Request for a Resolution for the Adoption of Countywide Multijurisdictional Enhanced

Local Mitigation Strategy

Please prepare a Resolution for the next available City Commission meeting, approving and authorizing the adoption of the Countywide Multijurisdictional Enhanced Local Mitigation Strategy.

Given the fact that the City of Pompano Beach is located in an area that is vulnerable to natural and manmade disasters, the State of Florida has stipulated that a Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) be adopted. This is the first step in the process of making our community better prepared to manage large-scale disasters and document and improve coordination with our neighbors.

Broward County has updated the Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS). The final version, dated September 2017, was reviewed by the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management. The Local Hazard Mitigation Plan was approved pending adoption. Included with this memo is an updated Resolution from Broward County (2017-650) adopting the update of the Multijurisdictional Enhanced Local Mitigation Strategy Plan dated December 12, 2017.

WHEREAS, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) regulation 44 C.F.R. § 201.6(d)(3) requires local jurisdictions to review and update their Local Mitigation Strategy plans (LMS) every five (5) years to reflect changes in development, progress in mitigation efforts, and changes in priorities in order to maintain eligibility for mitigation project grant funding; and

WHEREAS, these plans serve as blueprints for mitigation planning to assist local governments in reducing threats from natural and man-made hazards; and

WHEREAS, these plans are submitted to the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) for initial review and coordination, then to the FEMA for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, on January 5, 2010, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") adopted Resolution No. 2010-015, which approved the December 2009 LMS; and

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2013, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2013-034, which approved an Enhanced Local Mitigation Strategy (ELMS) modifying and improving the previous LMS; and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2016, the Board approved an Agreement between Broward County (the "County") and FDEM for the Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program in support of an enhanced mitigation planning program; and

 WHEREAS, on June 12, 2017, and August 17, 2017, the County's Emergency Management Division (EMD) held public meetings to gather public comments prior to submitting the proposed ELMS to the FDEM and FEMA for final review and approval; and

WHEREAS, on October 18, 2017, the FDEM issued an approval of the proposed ELMS pending adoption by the County; and

WHEREAS, FEMA's approval of the County's current ELMS will expire on March 18, 2018, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA:

- Section 1. That the foregoing clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.
- Section 2. That the Board hereby adopts the multijurisdictional ELMS plan approved by FDEM as meeting all current requirements for such a plan.

## Section 3. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>.

If any portion of this Resolution is determined by any Court to be invalid, the invalid portion shall be stricken, and such striking shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Resolution. If any Court determines that this Resolution, or any portion hereof, cannot be legally applied to any individual(s), group(s), entity(ies), property(ies), or circumstance(s), such determination shall not affect the applicability hereof to any other individual, group, entity, property, or circumstance.

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. § 5 165, as amended by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, (DMA2K) (P.L. 106-390), provides for states, tribes and local governments to undertake hazard mitigation planning to reduce the risks from natural hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has implemented various hazard mitigation planning provisions pursuant to 44 C.F.R. §201.6, and requires local governments to have a FEMA approved mitigation plan in order to apply for and receive project grants; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 44 C.F.R. § 201.6(d)(3), FEMA requires local jurisdictions to review and revise their local mitigation plan to reflect changes in development, progress in local mitigation efforts, and changes in priorities, and resubmit the local mitigation plan for approval to continue to be eligible for FEMA mitigation project grant funding; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Administrative Code governs the application, project selection and distribution of funds by the state of the FEMA Hazard mitigation program funds and requires local government to develop a Local Mitigation Strategy plan (LMS) to reduce the identified hazards within a county; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners last adopted the current Broward County LMS on January 5, 2010, and FEMA approved the same; and

WHEREAS, Enhanced Local Mitigation Strategy (ELMS) was transmitted to FEMA through the Florida Division of Emergency Management in October 2012, and FEMA found same to be in compliance with the local mitigation requirements of Section 322 of the DMA2K as implemented in 44 C.F.R. § 201.6; and

WHEREAS, by adopting the Broward County October 2012 Revision of the Local Mitigation Strategy, the framework for future mitigation efforts and post-disaster recovery may be made easier and faster; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF POMPANO BEACH, FLORIDA:

**SECTION 1.** That the City of Pompano Beach adopts the most recent Broward County Enhanced Local Mitigation Strategy as its mitigation plan.
