



Pompano Beach Crossroads Grant Awarded 2017 Creative Arts District

The City received a \$100,000 Our Town "creative placemaking" grant from the National Endowments of the Arts (NEA) for a two-year grant period October 2017 – September 2019. *Pompano Beach Crossroads* is a collaborative project of the City and Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA). Projects associated with the Grant are featured in the City's Creative Arts District. Public Art Projects completed associated with this Grant to this date are the *Trail of the Honey Bees*, a *Painted Pompano Round 2* sculpture located at the Cultural Arts Plaza, multiple murals located in Artists Alley, and *We Go Together*.



In Progress, Completed & Planned Projects

- Mosaic Team Project: A Subcommittee was created and selected artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene and artist team to create designs and install multiple murals in designated areas. This is a four year project. The artist has been contracted for two years and the City has the ability to extend the contract on a yearly basis.
 - Project 1 (Completed): The first project Trail of the Honey Bees has been completed. The fabrication of the 35 mosaics has been completed and 34 of the mosaics have been installed, the 35th mosaic is tentatively waiting for its location. The Trail connects the community and the cultural arts facilities in the Innovative and Creative Art District through Artwork and education.
 - o <u>Project 2 (Completed):</u> The second project to the Program *Music Leads the Way* has been completed and installed at the Pompano Beach Amphitheater.
 - Project 3 (In Progress): The third project for the Program has been approved by the City Commission. The artwork, entitled *Community*, has been fabricated and is tentatively set to be installed by January 2020 at the Charlotte Burrie Community Center.
 - Project 4 (In Progress): The forth project for the Program has been approved by the City Commission. The artwork, entitled Wow, has been fabricated and is planned to be installed by the beginning of FY 2020 at the corner of west Palm Aire Drive and Oaks Drive in a recently built City gazebo.
- <u>Oasis Sculpture (Completed)</u>: Artist Cecilia Lueza was commissioned to design, fabricate, and install a sculpture with the theme of Pompano Beach's Oasis Reuse Program. The sculpture is located in front of Pompano Beach's Oasis Reuse facility.
- <u>Collier City Artist in Residence (Completed)</u>: Artist Ya La'ford was selected as the Collier City Artist in Residence. This was a one year project with eleven community engagement activities and three artist lectures ending in a final installation of an artwork valued at a \$13,250.00. The final permanent artwork is located inside the Jane Moran Collier City Library.
- <u>9-11 Memorial (Completed)</u>: Artist Cherie Saleeby was commissioned to design, fabrication, and install a 9-11 Memorial using a piece of steel from the Twin Towers that was acquired by the Pompano Beach Fire Department. The sculpture is located at Founders Park.
- <u>Sculpture for pompano Beach Cultural Center South Entrance (Completed):</u> The City purchase a prefabricated sculpture by famed Australian artist Team Gillie and Marc Schattner entitled *We Go Together*. The sculpture is located at the south entrance of the Pompano Beach Cultural Center.

- <u>Utility Wrap Phase 2 (Completed):</u> The City plans to wrap utility boxes on major arterials and in several neighborhoods. The goal of the program is to reduce blight along the corridors by transforming a utility box into a piece of art. This beautification effort will enhance the experience of all those visiting the corridors and will help to prevent boxes from being vandalized, primarily with posters. Phase 1 and Phase 2 have been completed with a total of ninety (90) utility boxes wrapped.
- <u>Utility Box Phase 3 (In Progress):</u> The Public Art Committee is in the progress of completing round 3 of the Utility Box Wrap project. After this round, all traffic signal boxes in the city will be wrapped. See map below for locations.



Mosaic Team Term 2 (In Progress): The Mosaic Team is a multi-year program of mosaic artworks
created and installed by five apprentices, under the leadership of an experienced mosaic artist. The
lead artist is responsible to pay the five (5) apprentices \$3,000.00 each for a total of \$15,000.00 each
year.

A Call to Artists was issued FY 2016 and lead artist Sonata Kazimieraitiene and her team of apprentices were selected for the Term 1. Ms. Kazimieraitiene's agreement is for a period of two years and the Committee has decided to extend Ms. Kazimieraitiene's residence for Term 2. The project will take place at the Beach near the Great Lawn. Staff is currently working with the artist and the City Attorney's office to execute the Agreement for Term 2.

- <u>Underwater Reef Sculpture (In Progress):</u> This is a program that will take place every two years until 2025. The artwork itself has a budget of \$35,000 and a \$5,000 budget for installation and other fees concerning installation. Artist Donald Gialanella has been selected to design, fabricate, and install the artwork temporarily entitled *Pirates Treasure Chest* on land. After one (1) year, the artwork will be sunk and attached the *Lady Luck* in Shipwreck Park, LLC. The artwork is tentatively set to be installed by December 2020 and will be sunk in FY2021.
- <u>Cultural Arts Center Future Arts Project (In Progress):</u> This project, originally stated in the Master Plan, allocated \$50,000 in 2018 and 2020. The Committee has been working on this concept since 2013. In the FY 2018 Annual Plan, the full amount of funds were placed into one account in an effort to commission a significant artwork for the Cultural Arts Center, 50 W. Atlantic Blvd. The artwork's location is on the North Entrance of the Cultural Arts Center facing Atlantic Blvd. Artist Michael Szabo has been selected

to design, fabricate, and install the sculpture entitled *Current*. The sculpture is scheduled to be installed FY2020.

- Ali Cultural Arts Sculpture / Sculpture on MLK between I-95 and Dixie Highway (In Progress): This
 project is for a pre-fabricated sculpture that will be placed in front of the Historic Ali Cultural Arts on
 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Blvd. The Committee is currently working with a recommended artist and
 the City Attorney's office.
- <u>Blanche Ely High School Mural (In Progress):</u> At the City Commission meeting on September 25, 2018, the Commission directed the Public Art Committee to research and commission a mural honoring Melvin Randall, the Blanche Ely Basketball Coach and Broward County Sports Hall of Fame inductee. The Public Art Committee is looking into placing the mural on an exterior wall located at Blanche Ely High School with a theme of the School's mascot- the Mighty Tiger, and Coach Randall.
- Community Park Water Feature Project (In Progress): An artist/artist team will be commissioned to design, fabricate and install a major outdoor sculpture with a water feature to be placed at Community Park. The Community Park also contains the Aquatic Center which is home to an Olympic sized pool with two one-meter springs boards. The artwork budget will be \$147,000; \$3,000 will used to fund shortlisted artists designs. The Committee is currently working on recommending an artist for the project. The artwork will be installed FY2020.
- <u>Powerline Road Sculpture (In Progress):</u> An artist/artist team will be commissioned to design, fabricate, and install a free standing sculpture located on the east side of Powerline Road and McNab Road. This will be an entryway sculpture. Fee includes the creation of proper foundation and exterior lighting. A Call to Artists is currently being circulated.
- Artists Alley Painted Mural (In Progress): Artist Timothy Smith has been selected to complete a
 photorealistic, painted mural on the back exterior wall of the Bailey Contemporary Arts, located at 41
 NE 1st St. The mural will continue the beautification efforts of the City in the area known as Artists
 Alley. The mural will tentatively be installed November/December 20219.
- Artists Alley Mosaic Mural (In Progress): Artist Cindy Trezona has been selected to complete a mosaic mural on the west exterior wall of a building located at 135 NE 1st Ave. The mural will continue the beautification efforts of the City in the area known as Artists Alley. The mural will be installed by December 2019.
- Maintenance of Painted Pompano Round 1: Pompano Pop (In Progress): Funding from the
 Maintenance Fund will be used to repaint the one of the sculptures apart of Painted Pompano Round
 1, which took place in 2015, entitled *Pompano Pop* by artist Agata Ren.
- Maintenance of Painted Pompano Round 1: Pop Pop 's Pompano (In Progress): Funding from the Maintenance Fund will be used to repaint the one of the sculptures apart of Painted Pompano Round 1, which took place in 2015, entitled Pop Pop's Pompano by artist Jim Collins.

- MLK Blvd. Mural 1, 2, & 3 (Paused): Due to issues concerning murals on MLK Blvd., these projects are currently on hold for further investigation.
- <u>South Dixie Highway Project (Paused)</u>: Originally budgeted for FY2016. This is an ongoing project and is currently on hold.
- <u>Cultural Center Crosswalk (Paused)</u>: This project will create a temporary mural crosswalk on SE 1st Ave. from the newly created Cultural Arts Center to City Hall. A Call to Artists has been created for an artist/artist team to develop a crosswalk design. This is a community engagement project and the selected artist(s) will work with residents/volunteers to install the artwork. The purpose of this project is to not only beautify the streets and connect City Hall and the Cultural Arts Center, but also to strengthen the community and give them a sense of pride and ownership to the finished artwork. The selected artist(s) will be responsible for any required permitting and must be available to make any repairs that happen within the two years of the completed installation. This project is currently on hold due to traffic engineering issues.
- Art Installation in Collier City/McNair Park Mural (Paused): An artist/artist team will be selected to
 design and install an artwork in Collier City. The exact location and form of artwork has yet to be
 decided. Possible artworks include a mural or sculpture. Original location noted in Master Plan: McNair
 Park Gymnasium Wall. This project is currently on hold while renovations to the Park are being
 completed.

Proposed Projects

- A1A & Atlantic Boulevard Median Sculpture (\$30,000): An artist/artist team will be commissioned to design, fabricate and install a free standing sculpture located at the median of the terminus of Atlantic Blvd (intersection of Atlantic Blvd. and A1A). Any necessary engineering and permitting will be the responsibility of the artist.
- <u>Underwater Sculpture Park Sculpture 2 (\$40,000)</u>: This is a program that will take place every two years until 2025. This will be the second sculpture as part of this program. The artwork itself has a budget of \$35,000 and a \$5,000 budget for installation and other fees concerning installation. An artist/artist team will design and fabricate a sculpture that will be displayed at the beach for a one year. After a year, it will be submerged into the ocean and attached to *Lady Luck* in shipwreck Park.
- Old Town Plaza Mural (\$15,000): A mural will be commissioned by an artist/artist team to be installed at on the back exterior wall of Benzer Pharmacy and Odd Breed Brewery, located at 60 & 50 NE 1st Ave. The size of the wall is approximately 130' long by 20' high. The mural will be a significant gateway to downtown. Possible themes include patterns, simple and flowing, abstract, bright colors, festive, and welcoming. This project was requested by Mayor Hardin and the Benzer Pharmacy property owners. The funding for this project has been reallocated from the Fishing Village project.

- Mosaic Team Term 3 (\$50,000): The Mosaic Team is a multi-year program that consists of mosaic artworks created and installed by five apprentices, under the leadership of an experienced mosaic artist. Lead artist shall be responsible to pay the five (5) apprentices \$3,000.00 each for a total of \$15,000.00 each year. The City has the option to continue working with the current Mosaic Team lead artist Sonata Kazimieraiteine.
 - Lead artist and apprentices will develop mosaics for the front and back of the overpass columns under I-95 over MLK Blvd. Necessary permits from MOT must be acquired. Project budget \$50,000 including apprentices' payment.
- Opportunity/Contingency Projects (\$10,000): The Public Art Committee sets aside funding to be able to take advantage of unknown opportunities throughout the year. As stated in the Master Plan, this is flexible money for new project ideas. This money could also be used as a small contingency for unknown expenses associated with other projects. All purchasing thresholds and building requirements will be met. Staff can take recommendations to the City Commission if it is deemed appropriate. Anything that would otherwise need Commission approval will be taken to the City Commission. Any Opportunity/Contingency Projects will be reported in the next FY Annual Plan.

Administration and Maintenance:

- <u>Maintenance (\$10,150):</u> 7% of the cost of permanent work will be reserved for maintenance and used as needed.
- <u>Program Management (\$35,000)</u>: The Public Art Program has grown to a level that requires an individual dedicated the management as their sole responsibilities. A part-time staff employee has been hired to continue to operate this program.
- <u>Operations (\$5,000)</u>: This funding is set aside to operate the program. Expenses could be used for areas such as permitting, supplies, printing, administrative expenses, minor project needs, etc.
