Maggie,

Last night, I attended the Islamic Center's open house, where they discussed the proposed rezoning with the community. I thought it was well attended (at least 50 people) and productive. Below you will find an outline of the program and items of concerned identified by the Community:

- The President of the Board, introduced himself and provided an overview of the proposal (Rezoning from RM-12 to CF).
 - o Stated that the Islamic Center has been a part of the Community since the 80s.
 - o Listed some of the services that they offer to the community, because part of their mission as Muslims is to give back/serve the Community:
 - Provide "Saturday School" (equivalent of "Sunday School) for their parishioners
 - Hold Monthly Health Screenings (open to any member of the public, not exclusively members of the Mosque)
 - Donate to Food pantry, and coordinate with Markham Elementary
 - o Explained the Program/ layout of the Mosque
 - There are two buildings on-site: (1) the Prayer Center, (2) the Daycare / School
 - When they were designing/ building the mosque, they were told that if they wanted to have a school there, that they would need to rezone the property. The property allows for daycare, but not for grade school, middle school or high school.
 - o Explained that they want to apply for the rezoning so that in the future, if there is a demand to operate a daily / regular Islamic private school that they would be able to. The President stressed that there are no immediate plans to operate a school, and that there are no long term plans to build any addition or expansion to operate a school. They intend to use the 2-story building with the ~14 classrooms.
- The President took questions and listened to the concerns of the community, and tried to answer questions:
 - Will the school be in one of the existing buildings? Yes.
 - o Is it the intention of the Mosque to buy any of the surrounding Properties? No.
 - Why are they rezoning the property, if they already have the buildings constructed? The zoning doesn't allow for a full-time school at this time the zoning allows them to do their Saturday School/ Childcare.
 - Will this be a public or a private school? Private.
 - Will you be hurting or helping Markham Elementary by having a school right next door? Not hurting!
 Hopefully helping...
 - o Will you be offering teaching jobs to the Community? Yes, if there are qualified teachers, when the need arises we may be adding jobs for the school.
 - What is the maximum number of students that you anticipate? The existing building with the existing classrooms, as an estimate, would not allow for more than 180 – 200 student capacity.
 - O Do you have a timeline, as far as when you might start enrollment for a school? No.
 - o Comments:
 - Be mindful of the security of the area. Lately schools are under attack & an Islamic School would only seem like a greater target.

- The difference between your proposal and your neighbors proposal is that they won't be evolving into a Middle School or High School, and you will. You can't compare yourself to Markham Elementary. That school was built for the children of migrant farmers.
- "We know that you are connected to the Convenience Store operators on MLK Blvd, and you are allowing drugs into our neighborhood." We are not connected to the businesses. Not all Muslims in the area come to this church. Not all people that identify as muslims, are following the teachings of the Qur'an just like not all "Christians" follow the teachings of the Bible.
- Dr. Khalilah Camacho Ali, former wife of Muhammad Ali, spoke to those in attendance about the similarities between the Muslim religion and the Christian religion.
- Beverly Perkins thanked the Islamic Center for opening their doors to the Community to allow them to better understand the proposal.
- The President gave a walk-thru of the 2 buildings.
- The Islamic Center hosted those in attendance for dinner.
