Subject: Draft Language for PC 18-5 (Hidden Harbor Land Use Plan Amendment - Pompano Beach)

Good morning, Greg, Kim and Maggie. Just wanted to touch base in follow-up to last week's Planning Council meeting. As you may know, the next Council meeting is scheduled for April 26, and the Council staff deadline for submittal of additional materials is, I believe, a couple of weeks before that. We are available at your convenience to discuss and work through the issue concerning evacuation shelter staffing. To assist in such discussion, below is draft language that the City can consider that speaks to County staff's previous suggestion and would generally address the concern. I have shared this language below with George Platt for his information.

In the event a Broward County "Zone B" storm evacuation is ordered, the city of Pompano Beach commits to provide City employees for service, meeting the appropriate eligibility and training requirements, consisting of four (4) evacuation shelter managers, and fifteen (15) evacuation shelter support staff. Evacuation shelter staff provided via the city of Pompano Beach are to be assigned and deployed to evacuations shelters in the city of Pompano Beach, unless, due to the scale of the evacuation emergency and/or the unavailability of evacuation shelter facilities, such would reasonably pose an imminent threat to the safety of those in the general public seeking shelter. It is noted and acknowledged by the City that training for the upcoming storm season is expected to be offered by the County in May, 2018.
