AREAWIDE COUNCIL ON AGING OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: 2022 Fair Share: \$50,000 to prevent or delay premature institutionalization of elders.

ASHANTI CULTURAL ARTS & ENRICHMENT, INC.: Turn Around Arts: \$5,000 to give children an opportunity to improve their academic and life skills through the Arts.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: College and Career Readiness: \$10,000 to promote the development of critical employment skills among our youth through research-informed youth development practice, training, and experiential learning opportunities that lead to first job readiness and a plan for pursuing post-secondary and/or career aspirations. The Workforce Development Initiative strives to increase teen's employability through career exploration, mentorship, opportunities to earn credentials, soft skills training, technical skills training, hands-on learning, and career experiences.

BROWARD EDUCATION FOUNDATION, INC.: Broward Education Foundation School Supply Center: \$13,500 to provide school supplies to the City of Pompano Beach high-need students.

BROWARD PARTNERSHIP FOR THE HOMELESS, INC.: North Homeless Assistance Center: \$18,000 to quickly transition clients from homelessness to jobs, health, and housing.

BROWARD PERFORMING ARTS FOUNDATION, INC.: Student Enrichment in the Arts (SEAS): \$15,000 to provide high-quality, professionally produced virtual performances that reinforce reading, math and science skills, bring historical events to life and immerse students in the art forms and traditions of different cultures. All SEAS presentations are directly aligned with Florida state standards and classroom curriculum, with an emphasis on literacy.

BROWN'S COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CENTER, INC.: 7th Annual Collier City Family Fun Day: \$3,000 for an event that brings families and community partners together. This event consist of free food distribution, back pack give-a-ways, health and wellness screenings, job and career fair, numerous exhibitors. Free haircuts , games and activities for the children. Also live entertainment in which consist of cultural music for all ethnic groups to enjoy and learn each other cultures.

COVENANT HOUSE FLORIDA, INC.: Youth Employment Services (YES) Program for Pompano Beach Youth Under 21 Experiencing Homelessness: \$7,500 to help disadvantaged and at-risk youth from Pompano Beach transition into full-time work. YES helps young adults ages 16-21 develop skills by engaging them over time with robust learning experiences. The program incorporates career path assessments, job

readiness training, clinical groups and life skills, as well as connection with employer/partner work-based learning experiences to increase the opportunity for youth to gain the skills, experience, and confidence needed to secure employment that pays a living wage.

CROCKETT FOUNDATION INC.: PEACE: \$10,000 to engage 50 at-risk students in building academic, social/emotional, and life skills through robust after-school and summer programming. Youth follow individualized learning plans, supported by success coaches and mentors, and incentivized for goal progress.

EARLY LEARNING COALITION OF BROWARD COUNTY, INC.: School Readiness: \$21,500 to help parents and guardians who are working and/or attending school access affordable child care at a quality, licensed facility of their choice. The program serves the vulnerable ALICE population (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) who live paycheck to paycheck and were economically impacted by COVID-19.

FAMILY CENTRAL, INC.: The Training Academy at FCI: \$7,500 to provide a variety of annual training hours, Continuing Education Units (CEUs) and credentialing programs that support Early Childhood Education (ECE) by preparing child care professionals in all types of early care and education settings, as well as directors and owners of child care centers.

FIRST CALL FOR HELP OF BROWARD, INC.: General Helpline: \$20,500 to connect residents in need with services that can help them. First Call for Help of Broward, Inc. dba 2-1-1 provides free and anonymous, round the clock access to crisis intervention, suicide prevention, and general requests for support.

FORT LAUDERDALE INDEPENDENCE TRAINING & EDUCATION CENTER, INC.: Supporting One United Resource Center (SOURC): \$9,000 to serve at least 50 of our youth who are from/reside in Pompano. FLITE Center will specifically target this portion of the population that we serve in order to help them attain and retain employment, housing or continue their education. FLITE Center will recruit youth from Pompano to our GED program or link them to post secondary education.

FRIENDS OF THE NORTHWEST BRANCH OF POMPANO BEACH, INC: Blues and Sweet Potato Festival: \$2,000 for a cultural awareness event that celebrates Juneteenth as a reminder of the end of slavery in the United States that features lots of exciting, yet educational attractions.

FRIENDS OF THE NORTHWEST BRANCH OF POMPANO BEACH, INC: Community Back To School Fun Day: \$1,000 for a fun filled day for large number of children/students within the NW, SW and some NE sections of Pompano Beach. This event includes handing out approximately 1300 to 1500 backpacks filled with essential school supplies, fun games activities, exhibitors, free food and drink items, health screenings, educational mentors, financials and self help resources, tennis shoes, hair cuts, food donations and music.

HELPING ABUSED, NEGLECTED, DISADVANTAGED YOUTH, INC.: HANDY LIFE Program at Pompano Beach Middle School: \$7,000 to provide year-round services (after-school and during summer) to at-risk middle school students from Pompano Beach Middle School. The purpose of this program is to strengthen protective factors by helping youth develop resiliency, a positive outlook, healthy family dynamics, pro-social relationships with peers and adults, positive decision making, strong community attachment, and academic success. This program reduces risk factors associated with pregnancy, delinquency, substance abuse, family dysfunction, mental and physical health problems, negative peer associations, and school failure.

HILLSBORO LIGHTHOUSE PRESERVATION SOCIETY, INC.: Hillsboro Lighthouse: \$2,500 to support free monthly historical tours of the 110-year-old Hillsboro Inlet Lighthouse and the continued operation, maintenance, and preservation of a local, historic monument.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC.: JA Biztown / JA Finance Park: \$15,000 for a fully interactive, true-to-life, simulated town experience, following up to 16 hours of in-class curriculum, where students work and live as citizens and employees of JA BizTown, while utilizing their newly learned soft skills necessary for successful participation in the world of work. Students run the various eighteen businesses, earn paychecks, open/manage bank accounts, take out and repay business loans, vote, price and advertise goods and services for sale, and more. JA Finance Park starts with up to 16 hours of in-class curriculum and culminates in a one-day experience during which students explore careers and figure out how much to spend on housing, insurance, transportation, etc. to create/balance a 21-line item budget. This is all done based on an assigned life-scenario that includes family size, marital status, credit score, education and salary. By taking on adult roles, kids become better prepared for their future as consumers, investors & workers.

JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF SOUTH FLORIDA, INC: JA Inspire: \$7,500 to introduce students to high growth/high wage career fields following 3 hours of career readiness curriculum. Students engage with JA Inspire volunteers at the career fair to create connections that allow them to build an understanding of the cross-section of high demand jobs available to them in the future, from mid-skilled trades to highly technical STEM related careers.

LEARNING FOR SUCCESS, INCORPORATED: Kids and the Power of Work (KAPOW): \$15,000 for a unique collaboration between the school district, area businesses, community organizations, and schools. This is accomplished through a powerful set of in-school lessons taught by business volunteers with teachers from local elementary-high schools, field trips to partner work sites, and integrated curriculum activities for teachers to incorporate the real-life application of the skills they teach on a daily basis.

LEARNING FOR SUCCESS, INCORPORATED: My Future is Now (MFIN): \$10,000 to change the way students experience school by organizing the curriculum, instruction, and guidance services around their strengths, skills, talents, interests, plans and dreams. When this transformation occurs, academic achievement, engagement and motivation increase; student aspirations rise; and many of the difficulties

found in our schools are eliminated. Students who have never linked school to a successful future are motivated to do so.

MEN2BOYS, INC.: M2B Job Readiness, Job Preparedness Program: \$5,000 to use weekly mentoring groups with a focus to promote the achievement of the program milestones. In addition to career-specific exposure, and information, beneficiaries will be taught how the Job Hiring process works. We will train them in the process of looking for a job, filling out company applications, resumé creation, interviewing techniques, and personal appearance. We continue our training post-hire to ensure the youth can grow with the position and continue to show responsible maturity. Our additional lessons include responsibility and money management to make their experience in the workforce as positive as possible and assist them in understanding the importance of managing their income for the best use in their present and future financial situation. M2B provides each young man a real opportunity, through this training, to plan a sustainable future for himself, his family, and his community.

OUR FATHER'S HOUSE SOUP KITCHEN, INC.: Bike Academy: \$5,000 to receive discarded bicycles and repair them to make them useful to those who need it for basic transportation needs. Recipients must "earn" the bicycle by either helping in the direct repair or in other parts of the ministry depending on the need. This may mean basic maintenance or using one of their special skills or trade.

THE RUSSELL LIFE SKILLS AND READING FOUNDATION, INC.: Russell Reading Room: \$10,000 to serve a minimum of 65 elementary school students from low-income families in Pompano Beach who have been identified as at-risk in literacy skills due to various factors, such as learning, economic or language-based difficulties.

UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY OF POMPANO BEACH, INC.: UNITY IN THE COMMUNITY FAMILY FUN DAY: \$6,000 for a free of charge to residents, businesses, organizations or anyone from all walks of life want attend. There are three components: Exhibitor Area, featuring over 140 booths; Main Stage featuring multi-cultural entertainment and a KidZone with activities for children. At the event, we conduct a live auction and raffle drawings to raise funds for academic scholarships. Food and soft drinks are available at no charge from local and countywide restaurants.

WOODHOUSE INC.: "Pompano Beach is ABLE Healthcare Independence Workshop": \$5,000 to host informational sessions (booths) related to keeping seniors and persons with disabilities and their caregivers independent as long as possible and encourage them to remain in their homes. This will be accomplished by connecting them to local services and business to help them with that goal.

Total for all programs included in this resolution: \$281,500
