County and Pace Analytical for daily testing and sampling. We will forward those as they become available. With instructions from our Finance department, the following accounts were used to create the emergency purchase orders relating to the Force Main Break.
